To His Excellency Richard Coke,

Governor of the State of Texas :

SIR: In compliance with law, I have the honor to submit my report of the workings of this department during the fiscal year ending August 31st, 1875, together with a supplemental report to February 1st, 1876, for the information of your Excellency upon matters of importance which have transpired since the close of the fiscal year.

In submitting this report, I beg leave to call your attention to several subjects which I deem of first importance to the State, the neglect of which must necessarily impede that increasing prosperity for which we have such abundant cause for congratulation. Foremost among these subjects of vital importance, I mention the

ASSESSMENT OF TAXES.

By reference to the tables of assessments, it will be observed that the taxable values of the State fall short of the estimates *made in a former report for 1875, viz: \$275,000,000.*

The reasons for this are obvious. With all the diligence on the part of Assessors which I have been able to secure by repeated instructions from this office, there is yet a vast amount of taxable lands in the State not assessed, which omission is not altogether the fault of assessors, but is owing in a very great degree to the workings of our present law, and the want of facilities for information, necessary to a proper discharge of duty. I am still of the opinion that if the property rendered had been assessed at its fair market value, it would have reached \$275,000,000; and if a full assessment could be had of all property in the State subject to taxation, the values would not fall short of \$300,000,000.

To secure this full assessment, the plan adopted in the proposed Constitution seems most likely to succeed; but in addition to having but one Assessor, as contemplated, and requiring the rendition of all land in the county in which it is situated, it is indispensably necessary that full and complete abstracts of all taxable lands be furnished each Assessor, without which it will be impossible for him to determine whether all lands in his county have been rendered for taxation or not.

It will be observed from the tables that there has been a small increase in values for 1875, over 1874. It is believed this increase would have been greater had more vigilance been exercised by the proper officers in securing the rendition of property at its real value. In cities especially, this under-valuation is apparent. As an example, among others which suggest themselves, I beg to refer your Excellency to the city of Galveston. By reference to the tables of assessments, it will be seen that the entire taxable values of Galveston city and county, including merchandise, money on hand and at interest, stock and miscellaneous property of every kind, exclusive of real estate, is placed at the small sum of \$3,133,072. The return of poll taxes for the *city* and *county* is \$1339, out of a population of say thirty-five thousand for Galveston city alone.

From the above, the necessity at once appears that assessors should be required to inform themselves of the value of property to be assessed, not only that the State may receive the amount of tax justly due, but also that assessments shall weigh equally upon each tax-payer.

The imperfect manner in which assessments are, in many instances made, entails a vast amount of work upon this department. The rolls are often so imperfect that it requires the labor of several clerks for months to correct inaccuracies. The rolls, when corrected, are bound, and in the accumulation of years, these records are becoming so voluminous that it is necessary to adopt some system by which space can be economized, as well as to simplify the workings of this office and place the records in such condition that they may be of easy reference.

To correct the evils mentioned, I would suggest an entirely new method by which assessors, in making their returns to this office, shall be governed. I recommend first, that, in order that they may have ample time to perform their duties thoroughly, they be given until the first day of August of each year to complete their assessments; at which date they should be required, under penalty, to place the tax rolls in the hands of the collector.

When the assessment is completed and the rolls delivered to the collecting officer, the assessor should be required to forward to this office, upon blanks to be furnished him, a detailed statement, showing each kind of property assessed, its value, and the tax upon the same, which statement shall be certified by the County Judge as being a correct transcript from the tax book furnished the collector—the amount so certified to be charged to the collector. Books upon which to make the tax lists should be furnished by the State, properly ruled—two for each county—one to be filed with the District Clerk, and the other to be turned over to the collector.

In this manner the State obtains all the information the present system affords, and is relieved of the labor of correcting tax rolls, and also of the enormous accumulation of unwieldy records. I hand you herewith for examination the form of tax book recommended. The simplicity and efficiency of this method will commend itself when compared with our present system.

The subject of next importance is the

COLLECTION OF TAXES.

There is a degree of remissness in the collection of taxes, which is to some extent attributable to the want of *stringency in our revenue laws.*

I would respectfully suggest that a day be fixed, by which time collectors shall be required to make a full and complete settlement with the State, and in case of his failure to do so, suit should be instituted at once upon his bond. I recommend the first day of June as a proper date at which settlement should be required. Collectors having received the tax book on the first of August preceding, will then have the fall, winter and spring months during which to make collections—time amply sufficient when ordinary diligence is exercised.

