

AN ACT

relating to court-ordered representation in suits affecting the parent-child relationship.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Subchapters A, B, and C, Chapter 107, Family Code, are amended to read as follows:

SUBCHAPTER A. COURT-ORDERED [~~GUARDIAN AD LITEM~~] REPRESENTATION IN SUITS AFFECTING THE PARENT-CHILD RELATIONSHIP

Sec. 107.001. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter:

(1) "Amicus attorney" means an attorney appointed by the court in a suit, other than a suit filed by a governmental entity, whose role is to provide legal services necessary to assist the court in protecting a child's best interests rather than to provide legal services to the child.

(2) "Attorney ad litem" means an attorney who provides legal services to a person, including a child, and who owes to the person the duties of undivided loyalty, confidentiality, and competent representation.

(3) "Developmentally appropriate" means structured to account for a child's age, level of education, cultural background, and degree of language acquisition.

(4) "Dual role" means the role of an attorney who is appointed under Section 107.0125 to act as both guardian ad litem and attorney ad litem for a child in a suit filed by a governmental

1 entity.

2 (5) "Guardian ad litem" means a person appointed to
3 represent the best interests of a child. The term includes:

4 (A) a volunteer advocate appointed under
5 Subchapter C;

6 (B) a professional, other than an attorney, who
7 holds a relevant professional license and whose training relates to
8 the determination of a child's best interests;

9 (C) an adult having the competence, training, and
10 expertise determined by the court to be sufficient to represent the
11 best interests of the child; or

12 (D) an attorney ad litem appointed to serve in
13 the dual role. ~~[APPOINTMENT OF GUARDIAN AD LITEM. (a) In a suit in~~
14 ~~which termination of the parent-child relationship is requested,~~
15 ~~the court or an associate judge shall appoint a guardian ad litem to~~
16 ~~represent the interests of the child immediately after the filing~~
17 ~~of the petition but before the full adversary hearing to ensure~~
18 ~~adequate representation of the child, unless:~~

19 ~~[(1) the child is a petitioner,~~

20 ~~[(2) an attorney ad litem has been appointed for the~~
21 ~~child, or~~

22 ~~[(3) the court or an associate judge finds that the~~
23 ~~interests of the child will be represented adequately by a party to~~
24 ~~the suit and are not adverse to that party.~~

25 ~~[(b) In a suit filed by a governmental entity in which the~~
26 ~~entity requests the termination of the parent-child relationship or~~
27 ~~to be named conservator of a child, the court or an associate judge~~

1 ~~shall appoint a guardian ad litem to represent the best interests of~~
2 ~~the child immediately after the filing of the petition but before~~
3 ~~the full adversary hearing to ensure adequate representation of the~~
4 ~~child.~~

5 ~~[(c) In any other suit, the court or an associate judge may~~
6 ~~appoint a guardian ad litem.~~

7 ~~[(d) A guardian ad litem appointed under this section may be~~
8 ~~an attorney, a volunteer advocate appointed under Section 107.031,~~
9 ~~or another adult having the competence, training, and expertise~~
10 ~~determined by the court to be sufficient to represent the best~~
11 ~~interests of the child.~~

12 ~~[(e) The managing conservator may be appointed guardian ad~~
13 ~~litem if the managing conservator:~~

14 ~~[(1) is not a parent of the child or a person~~
15 ~~petitioning for adoption of the child, and~~

16 ~~[(2) has no personal interest in the suit.~~

17 ~~[(f) A guardian ad litem shall be appointed to represent any~~
18 ~~other person entitled to service of citation under this code if the~~
19 ~~person is incompetent or a child, unless the person has executed an~~
20 ~~affidavit of relinquishment of parental rights or an affidavit of~~
21 ~~waiver of interest in child containing a waiver of service of~~
22 ~~citation.]~~

23 Sec. 107.002. POWERS AND DUTIES OF GUARDIAN AD LITEM FOR
24 CHILD. (a) A guardian ad litem appointed for a child under this
25 chapter [~~subchapter~~] is not a party to the suit but may:

26 (1) conduct an investigation to the extent that the
27 guardian ad litem considers necessary to determine the best

1 interests [~~interest~~] of the child [~~for whom the guardian is~~
2 ~~appointed~~]; and

3 (2) obtain and review copies of the child's relevant
4 medical, psychological, and school records as provided by Section
5 107.006.

