- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 508.083(b) and (c), Government Code,
- 6 are amended to read as follows:
- 7 (b) A person serving as a member or employee of the board or
- 8 the Texas Board of Criminal Justice may not, before the second
- 9 [10th] anniversary of the date the person ceases to be a board
- 10 member or employee:
- 11 (1) represent any person in a matter before the board
- 12 or a parole panel; or
- 13 (2) receive compensation for services rendered on
- 14 behalf of any person regarding a matter pending before the board or
- 15 a parole panel.
- 16 (c) A person, other than a person subject to Subsection (b),
- who is employed by the department may not, before the second [10th]
- 18 anniversary of the date the person terminates service with the
- 19 department:
- 20 (1) represent an inmate in a matter before the board or
- 21 a parole panel; or
- 22 (2) receive compensation for services rendered on
- 23 behalf of any person regarding a matter pending before the board or
- 24 a parole panel.

- SECTION 2. Section 508.083(d), Government Code, is
- 2 repealed.
- 3 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 4 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 5 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 6 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 7 Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
