

AN ACT

relating to information that must be included in the adjutant general's annual report.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. Section 431.034, Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 431.034. REPORT. (a) The adjutant general annually shall report to the governor. The report shall be delivered to the legislature. The report must include:

(1) a complete and detailed written statement accounting for all funds received and disbursed by the department during the preceding fiscal year that meets the reporting requirements applicable to financial reporting provided in the General Appropriations Act;

(2) an account, to the extent of the adjutant general's knowledge, of all arms, ammunition, and other military property owned by or in possession of the state, the source from which it was received, to whom it is issued, and its present condition;

(3) a statement of the number, condition, and organization of the Texas National Guard and reserve militia; ~~and~~

(4) suggestions that the adjutant general considers important to the military interests and conditions of the state and the perfection of its military organization;

(5) a list and description of all Texas National Guard

1 missions that are in progress at the time the report is prepared;  
2 and

3 (6) a statement of department plans to obtain and  
4 maintain future Texas National Guard missions, including proposed  
5 missions that are consistent with the United States Department of  
6 Defense's war-fighting strategies, including strategies used in  
7 the war on terrorism.

8 (b) Information relating to current, proposed, or planned  
9 missions that is considered by the adjutant general or governor to  
10 be classified or of a sensitive nature need not be included in the  
11 annual report under this section.

12 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2003.