6 (b) A guardian ad litem appointed for the child under this
7 chapter [~~subchapter~~] shall:

8 (1) [~~7~~] within a reasonable time after the
9 appointment, interview:

10 (A) [~~1~~] the child in a developmentally
11 appropriate manner, if the child is four years of age or older;
12 [~~and~~]

13 (B) [~~2~~] each person who has [~~individual that~~
14 ~~the guardian ad litem considers likely to have~~] significant
15 knowledge of the child's history and condition, including any
16 foster parent of the child; and

17 (C) the parties to the suit;

18 (2) seek to elicit in a developmentally appropriate
19 manner the child's expressed objectives of representation;

20 (3) consider the child's expressed objectives of
21 representation without being bound by those objectives;

22 (4) encourage settlement and the use of alternative
23 forms of dispute resolution; and

24 (5) perform any specific task directed by the court.

25 (c) A guardian ad litem appointed for the child under this
26 chapter [~~subchapter~~] is not a party to the suit but is entitled to:

27 (1) receive a copy of each pleading or other paper

1 filed with the court in the case in which the guardian ad litem is
2 appointed;

3 (2) receive notice of each hearing in the case;

4 (3) participate in case staffings by an authorized
5 agency concerning the child;

6 (4) attend all legal proceedings in the case but may
7 not call or question a witness or otherwise provide legal services
8 unless the guardian ad litem is a licensed attorney who has been
9 appointed in the dual role;

10 (5) review and sign, or decline to sign, an [any]
11 agreed order affecting the child; and

12 (6) explain the basis [~~testify in court, except as~~
13 ~~provided by Subsection (d), regarding the recommendations~~
14 ~~concerning the actions that the guardian ad litem considers to be in~~
15 ~~the best interest of the child, including giving reasons]~~ for the
16 guardian ad litem's opposition to the agreed order if the guardian
17 ad litem does not agree to the terms of a proposed order.

18 (d) The court may compel the guardian ad litem to attend a
19 trial or hearing and to testify as necessary for the proper
20 disposition of the suit. [~~An attorney who is appointed as attorney~~
21 ~~ad litem and guardian ad litem for a child may not testify under~~
22 ~~Subsection (c)(6).]~~

23 (e) Unless the guardian ad litem is an attorney who has been
24 appointed in the dual role and subject to the Texas Rules of
25 Evidence, the court shall ensure in a hearing or in a trial on the
26 merits that a guardian ad litem has an opportunity to testify or
27 submit a report regarding the guardian ad litem's recommendations

1 regarding:

2 (1) the best interests of the child; and

3 (2) the bases for the guardian ad litem's
4 recommendations. [~~An attorney who is appointed as attorney ad litem~~
5 and guardian ad litem for a child shall,

6 ~~[(1) become familiar with the American Bar~~
7 ~~Association's standards of practice for lawyers who represent~~
8 ~~children in abuse and neglect cases, and~~

9 ~~[(2) comply with the requirements of the Texas~~
10 ~~Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct.]~~

11 (f) In a nonjury trial, a party may call the guardian ad
12 litem as a witness for the purpose of cross-examination regarding
13 the guardian's report without the guardian ad litem being listed as
14 a witness by a party. If the guardian ad litem is not called as a
15 witness, the court shall permit the guardian ad litem to testify in
16 the narrative [~~An attorney who is appointed as attorney ad litem and~~
17 ~~guardian ad litem for a child and who determines that a conflict~~
18 ~~exists by performing both roles shall,~~

19 ~~[(1) withdraw as the child's guardian ad litem,~~

20 ~~[(2) continue to serve as the child's attorney ad~~
21 ~~litem, and~~

22 ~~[(3) request appointment of a new guardian ad litem~~
23 ~~for the child without revealing the reason a new appointment is~~
24 ~~required].~~

25 (g) In a contested case, the guardian ad litem shall provide
26 copies of the guardian ad litem's report, if any, to the attorneys
27 for the parties as directed by the court, but not later than the

1 earlier of:

2 (1) the date required by the scheduling order; or

3 (2) the 10th day before the date of the commencement of
4 the trial.

