6	by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (d) to read as

8	(b) A peace officer shall require the taking of a specimen
9	of the person's breath or blood if:
10	(1) the officer arrests the person for an offense
11	under Chapter 49, Penal Code, involving the operation of a motor
12	vehicle or a watercraft;
13	(2) the person was the operator of a motor vehicle or a
14	watercraft involved in an accident that the officer reasonably
15	believes occurred as a result of the offense;
16	(3) at the time of the arrest the officer reasonably
17	believes that [a person has died or will die] as a direct result of
18	the accident:
19	(A) any individual has died or will die; or
20	(B) an individual other than the person has
21	suffered serious bodily injury; and
22	(4) the person refuses the officer's request to submit

(d) In this section, "serious bodily injury" has the meaning

to the taking of a specimen voluntarily.

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- SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
  to the taking of a specimen of a person's breath or blood under
  Section 724.012, Transportation Code, as amended by this Act, on or
  after the effective date of this Act. The taking of a specimen
  before the effective date of this Act is covered by the law in
  effect when the specimen was taken, and the former law is continued
  in effect for that purpose.
- 9 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
