(c) An institution of higher education may not require an applicant for admission to the institution as an undergraduate

- 10 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003, and

- 14 before the effective date are covered by the law in effect
- 15 immediately before that date, and the former law is continued in
- 16 effect for that purpose.