5 (h) Disclosure to the jury of the contents of a guardian ad
6 litem's report to the court is subject to the Texas Rules of
7 Evidence.

8 Sec. 107.003. POWERS AND DUTIES OF ATTORNEY AD LITEM FOR
9 CHILD AND AMICUS ATTORNEY. An attorney ad litem appointed to
10 represent a child or an amicus attorney appointed to assist the
11 court:

12 (1) shall:

13 (A) subject to Rule 4.04, Texas Disciplinary
14 Rules of Professional Conduct, and within a reasonable time after
15 the appointment, interview:

16 (i) the child in a developmentally
17 appropriate manner, if the child is four years of age or older;

18 (ii) each person who has significant
19 knowledge of the child's history and condition, including any
20 foster parent of the child; and

21 (iii) the parties to the suit;

22 (B) investigate the facts of the case to the
23 extent the attorney considers appropriate;

24 (C) obtain and review copies of relevant records
25 relating to the child as provided by Section 107.006;

26 (D) participate in the conduct of the litigation
27 to the same extent as an attorney for a party;

1 (E) take any action consistent with the child's
2 interests that the attorney considers necessary to expedite the
3 proceedings; and

4 (F) encourage settlement and the use of
5 alternative forms of dispute resolution;

6 (2) must be trained in child advocacy or have
7 experience determined by the court to be equivalent to that
8 training; and

9 (3) is entitled to:

10 (A) receive a copy of each pleading or other
11 paper filed with the court;

12 (B) receive notice of each hearing in the suit;

13 (C) participate in any case staffing concerning
14 the child conducted by an authorized agency; and

15 (D) attend all legal proceedings in the suit

16 ~~[IMMUNITY. (a) A guardian ad litem appointed under this~~
17 ~~subchapter is not liable for civil damages arising from a~~
18 ~~recommendation made or an opinion given in the capacity of guardian~~
19 ~~ad litem.~~

20 ~~[(b) Subsection (a) does not apply to a recommendation or~~
21 ~~opinion that is:~~

22 ~~[(1) wilfully wrongful,~~

23 ~~[(2) given with conscious indifference or reckless~~
24 ~~disregard to the safety of another,~~

25 ~~[(3) given in bad faith or with malice, or~~

26 ~~[(4) grossly negligent].~~

27 Sec. 107.004. ADDITIONAL DUTIES OF ATTORNEY AD LITEM FOR

1 CHILD. Except as otherwise provided by this chapter, the attorney
2 ad litem appointed for a child shall:

3 (1) seek to elicit in a developmentally appropriate
4 manner the child's expressed objectives of representation;

5 (2) advise the child;

6 (3) provide guidance to the child;

7 (4) represent the child's expressed objectives of
8 representation and follow the child's expressed objectives of
9 representation during the course of litigation if the attorney ad
10 litem determines that the child is competent to understand the
11 nature of an attorney-client relationship and has formed that
12 relationship with the attorney ad litem;

13 (5) consider the impact on the child in formulating
14 the attorney ad litem's presentation of the child's expressed
15 objectives of representation to the court; and

16 (6) become familiar with:

17 (A) the American Bar Association's standards of
18 practice for attorneys who represent children in abuse and neglect
19 cases; and

20 (B) the suggested amendments to those standards
21 adopted by the National Association of Counsel for Children.

22 Sec. 107.005. ADDITIONAL DUTIES OF AMICUS ATTORNEY. (a)
23 Subject to any specific limitation in the order of appointment, an
24 amicus attorney shall advocate the best interests of the child
25 after reviewing the facts and circumstances of the case.
26 Notwithstanding Subsection (b), in determining the best interests
27 of the child, an amicus attorney is not bound by the child's

1 expressed objectives of representation.

2 (b) An amicus attorney shall:

3 (1) seek to elicit in a developmentally appropriate
4 manner the child's expressed objectives of representation;

5 (2) with the consent of the child, ensure that the
6 child's expressed objectives of representation are made known to
7 the court;

8 (3) consider the impact on the child in formulating
9 the amicus attorney's presentation of the child's expressed
10 objectives of representation to the court;

11 (4) review and sign, or decline to sign, an agreed
12 order affecting the child;

13 (5) explain the basis for the amicus attorney's
14 opposition to the agreed order if the amicus attorney does not agree
15 to the terms of a proposed order;

16 (6) explain the role of the amicus attorney to the
17 child; and

18 (7) inform the child that the amicus attorney may use
19 information that the child provides in providing assistance to the
20 court.

