2	WHEREAS, The Honorable Paul C. Moreno has established an
3	outstanding record of service not only to the members of his
4	community but to Texans everywhere during his longstanding tenure
5	in the Texas Legislature; and
6	WHEREAS, Mr. Moreno was born on April 28, 1931, and has been a
7	lifelong resident of El Paso County where he received both his
8	primary and secondary education from the El Paso Independent School
9	District in South El Paso and then went on to serve six years in the
10	United States Marine Corps, his tour of duty being with the 1st
11	Marine Division in Korea; and
12	WHEREAS, As a result of his participation in Korea, and as a
13	tribute to his service to the country, Mr. Moreno was awarded the
14	following citations:
15	1. U.S. Presidential Unit Citation with Two Bronze Stars
16	2. Korean Presidential Unit Citation with one Oak Leaf
17	Cluster
18	3. Korean Service Medal with one Silver and One Bronze Star
19	4. The National Defense Service Medal · -
20	5. Good Conduct Medal; and
21	WHEREAS, After earning his B.B.A. degree at Texas Western
22	College, now known as The University of Texas at El Paso, Mr. Moreno
23	went on to The University of Texas Law School where he prepared for
24	what would become a long and distinguished career of dedicated

- 1 public service, and is currently a member of the State Bar of Texas,
- 2 the El Paso Bar Association, the American Judicature Society, and
- 3 was co-founder of the El Paso Legal Assistance; and
- WHEREAS, He won his first election in 1966 at a time when
- 5 Mexican-American legislators were few in numbers and lacking in
- 6 influence; today he is considered the "Watch Dog" and the
- 7 "Conscience of the House" by his peers and is looked on by the
- 8 members of the Mexican-American Legislative Caucus as a mentor and
- 9 role model who has broken down barriers and opened doors of
- 10 opportunity for them as well as for members of the communities they
- 11 represent; and
- WHEREAS, A passionate and outspoken advocate for the poor,
- 13 the disabled, the disenfranchised, and education, he sought and
- 14 received committee assignments that allowed him to represent
- 15 constituencies whose voices are not always among the most powerful;
- 16 currently a member of the Juvenile Justice and Family Issues
- 17 Committee, he has also served in recent sessions on the
- 18 Appropriations Committee as well as the Committee on Higher
- 19 Education; and
- WHEREAS, Now an elder statesman serving his 18th term in the
- 21 House of Representatives and the second most senior House member,
- 22 Representative Moreno rightfully has earned the esteem of his
- 23 constituents and of his colleagues through the years of his
- 24 forthright and uncompromising approach to the ideals of public
- 25 service; and
- WHEREAS, His achievements as the longest-serving
- 27 Mexican-American legislator in Texas history are worthy of

cognition, and this colleagues have proposed naming the state office building in El Paso in his honor as a fitting tribute; now, therefore, be it
