- 5 SECTION 1. Section 118.002, Natural Resources Code, is
- 6 amended to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 118.002. PIPELINES FOR WHICH PLAN MAY BE REQUIRED. (a)
- 8 Except as provided by Subsection (b), the [The] rules adopted under
- 9 this chapter may apply to interstate pipelines, intrastate
- 10 pipelines, portions of pipeline systems the regulation of which the
- 11 federal government has temporarily delegated to the Railroad
- 12 Commission of Texas, or gathering lines, and to pipelines for the
- 13 transportation of any substance or material under the jurisdiction
- of the commission, as specified by the commission.
- 15 (b) Exempted from the application of this chapter are
- 16 gathering lines outside:
- 17 (1) the limits of an incorporated or unincorporated
- 18 city or village;
- 19 (2) any designated residential or commercial area such
- 20 as residential subdivisions, businesses, shopping centers, or
- 21 community development.
- 22 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 23 a vote of two-thirds of all members elected to each house, as
- 24 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

- 1 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 2 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