21 (c) An amicus attorney may not disclose confidential
22 communications between the amicus attorney and the child unless the
23 amicus attorney determines that disclosure is necessary to assist
24 the court regarding the best interests of the child.

25 Sec. 107.006. ACCESS TO CHILD AND INFORMATION RELATING TO
26 CHILD. (a) Except as provided by Subsection (c), in conjunction
27 with an appointment under this chapter, other than an appointment

1 of an attorney ad litem for an adult or a parent, the court shall
2 issue an order authorizing the attorney ad litem, guardian ad litem
3 for the child, or amicus attorney to have immediate access to:

4 (1) the child; and

5 (2) any otherwise privileged or confidential
6 information relating to the child.

7 (b) Without requiring a further order or release, the
8 custodian of any relevant records relating to the child, including
9 records regarding social services, drug and alcohol treatment, or
10 medical or mental health evaluation or treatment of the child, law
11 enforcement records, school records, records of a probate or court
12 proceeding, and records of a trust or account for which the child is
13 a beneficiary, shall provide access to a person authorized to
14 access the records under Subsection (a).

15 (c) A mental health record of a child at least 12 years of
16 age that is privileged or confidential under other law may be
17 released to a person appointed under Subsection (a) only in
18 accordance with the other law [~~GUARDIAN AD LITEM AND ATTORNEY AD~~
19 ~~LITEM POOL, QUALIFICATIONS. (a) The local administrative district~~
20 ~~judge in each county in a Department of Protective and Regulatory~~
21 ~~Services region for child protective services that contains a~~
22 ~~county having a population of 2.8 million or more shall establish a~~
23 ~~pool from which guardians ad litem and attorneys ad litem are~~
24 ~~appointed for proceedings in the district courts of the county. A~~
25 ~~local administrative district judge in any other county may~~
26 ~~establish a pool from which guardians ad litem and attorneys ad~~
27 ~~litem are appointed for proceedings in the district courts of that~~

1 ~~county. To be eligible for a pool established under this~~
2 ~~subsection, a person must:~~

3 ~~[(1) complete training approved by the State Bar of~~
4 ~~Texas in family law and the responsibilities of ad litem,~~

5 ~~[(2) complete as part of the person's annual~~
6 ~~continuing legal education requirement not fewer than three hours~~

10 ~~[(b) Before appointment as a guardian ad litem or an~~
11 ~~attorney ad litem, the person must have read, acknowledged by~~
12 ~~signing, and filed with the local administrative judge a written~~
13 ~~statement prepared by the local administrative district judge that~~
14 ~~lists the responsibilities of an ad litem, some or all of which may~~
15 ~~be appropriate to the person's specific case. The court shall~~
16 ~~retain a copy of the acknowledgment for two years. To continue to~~
17 ~~receive appointments under this section, the person must execute a~~
18 ~~new statement at least every two years.~~

19 ~~[(c) A party to a proceeding in which a person is appointed~~
20 ~~as a guardian ad litem or an attorney ad litem may object to~~
21 ~~appointment of the person at any time before the date of the trial~~
22 ~~of the proceeding. A party may object under this subsection by~~
23 ~~filing a written motion stating the grounds and facts on which the~~
24 ~~party believes that the person appointed lacks objectivity or is~~
25 ~~failing to fulfill the person's responsibilities as an ad litem as~~
26 ~~outlined in the written statement of ad litem responsibilities.~~
27 ~~The court shall promptly rule on an objection raised under this~~

1 ~~subsection and shall order the removal of the guardian ad litem or~~
2 ~~attorney ad litem if the court finds that the objection is~~

4 ~~[(d) A person appointed as a guardian ad litem or attorney~~
5 ~~ad litem shall complete and submit to the court a voucher or claim~~
6 ~~for payment that includes the fees charged and hours worked by the~~

