- 7 Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 8 (a) Except as provided by Section 521.344, the license of a
- 9 person who was under 21 years of age at the time of the offense,
- 10 other than an offense classified as a misdemeanor punishable by
- fine only, is automatically suspended on conviction of:
- 12 (1) an offense under Section 49.04 or 49.07, Penal
- 13 Code, committed as a result of the introduction of alcohol into the
- 14 body;
- 15 (2) an offense under the Alcoholic Beverage Code,
- other than an offense to which Section 106.071 of that code applies,
- involving the manufacture, delivery, possession, transportation,
- 18 or use of an alcoholic beverage;
- 19 (3) a misdemeanor offense under Chapter 481, Health
- 20 and Safety Code, for which Subchapter P does not require the
- 21 automatic suspension of the license;
- 22 (4) an offense under Chapter 483, Health and Safety
- 23 Code, involving the manufacture, delivery, possession,
- 24 transportation, or use of a dangerous drug; or

(5) an offense under Chapter 485 [484], Health and 1 Safety Code, involving the manufacture, delivery, possession, 2 transportation, or use of an abusable [a] volatile chemical. 3 4 SECTION 2.
