REPORT OF THE COMPTROLLER.

OFFICE OF COMPTROLLER,
AUSTIN, November 1, 1886. }

To His Excellency John Ireland, Governor of Texas:

SIR—I have the honor to submit the following report exhibiting the transactions of this department during the two fiscal years beginning September 1, 1884, and ending August 31, 1886, together with such remarks on the finances as are thought to be necessary.

REVENUE.

Table No. 1 shows the receipts from all sources, and the expenses of the government paid from the treasury during the two years.

The rate of Taxation in force at the beginning of the fiscal year, September 1, 1884 from which the current expenses of the State government were to be paid to August 31, 1885, was for revenue purposes seventeen and-one-half cents on the \$100 worth of property.

An examination of the revenue account, Table No. 1, will show that from that rate of taxation, together with revenue from all other sources (including the balance on hand at the beginning of the fiscal year), the State received during the year ending August 31, 1885, the sum of \$2,064,222.89, and expended during the same time (including necessary transfers), the sum of \$1,979,381.25, leaving in the treasury, August 31, 1885, a balance of revenue, \$84,841.64.

It will be observed by reference to the revenue account that we commenced the year with a balance on hand..... \$145,298 26

During the year ending August 31, 1885, in the current receipts of revenue from ordinary sources, with the rate of taxation at seventeen and one-half cents on the \$100, as compared with the expenditures during the same time.

We commenced the next fiscal year, beginning September 1, 1885, with the rate of taxation raised from seventeen and one-half cents to twenty-five cents on the \$100, by act of the Legislature, approved March 31, 1885.

Making the same analysis of the revenue account for the next year, beginning September 1, 1885, and ending August 31, 1886, we find total receipts from all sources, including balance on hand at the beginning of the year.....	\$2,198,873 04

It will be observed that during the year there were no receipts from extraordinary sources.

It is believed that the present rate of taxation will not only be sufficient to defray the current expense of the government economically administered, but, should there be no extraordinary appropriation to be met, will enable the treasury to carry on hand a surplus of revenue sufficient to meet any emergency. This is as it should be. While a large and unnecessary surplus

should not be hoarded in the treasury, still there should always be a sure provision against suspension of payments by the Treasurer, though a small surplus should remain idle in the Treasury. In this connection it is proper to state that while the receipts during the year ending August 31, 1885, were in excess of the expenditures during the year, yet the receipts were not so evenly distributed during the year as to prevent the suspension of cash payments in January, 1886.

This arose from the fact that the taxes under the increased rate of taxation could not be made available soon enough to prevent the embarrassment. It will be seen from the statement of the revenue account, Table No. 1, that the year was commenced with a very small balance on hand, to-wit: \$84,841.64. Upon that amount, together with the monthly receipts, the Treasurer had to rely to pay the current expenses of the government.

It is well understood that the taxes of any given year are not due until the first day of October of that year, and the payment of taxes is voluntary until the first of March following, when collection of taxes can be enforced by seizure and sale of property. During the months of October, November and December, the collections in the counties are comparatively small and a large portion of the taxes collected is used to pay the several assessors the fees due them for assessing the taxes of the year, hence the receipts at the Treasury from August 31, 1885, to January 1, 1886, were but little if any in excess of the amount required to pay the monthly expenses of the State government.

In January, 1886, the regular semi-annual interest on the State debt became due. More than half of this debt is due to the school fund and other special funds of the State, the school fund arising from the interest on the bonds held. By that fund had been apportioned to the several counties by the Board of Education and drafts issued for the same to the several county treasurers. On the first of January, 1886, the Treasurer did not have on hand sufficient funds to meet the interest payments, and at the same time maintain daily cash payments, and the alternative was presented either to suspend for a while cash payment of warrants or refuse to pay the interest due to the school and other special funds, using the same for the daily expenses of the government. Thus withholding and diverting these special funds from the use to which they had been specially set apart by law. It was believed that to use for current expenses the interest that was due to the school fund was improper, in consideration of the fact that the same had already been apportioned to the counties for payment of expenses of the public schools, and the teachers of the schools were, in some instances, selling their

accounts at a discount because there were no funds in hand to pay them.