8 ~~disclosure under Chapter 552, Government Code.~~

9 ~~[(e) The Bureau of Vital Statistics may compile information~~
10 ~~submitted under Subsection (d) for a county that maintains that~~
11 ~~information on an electronic database. On the request of the~~
12 ~~bureau, the county shall provide the information. Information~~
13 ~~compiled by the bureau under this section shall be made available to~~
14 ~~the Department of Protective and Regulatory Services].~~

15 Sec. 107.007. ATTORNEY WORK PRODUCT AND TESTIMONY. (a) An
16 attorney ad litem, an attorney serving in the dual role, or an
17 amicus attorney may not:

18 (1) be compelled to produce attorney work product
19 developed during the appointment as an attorney;

20 (2) be required to disclose the source of any
21 information;

22 (3) submit a report into evidence; or

23 (4) testify in court except as authorized by Rule
24 3.08, Texas Disciplinary Rules of Professional Conduct.

25 (b) Subsection (a) does not apply to the duty of an attorney
26 to report child abuse or neglect under Section 261.101.

27 Sec. 107.008. SUBSTITUTED JUDGMENT OF ATTORNEY FOR CHILD.

1 (a) An attorney ad litem appointed to represent a child or an
2 attorney appointed in the dual role may determine that the child
3 cannot meaningfully formulate the child's objectives of
4 representation in a case because the child:

5 (1) lacks sufficient maturity to understand and form
6 an attorney-client relationship with the attorney;

7 (2) despite appropriate legal counseling, continues
8 to express objectives of representation that would be seriously
9 injurious to the child; or

10 (3) for any other reason is incapable of making
11 reasonable judgments and engaging in meaningful communication.

12 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (c), an attorney ad
13 litem or an attorney appointed in the dual role who determines that
14 the child cannot meaningfully formulate the child's expressed
15 objectives of representation under Subsection (a) may present to
16 the court a position that the attorney determines will serve the
17 best interests of the child.

18 (c) An attorney ad litem or attorney appointed in the dual
19 role who determines that the child cannot meaningfully formulate
20 the child's expressed objectives of representation under
21 Subsection (a) shall, if a guardian ad litem has been appointed for
22 the child:

23 (1) consult with the guardian ad litem; and

24 (2) present the child's objectives of representation
25 to the court based on the guardian ad litem's opinion regarding the
26 best interests of the child.

27 Sec. 107.009. IMMUNITY. (a) A guardian ad litem, an

1 attorney ad litem, or an amicus attorney appointed under this
 2 chapter is not liable for civil damages arising from a
 3 recommendation made or an opinion given in the capacity of guardian
 4 ad litem, attorney ad litem, or amicus attorney.

5 (b) Subsection (a) does not apply to an action taken or a
 6 recommendation or opinion given:

7 (1) with conscious indifference or reckless disregard
 8 to the safety of another;

9 (2) in bad faith or with malice; or

10 (3) that is grossly negligent or wilfully wrongful.

11 Sec. 107.010. DISCRETIONARY APPOINTMENT OF ATTORNEY AD
 12 LITEM FOR INCAPACITATED PERSON. The court may appoint an attorney
 13 to serve as an attorney ad litem for a person entitled to service of
 14 citation in a suit if the court finds that the person is
 15 incapacitated. The attorney ad litem shall follow the person's
 16 expressed objectives of representation and, if appropriate, refer
 17 the proceeding to the proper court for guardianship proceedings.

18 SUBCHAPTER B. APPOINTMENTS IN CERTAIN SUITS [~~ATTORNEY AD LITEM~~]

19 PART 1. APPOINTMENTS IN SUITS BY GOVERNMENTAL ENTITY

20 Sec. 107.011. MANDATORY [~~DISCRETIONARY~~] APPOINTMENT OF
 21 GUARDIAN [~~ATTORNEY~~] AD LITEM. (a) Except as otherwise provided by
 22 this subchapter, in a suit filed by a governmental entity seeking
 23 termination of the parent-child relationship or the appointment of
 24 a conservator for a child, the court shall appoint a guardian ad
 25 litem to represent the best interests of the child immediately
 26 after the filing of the petition but before the full adversary
 27 hearing. [~~An associate judge shall recommend the appointment of an~~

~~attorney ad litem for any party in a case in which the associate judge deems representation necessary to protect the interests of the child who is the subject matter of the suit.]~~