Upon completing his settlement with this office, he should be required to file the book turned over to him by the assessor, which book shall take the place of the assessment rolls, which the law now requires to be filed in this department. This book, when filed, will show the entire revenue transactions of the county which it represents—showing the assessment, the collection, the date of payment and the delinquency, all under one cover, simple yet complete.

Another great difficulty this department has to contend with, is the collection of delinquent taxes, a large amount of which can be saved by the enactment of proper laws. Our present system is so complicated and defective that it is with great difficulty delinquents can be reached.

I recommend that after the collector files his book and settles his current account, he shall not be allowed further to collect the taxes of that year; but that the Comptroller be required to furnish the names of the delinquents to some officer named by law, who shall be required to bring suit for the amount of taxes due the State. The tax book before alluded to will furnish all the information necessary, in a condensed form. There are a number of delinquent lists, for years prior to 1873, in the hands of District Attorneys, and others, which are not accounted for, and there are many others of which this office has no knowledge. I suggest that a law be passed requiring the immediate return of all such delinquent lists to this office.

BONDED DEBT.

We have reason to feel gratified at the small amount of our debt, in proportion to the vast resources of the State.

Interest is promptly paid as it falls due, and our bonds are now in the front rank of Southern securities. By reference to the debt statement, it will be seen that \$279,000 of bonds of Act of May 19th, 1871, will fall due on September 1st of the present year; and \$125,000 of Act of November 19th, 1866, fall due on the first of January, 1877. These payments must be promptly made.

There is now outstanding \$1,573,757 ten per cent. bonds, which are redeemable at the pleasure of the State—a part after 1877 and the remainder after 1880. It would be well for the State as these bonds are redeemable, to authorize the sale of six per cent. gold bonds, at not less than par, and retire the ten per cent. bonds, thus saving four per cent. interest.

FLOATING DEBT.

It will be observed that the amount of Warrants on General Revenue unpaid is very small. Warrants drawn against the School Fund for pay of teachers prior to July, 1873, amount to \$331,493 28, which are drawing eight per cent. interest. The proposed Constitution provides that the Legislature, at its first session, shall either pay or fund them, as they deem best. I suggest that they be funded in long date six per cent. gold bonds of the denomination of \$500 and \$1000.

Having a large interest to pay on the bonded debt, in addition to the current expenses of the Government, and the protection of the frontier, the present low rate of taxation may not be sufficient to meet all demands promptly, and some deficiency may occur. To guard against this, and to prevent the consequent depreciation of Treasury Warrants, I recommend that 6 per cent. gold bonds of the denomination of \$500 and \$1000 be authorized—not to exceed \$200,000, which may be sold at not less than par, or exchanged for Treasury Warrants, to meet such deficiency should it occur. It is hoped, however, that with effective laws and their proper enforcement, so as to secure for taxation the vast amount of property in the State now not taxed, and a rigid collection of taxes assessed, the present tax will be sufficient for all demands against the State.

OCCUPATION TAXES.

I respectfully suggest the propriety of discontinuing the assessment of the occupation taxes. Paying for such assessments is a burden upon the State for which no adequate return is received. Every person desiring to pursue a taxable occupation should be required to procure a license from the District Clerk upon presentation of the Collector's receipt for the taxes due, and the District Clerk should be required to report to this office, quarterly, the number of licenses issued by him.

BACK TAXES.

Some progress is being made in compiling a general land register. An account has been opened with every tract of patented and titled land, as reported by the Commissioner of the General Land Office, but the accounts have not been brought up to date. The progress of this work must necessarily be slow, without additional clerical force, which would necessitate some addition to the building.

DOUBTFUL ACCOUNTS.

I again call the attention of your Excellency to a number of accounts which are being carried upon the books of this office, the validity of which has been questioned. I respectfully recommend that some action be taken by the Legislature, determining their validity or invalidity. Your Excellency is referred to the debt statement in explanation of these doubtful accounts. The item \$320,367 13 cannot be properly chargeable to the State, inasmuch as railroad companies are now paying the same debt which those bonds were issued to cover.

DUPLICATE TREASURY WARRANTS.

Warrants drawn upon the Treasurer are sometimes lost, and application made, by parties losing them, for duplicates. Some are claimed to have been lost in the late overflow along our coast. There is no law authorizing the issue of duplicates. Your attention is respectfully called to this subject.

SCHOOL CLAIMS.

Many persons claim that they have valid accounts against the State, as teachers of Public Schools, but are unable to perfect the voucher necessary under the law, because of the failure of county officers to make the reports required. I suggest that such claims be determined by the county authorities. The approved accounts now on file in the office will be more than sufficient to exhaust the appropriation of \$400,000.