Another and stronger reason why this should not be done is found in the fact that such action would have been in plain violation of the Penal Code of this State, which reads as follows: "If any person shall knowingly and wilfully borrow, withhold, or in any manner divert from its purpose, any special fund, or any part thereof, belonging to or under the control of the State, which has been set apart by law for a specific use, he shall be punished by confinement in the penitentiary for a term of not less than two nor more than ten years." Important as was the continuation of cash payments by the Treasurer, the observance of the above Statute was of greater importance, and in this view of the case, a warrant was drawn on the Treasurer for the interest due the special funds.

There was not sufficient revenue in the treasury to pay this warrant, and as a consequence it became necessary for the Treasurer to register the warrant and suspend payment until such time as funds were received sufficient to pay the same. In February and March money came rapidly into the treasury and cash payments were resumed. This derangement of the finances was anticipated in the report from this office for the year ending August 31, 1884.

SCHOOL FUND.

Table No. 2 shows receipts and disbursements of the available school fund for the two years beginning September 1, 1884, and ending August 31, 1886. From this table it will be seen that the State spends annually for school purposes nearly one million dollars more than is spent for the current expenses of the Government. This fact suggests such law as will secure a vigilant oversight of the manner in which these expenditures are made in the several counties in order that the proper authorities may be well informed as to the disbursement of this large sum.

The permanent school fund has been invested in county bonds as fast as received. The amount of bonds offered to the Board of Education up to this time has been largely in excess of the cash receipts for investment.

Table No. 43 shows the amount of county bonds purchased to August 31, 1886, and the several counties from which the purchases were made, with the rate of interest the bonds carry.

RAILROADS.

The attention of your Excellency is called to table No. 73,

giving the reports of railroad companies, under the requirement of Article No. 4249, Revised Statutes. These reports are in some particulars not sufficient in detail to furnish the information necessary to a full understanding of the transaction of the several companies. I refer more particularly to that clause of Article 4249, Revised Statutes, which requires them to report "the sales of lands donated by the State and the quantity remaining unsold." The custom has been heretofore for the railroad companies to report the number of acres sold and the number of acres unsold. A statement of that kind does not furnish the information to the proper officer of the State whether they have or not complied with the law which requires that one half of the lands donated by the State shall be alienated in six years, and the remainder in twelve years.

A communication was received at this office from the Honorable Attorney General, calling attention to the requirements of this law and absence of information on the subject. I at once addressed a communication to the general managers of the several railroad companies to which the State has made donation of land, as follows:

AUSTIN, TEXAS, September 22, 1886.

SIR:—Referring to the report which will be due at this office by your company on the first day of October next, I beg to call your attention to that part of Article 4249, Revised Statutes, referring to the sales of lands donated by the State to railroads, in which it is required that each corporation shall report the sale of land donated by the State and the quantity remaining unsold. You will observe that the purpose of this Statute is to enable the officers of the government and the Legislature to determine whether the conditions of the grant of land has been complied with in respect to alienation. I therefore have to request that in the forthcoming report in October, and in future reports, that you give the date of sale of each tract and the person to whom sold, briefly so describing it that it may be identified.

In this connection I will say alienation, as regarded by the State, is an unconditional disposition of the property. The laws do not regard a mortgage as an alienation, and the Constitution forbids the recognition of a merely colorable title. The information asked for is of great importance to the State, and I request that the same be embodied in all future reports.

Up to this date I have had no complete report from any company except the Houston and Texas Central Railway Company. That company, while denying the right of this office to demand such a detailed report, made a statement giving the number of acres of

land alienated by that company and the date of alienation, as requested in the letter quoted above. The objection urged to the authority of this office to require such a report, I do not consider a reasonable one, and I have insisted upon a report in such form as will give the information necessary to be had in order to determine whether the statutes have been complied with in reference to the alienation of lands donated by the State to railroad companies.

