Conservation Passport Tours:

Springtime

Springtime is when many Texans grab their binoculars and field guides and sally forth on birding expeditions. This spring, Texas Conservation Passport holders can go on expert-guided birding outings at 13 sites representing separate ecological regions and with widely divergent varieties of birds to enjoy.

Wherever you live in Texas, in fact, you probably are within easy driving distance of one or more tours. The sites range from coastal wetlands to the Big Bend, from the Rolling Plains of West Texas to East Texas' Post Oak Savannah.

Coastal area birders can sample a wealth of resident and migratory bird life in the marshes and bays of the Texas Coast. On April 10 and 17, you can visit Candy Abshier Wildlife Management Area on Smith Point in Chambers County east of Houston to view neotropical birds that stop there

on their South American migra-

tion route.

Farther down the coast, enjoy an all-day spring migration birding tour at Mad Island WMA in Matagorda County on April 24. A similar outing is planned for April 17 at Guadalupe Delta WMA in Calhoun County south of Victoria.

You can sample the Lower Rio Grande Valley's remarkable variety of birds on a tour at Bentsen-Rio Grande Valley State Park near Brownsville on March 10, and on March 17 a tour will be conducted nearby on units of the TPWD's Las Palomas WMA.

In the brush country of South Texas, the **Chaparral WMA** in Dimmit and LaSalle Counties harbors a variety of interesting birds. All-day "birding in the brush" tours are set for **May 22 and 23** at the area near Artesia Wells.

Desert bird species make

the drive to Black Gap WMA in Brewster County worthwhile. Wildlife scientists will demonstrate bird banding, conduct a desert bird seminar and host three birding tours, including one specifically for viewing the elusive peregrine falcon in the rugged Big Bend region of Texas.

Moving farther east, four separate bird banding demonstrations will be held, along with birding tours, at **Kickapoo Cavern State Natural Area** near Uvalde.

Tours there include a Montezuma quail slide show and calling demonstration on April 3, and bird banding observation and birding tours on March 13, April 24 and May 8 and 22.

In Central Texas, a birding tour is planned at Lake
Whitney State Park on April
25. In East Texas you can enjoy viewing the bird life at one of the state's prettiest parks,
Fairfield Lake, located in the post oak forest in Freestone
County, where birding tours with slide shows are planned for March 13 and April 10. Just down the road from Fairfield is Richland Creek WMA, where a birding and bird banding program will be held on March 27.

Conservation Passport holders in the Dallas-Fort Worth area can find a nearby birding outing at Cedar Creek Islands, a group of islands in Cedar Creek Reservoir southeast of Dallas. The nesting waterbird colony tour will be conducted on May 8.

If your family is like mine, getting out in the springtime to enjoy wildflowers and nesting birds is an annual treat not to be missed. But if you'll notice in this edition of *The Passport*, there's another, more offbeat, spring activity that's quite different from watching and photographing birds and flowers.

Down at **Bastrop State Park**, herpetologist Andy Price will host several nighttime outings that will allow you to get a look at the unique mating rituals of the endangered Houston toad. The diminutive toads, which are found only in the Lost Pines region of Bastrop County and in a small colony in Burleson County, once were quite common in much of Southeast Texas.

Listening to the male toads' high-pitched serenade may strike a sympathetic chord to those of us who hope the species can survive. Their precarious situation demonstrates how important it is for us to strive for protection and enhancement of wildlife habitats all across Texas.

I hope you have a wonderful spring and summer season in the Texas outdoors.

To expand your horizons even further, we'd like to remind you that the "Texas Wildlife Viewing Guide" is now available. This 160-page color booklet lists 142 of the best sites in the state for watching wildlife, and it offers Conservation Passport holders the opportunity to schedule additional stops on the way to and from Passport outings.

Priced at \$8.00, the guides can be purchased at selected state parks and outdoor recreation stores. It also is available from Texas Parks and Wildlife Department Headquarters, 4200 Smith School Road, Austin, TX 78744 or by calling the department's toll-free number, 1-800-792-1112. The total price is \$9.50 per Guide

when ordered through the mail.

Watchable Wildlife is a nationwide program made possible through cooperation by state and federal conservation agencies, private foundations and conservation organizations. The Texas guide tells readers how to reach each site, which animals are seen most often and species that are rare, the best times of year to see them and information about wildlife habitats.

Arrangements to visit a few of the privately owned sites must be made through the owner whose number is provided, but most are readily accessible to the public. Entry to some of the sites is free, but others require at least a nominal fee. Conservation Passport holders, of course, are admitted free to the 70 sites owned or managed by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department.
