Head For the Hills This Summer

If you're looking for a long summer weekend of fun, just pack your bags, grab your Texas Conservation Passport and head for the Hill Country of Central Texas. No area of Texas offers as many Conservation Passport activities within easy driving distance of each other.

If your weekend getaway starts early, on a Thursday or Friday, make scenic **Colorado Bend State Park** your first stop. On request, park superintendent Robert Basse will take you to a

baited wildlife viewing area where you may see white-tailed deer, turkeys and a host of bird life. Before leaving, be sure to make arrangements to see **Gorman Falls**, one of Texas' most scenic waterfalls.

When you leave Colorado Bend, head south through Llano (the barbecue capital of Texas) and then check out the Willow City Loop off FM 16 in Gillespie County. The loop winds through the classic Hill Country terrain, offering plenty of photo opportunities.

A great overnight camping spot that might come in handy is **Inks Lake State Park**, located on Inks Lake just below the Lake Buchanan dam. From Inks you can visit nearby **Longhorn Cavern State Park** on Park Road 4. From there, travel south on U.S. Highway 281 and then east on U.S. 290 to **Pedernales Falls State Park**, where you can spend a day enjoying the clear waters of the Pedernales River. Call ahead to make a reservation and take a park-management tour with superintendent Bill McDaniel. The tour is available on weekdays beginning at 9:00 a.m. On weekends you can take the Conservation Passport Twin Falls nature walk, also guided by McDaniel, to get a closer look at the flora and fauna of the park. Full camping facilities are available in the park, and lodging is available in nearby Johnson City.

Heading west from the park on U.S. Highway 290, stop by **LBJ State Park** and **LBJ Ranch** before continuing to Fredericksburg, where you can dine and shop in the historic downtown area and see **Admiral Nimitz Museum**, also downtown.

Yet another Conservation Passport activity is just a short drive to the south and west where, on

the first Saturday of each month, the **Heart of the Hills Fisheries Research Station** offers a nature study tour of a Hill Country spring and an interesting tour of the research facility.

Another option you shouldn't overlook on this Hill Country swing is **Honey Creek State Natural Area** near Bulverde in Comal County just north of San Antonio. Weekend activities for Conservation Passport holders there include ecosystem tours, botany and geology and children's nature walks.

Remarkably, all these recreational opportunities are available within an approximate 75mile radius of Johnson City, allowing you to pack as much fun as possible into a long weekend outing.