PALACE CARS.

The Pulman Palace Car Company has refused to pay the tax levied upon them by Article 4665, Revised Statutes. The company denies the authority of the State to levy an occupation tax upon any person or association of persons running palace, sleeping or dining cars from one State into another State, upon the ground that to levy such a tax is an interference with interstate commerce. Inasmuch as the Legislature will meet before the next term of the District Court of Travis County begins, in which suit for the recovery of the tax may be instituted, I have thought it proper to submit the question to their consideration. Under decision of the United States Supreme Court, the company has avoided taxation in other States, and in view of these decisions it is suggested that the subject be examined with a view to determine whether or not our manner of taxing the Pulman Car Company is inconsistent with the decisions of the Supreme Court.

APPROPRIATIONS.

Table No. 71 gives the estimated appropriations required for the several departments of the State Government for the two years ending February 28, 1889. These estimates of amounts necessary for the next two years were made by the heads of the several departments, and are given as received from them as expressing their views of the needs of their respective departments.

ASSESSMENTS.

In Tables No. 53 and 54 will be found the assessed value of property in the State for the year 1885 and 1886. Total value for 1885, \$621,011,989, and for 1886 \$630,591,029. The increase in the assessed values of 1885 over the assessed values for 1884 is \$17,951,072, and the increase of 1886 over 1885 is \$9,579,040. It

will be seen that the increase in 1886 is mainly from real estate, while there has been a marked shrinkage in the value of personal property, especially in the value of cattle and sheep.

The increase in 1886 over 1885 in the value of lands is.....

OCCUPATION TAXES.

There has been a decrease in the receipts of occupation taxes for the year ending June 30, 1886, as compared with the previous year. Tables No. 55 and 56 gives the amount of occupation taxes collected in the several counties of the State during the year ending June 30, 1885, as follows: \$681,348.45; and for the year ending June 30, 1886, \$634,910.40. A decrease of \$46,438.05.

The falling off in the receipts from occupation taxes collected in the counties is due chiefly to the adoption of the provisions of the local option law in many sections of the State and the consequent decrease of the number of licenses issued for the sale of spirituous liquors.

During the year ending June 30, 1885, the number of licenses issued for the sale of spirituous, vinous and malt liquors, was

From which it is seen that there has been a decrease of 103 in the number of retail dealers, 4 wholesale dealers, 53 quart dealers, and an increase of 80 in the number of beer dealers. Showing a decrease in the receipts from the sale of spirituous liquors of 41,700; and an increase from the sale of beer of \$4,000.

In addition to the occupation taxes collected in the several counties there has been collected by the Comptroller from certain occupation taxes, made payable by law directly to him, as follows:

A decrease of \$10,263.38, principally in receipts from the sale of drummers's licenses and from railroads on account of passenger tax.

DEFICIENCIES.

Reference is made to table No. 71, showing the amount of deficiency in appropriation for which an addition appropriation is necessary. Some of these deficiency accounts have been filed in the office by sheriffs who are tax collectors, as an offset to amounts due by them to the State to the extent of the accounts filed. These accounts are all for personal service of the several sheriffs, and an appropriation to pay them should be made promptly.

COSTS IN TAX SALES.


The attention of your Excellency is called to the great lack of uniformity in the several counties in charging costs at tax sales. In selling real estate for the unpaid taxes on same the law allows to the collector of taxes "the same compensation as allowed by law to sheriffs or constables for making a levy and sale in similar cases." The amounts charged as costs of sale in the different counties vary from two dollars and a half to five dollars per tract sold, and in some cases a much greater amount is charged, according to each collector's construction of the law governing the costs, and is often an unjust imposition on the owners of the land who have to pay these costs. Much complaint on this point has been made by persons whose lands have been sold for taxes, and I suggest such an amendment of the Statutes as will clearly define the charges that may be made by tax collectors in selling lands for taxes.
