- 2 relating to the eligibility of armed forces personnel and their
- 3 family members to pay tuition and fees at the rate provided to Texas
- 4 residents.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 54.058, Education Code, is amended by
- 7 amending Subsections (c), (f), and (g) and adding Subsection (j) to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 (c) The [As long as they reside continuously in Texas, the]
- 10 spouse or child [and shildren] of a member of the Armed Forces of
- 11 the United States who has been assigned to duty elsewhere
- immediately following assignment to duty in Texas is [are] entitled
- 13 to pay the tuition fees and other fees or charges provided for Texas
- 14 residents as long as the spouse or child resides continuously in
- 15 Texas.
- (f) The spouse or child [and children] of a member of the
- 17 Armed Forces of the United States who dies or is killed is [are]
- 18 entitled to pay the resident tuition fee if the spouse or child
- 19 becomes a resident [wife and children become residents] of Texas
- 20 within 60 days of the date of death.
- 21 (g) If a member of the Armed Forces of the United States is
- 22 stationed outside Texas and the member's [his] spouse or child
- 23 <u>establishes</u> [and children establish] residence in Texas by residing
- 24 in Texas and by filing with the Texas institution of higher

- 1 education at which the spouse or child plans [they plan] to register
- 2 a letter of intent to establish residence in Texas, the institution
- of higher education shall permit the spouse or child [and children]
- 4 to pay the tuition, fees, and other charges provided for Texas
- 5 residents without regard to length of time that the spouse or child
- 6 <u>has</u> [they have] resided in Texas [the state].
- 7 (j) A member of the Armed Forces of the United States or the
- 8 <u>child or spouse of a member of the Armed Forces of the United States</u>
- 9 who is entitled to pay tuition and fees at the rate provided for
- 10 Texas residents under another provision of this section while
- 11 enrolled in a degree or certificate program is entitled to pay
- 12 tuition and fees at the rate provided for Texas residents in any
- 13 subsequent term or semester while the person is continuously
- 14 enrolled in the same degree or certificate program. For purposes of
- this subsection, a person is not required to enroll in a summer term
- to remain continuously enrolled in a degree or certificate program.
- 17 The person's eligibility to pay tuition and fees at the rate
- 18 provided for Texas residents under this subsection does not
- 19 terminate because the person is no longer a member of the Armed
- 20 Forces of the United States or the child or spouse of a member of the
- 21 Armed Forces of the United States.
- SECTION 2. (a) Section 54.058(j), as added by this Act,
- 23 applies beginning with the 2003 fall semester to a person who was a
- 24 member of the Armed Forces of the United States or the child or
- 25 spouse of a member of the Armed Forces of the United States entitled
- 26 to pay tuition and fees at the rate provided for Texas residents
- 27 under Section 54.058, Education Code, while enrolled in a degree or

- 1 certificate program at a public institution of higher education in
- 2 this state in the 2003 spring semester or in any term of the 2003
- 3 summer session.
- 4 (b) The changes in law made by this Act to Subsections (c),
- 5 (f), and (g), Section 54.058, Education Code, apply beginning with
- 6 tuition charged for the 2003 fall semester.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 8 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 9 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 10 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 11 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