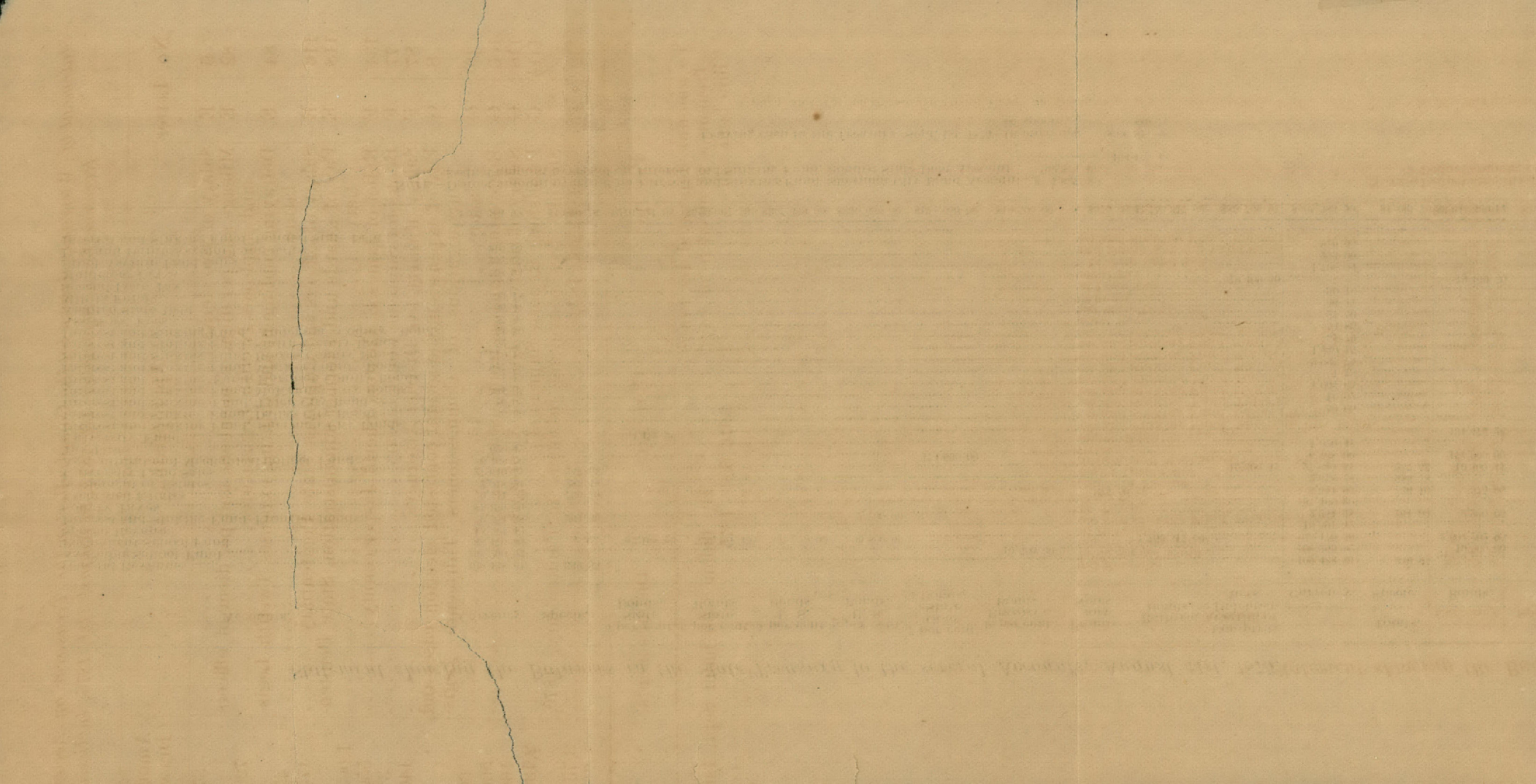

NOTE—The above estimates for appropriations are made by the head of each Department, and with the exception of the Blind Asylum are intended to cover one year—for the three years the estimates should be triplicated. No appropriation is asked for the payment of interest on the public debt, for the reason that the laws under which the debt was created, provide for the payment of interest, and are a sufficient appropriation in themselves.

The appropriation for salaries of clerks in the Comptroller's Office, is asked for in the aggregate, for the reason that in this way it can be made more available. There are several positions in this office which require experience and ability, and for which a larger salary should be paid than is required for clerks generally. The amount asked for is the same as was appropriated by the last Legislature, differing from that appropriation only in that the amount is aggregated.