(b) The guardian ad litem appointed for a child under this section may be:

(1) a charitable organization composed of volunteer advocates or an individual volunteer advocate appointed under Subchapter C;

(2) an adult having the competence, training, and expertise determined by the court to be sufficient to represent the best interests of the child; or

(3) an attorney appointed in the dual role ~~[court shall appoint an attorney ad litem for any party in a case in which the court deems representation necessary to protect the interests of the child who is the subject matter of the suit].~~

(c) The court may not appoint a guardian ad litem in a suit filed by a governmental entity if an attorney is appointed in the dual role unless the court appoints another person to serve as guardian ad litem for the child and restricts the role of the attorney to acting as an attorney ad litem for the child.

(d) The court may appoint an attorney to serve as guardian ad litem for a child without appointing the attorney to serve in the dual role only if the attorney is specifically appointed to serve only in the role of guardian ad litem. An attorney appointed solely as a guardian ad litem:

(1) may take only those actions that may be taken by a nonattorney guardian ad litem; and

1 (2) may not:

2 (A) perform legal services in the case; or

3 (B) take any action that is restricted to a
4 licensed attorney, including engaging in discovery other than as a
5 witness, making opening and closing statements, or examining
6 witnesses.

7 Sec. 107.012. MANDATORY APPOINTMENT OF ATTORNEY AD LITEM
8 FOR CHILD. In a suit filed by a governmental entity requesting
9 termination of the parent-child relationship or to be named
10 conservator of a child, the court shall appoint an attorney ad litem
11 to represent the interests of the child immediately after the
12 filing, but before the full adversary hearing, to ensure adequate
13 representation of the child.

14 Sec. 107.0125. APPOINTMENT OF ATTORNEY IN DUAL ROLE. (a)
15 In order to comply with the mandatory appointment of a guardian ad
16 litem under Section 107.011 and the mandatory appointment of an
17 attorney ad litem under Section 107.012, the court may appoint an
18 attorney to serve in the dual role.

19 (b) If the court appoints an attorney to serve in the dual
20 role under this section, the court may at any time during the
21 pendency of the suit appoint another person to serve as guardian ad
22 litem for the child and restrict the attorney to acting as an
23 attorney ad litem for the child.

24 (c) An attorney appointed to serve in the dual role may
25 request the court to appoint another person to serve as guardian ad
26 litem for the child. If the court grants the attorney's request,
27 the attorney shall serve only as the attorney ad litem for the

1 child.

2 (d) Unless the court appoints another person as guardian ad
3 litem in a suit filed by a governmental entity, an appointment of an
4 attorney to serve as an attorney ad litem in a suit filed by a
5 governmental entity is an appointment to serve in the dual role
6 regardless of the terminology used in the appointing order.

7 Sec. 107.013. MANDATORY APPOINTMENT OF ATTORNEY AD LITEM
8 FOR PARENT. (a) In a suit filed by a governmental entity in which
9 termination of the parent-child relationship is requested, the
10 court shall appoint an attorney ad litem to represent the interests
11 of:

12 (1) an indigent parent of the child who responds in
13 opposition to the termination;

14 (2) a parent served by citation by publication;

15 (3) an alleged father who failed to register with the
16 registry under Chapter 160 and whose identity or location is
17 unknown; and

18 (4) an alleged father who registered with the
19 paternity registry under Chapter 160, but the petitioner's attempt
20 to personally serve citation at the address provided to the
21 registry and at any other address for the alleged father known by
22 the petitioner has been unsuccessful.

23 (b) If both parents of the child are entitled to the
24 appointment of an attorney ad litem under this section and the court
25 finds that the interests of the parents are not in conflict, the
26 court may appoint an [~~a single~~] attorney ad litem to represent the
27 interests of both parents.

1 ~~[Sec. 107.0135. APPOINTMENT OF ATTORNEY AD LITEM NOT~~
2 ~~REQUIRED, CERTAIN CASES. A court is not required to appoint an~~
3 ~~attorney ad litem in a proceeding in which,~~

4 ~~[(1) a suit for the dissolution of a marriage is~~
5 ~~uncontested, or~~

6 ~~[(2) the issues of possession of and access to a child~~
