New Website - After many hours of work and coordination, your city staff launched the new website design in October. We have received many compliments on the site! As with any new product, I'm sure we (and you) will find ways that it can be improved. I encourage you to visit the website and provide feedback.

Windcrest Elections - Last day of Early Voting is Friday, November 4th. Polls are open from 8am to 8pm on November 4th. Closest voting location is Takas Park, but you may vote in ANY poll location designated by Bexar County Elections. Election Day is Tuesday, November 8th. Polls are open 7 am to 7 pm that day. For those who put their hat in the ring, thank you for going through what can be a difficult and long process. For those who vote, thank you for participating in the process allowing us to select our elected officials. As I noted in my last newsletter, Windcrest will now have two separate Congressional Representatives, one from District 21 and the other in District 38. You are also voting on several amendments to our City Charter. These proposed amendments came from the Charter Commission comprised of Windcrest Citizens. Your City Council made the final decision on the proposed amendments.

Light Up is coming! Let's get ready for Light Up! This is clearly the signature

event for our great city! It may be November, but this celebration starts now and continues through December.

Bike Night - Bike Only Area Windcre

I hope you will all consider lighting your home for the event. Our Light-Up Theme this year is "Fiesta De Navidad". Deadline to register your home is November 23rd, you can get the registration information on our website under "Windcrest Events" on the "Community" tab. Judging will happen on November 29th, so get ready early!

GET OUT AND VOTE!

A general and special election will be held in the City of Windcrest on Tuesday, November 8, 2022.

The general election is concerning the election of a City Councilmember, Place 2 in accordance with Ordinance **2022-014(O)**. Filed candidates for City Councilmember, Place 1 and City Councilmember, Place 3 are running unopposed.

A special election will be held concerning proposed amendments to the City of Windcrest Charter in accordance with Ordinance 2022-015(O). There are a total of twelve (12) amendments for consideration. Outlined below is the list of the twelve (12) proposed amendments, including the proposition designation, ballot language, and a short summary on the proposed change. Everyone stopped in their tracks at the sound of bells clanging and smoke billowing from the steam fire engine, with it's mighty horses thundering down the street and trusty Dalmatian racing alongside. That's how it was back when our American Steam Fire Engine responded to fires. Built in 1902 by the AMERICAN Fire Engine Company in Cincinnati, Ohio, this horse-drawn steam fire engine needed three large horses to pull its weight of over 9500 lbs. The traditional horse of the fire service is the Percheron, a draft horse originating in France. Colorful, powerful, and reliable, these gentle giants were easy to train and became devoted friends of the firefighters with whom they shared the fire station. Serving the City of Reno as Engine #1 for over 20 years, this famous fire engine saved many lives while protecting the city. Known as the classic in American firefighting, this steamer is a true example of American engineering and industrial ability of the early 1900's, and was a great step forward in early firefighting! After its retirement in 1922, Reno #1 served the Southern Pacific Railroad for a short period on firefighting trains protecting the snowsheds along the California Sierras. Lost in time for over 60 years, the steamer was found by the Hubert Family in 1990.

Early 1990's

In an old barn in Fallbrook, CA, Dave and Barbara Hubert stared at the rusted, incomplete remains of this "wonder of yesteryear" and knew they had to seize the chance and attempt to restore the steamer, all the time hoping against hope that, somehow, the boiler would still function after ninety plus years. So Dave, a retired fire captain, set out on a mission. After six years of searching for the many missing parts, fabricating the rest, and painstaking, restoration, including sending the huge wheels back to the Amish craftsmen to rebuild, it was finally time to paint the chassis and finalize all the gold leafing.

Celebrating over 104 years of service, the horse drawn steam fire engine is finally fully restored to its original glory

A Message From Fire Marshal Zelenak



This month's safety tip I would like to talk about cooking safety with all the holidays upon us. Thanksgiving is the leading day of the year for home fires involving cooking equipment. The Kitchen is the heart of the home, especially at Thanksgiving and kids love to help and be involved in the holiday preparations. With all the activity going on in your home on Thanksgiving here was a few safety tips:

- Stay in the kitchen when you are cooking on the stovetop, so you can keep an eye on the food.
- Stay in the home when cooking your turkey and check on it frequently.
- Keep children away from the stove, the stove is hot, and kids should stay 3 feet away.
- Make sure children stay away from hot foods and liquids, the steam or splash from vegetables, gravy or coffee could cause serious burns.
- Be sure electric cords from an electric knife, coffee maker, plate warmer or mixer are not dangling off the counter within easy reach of a child.

If you are planning on frying your Thanksgiving Turkey, this year here are a few safety tips:

- Do not overfill the fryer.
- Fryers should always be used outdoors, on a solid level surface and a safe distance from buildings and flammable materials.
- Never use a fryer on a wooden deck.
- Keep an ABC fire extinguisher nearby.
- Make sure the turkey is completely thawed before it is placed in the fryer.

- 3. Submissions must include the recipe with ingredients and instructions that result in duplication of the submission. The person, restaurant, or caterer agrees to allow unlimited reproduction and distribution of the recipe for use in the 2022 Windcrest Light Up Cook-Off Cookbook. All proceeds from sales of the cookbook go to fund activities provided by Windcrest Parks and Recreation.
- 4. Submissions must include a minimum of **3 dozen** (36) for each category entered. For example, a person submitting for judging

- their tamales and cookies will provide a minimum of 36 tamales and 36 cookies.
- Competitors must be present at the time of the award announcements to receive their trophy(ies). A designated representative may receive the award on the winner's behalf.
- 6. If a sauce, frosting or icing is part of the submission, the recipe will be included in the submission. The category item will be served to the judges with the sauce, frosting or icing. There will be enough sauce, frosting or icing for a minimum of 3 dozen.
- 7. All **bragging rights** from the competition last for one year or until the time of the next competition, whichever happens first.
- 8. Judging begins at 4:30 PM on November 10, 2022 at the Windcrest Civic Center. Entries not arriving at the judging site by 4:30 PM are disqualified. All valid entries are entered into the cookbook.

For over 60 years Windcrest Residents have been decorating our homes with Christmas displays to the awe and wonder of residents and visitors from near and far. Sometimes over the years, residents have had lights that they no longer use in their displays. New residents may not have yet had the time to purchase lights to decorate their homes.

Ingredients:

2 packets chocolate chip cookies 3 c. heavy cream oz. block cream cheese, softened 2 tbsp. powdered sugar



Directions:

STEP 1 - In a large resealable bag, crush 15 chocolate chip cookies with a rolling pin. Transfer most of the crushed cookies to a large liquid measuring cup (save some for decorating at the end!) and add heavy cream. Let sit for 10 minutes.


STEP 2 - Pour heavy cream over strainer into a large bowl; discard crushed cookies.

STEP 3 - Add cream cheese to another large bowl, then, using a handheld electric mixer, beat cream cheese until fluffy, 1 minute. Add sugar and beat until smooth, then add cookie-infused cream and beat until soft peaks form.

STEP 4 - Spread a thin layer of whipped cream mixture on a cake plate. Arrange 8 cookies side by side in a circle, placing 3 cookies in the center. Spread a layer of whipped cream on top, and top with another layer of cookies (alternating so the cookies aren't placed directly on top). Repeat until you have six layers, ending with whipped cream.

STEP 5 - Top with crushed cookies, then wrap loosely with plastic wrap and transfer to the fridge until very soft, 6 hours.
