- 5 SECTION 1. Article 45.054, Code of Criminal Procedure, as
- 6 added by Chapter 1514, Acts of the 77th Legislature, Regular
- 7 Session, 2001, is amended by amending Subsection (b) and adding
- 8 Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
- 9 (a-1) On a finding by a juvenile court in a county with a
- 10 population of less than 100,000 that the individual has engaged in
- 11 conduct that violates Section 25.094, Education Code, the court has
- 12 jurisdiction to enter an order that includes one or more of the
- 13 provisions listed under Subsection (a).
- 14 (b) An order under Subsection (a)(3) that requires the
- 15 parent of an individual to attend a class for students at risk of
- 16 dropping out of school is enforceable in the justice, [ex]
- municipal, or juvenile court by contempt.
- SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
