20	after the date on which the actor received notice demanding

22	(4) the actor failed to return the property held under

24	(A) within five days after receiving notice

- demanding return, if the property is valued at less than \$1,500; or
- 2 (B) within three days after receiving notice
- demanding return, if the property is valued at \$1,500 or more.
- 4 (c) For purposes of Subsections (a)(4), [and](b)(2), and
- (b)(4), notice shall be notice in writing, sent by registered or
- 6 certified mail with return receipt requested or by telegram with
- 7 report of delivery requested, and addressed to the actor at his
- 8 address shown on the rental agreement or service agreement.
- 9 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
- 10 SECTION 3. (a) The change in law made by this Act applies
- only to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this
