REPORT OF THE COMPTROLLER.

To His Excellency, L. S. Ross, Governor of Texas:

In compliance with Article 2758, Revised Statutes, I have the honor to submit herewith for your inspection the annual report of this department of the State Government for the fiscal year ending August 31, 1887, with such remarks as are deemed pertinent.

RECEIPTS AND DISBURSEMENTS.

The following statement will show the balances on hand August 31, 1886; also the receipts, disbursements and balances pertaining to each of the funds for the fiscal year ending August 31, 1887:

STATE REVENUE.

Table No. 1 shows receipts and disbursements of this fund:

From the foregoing statement it will be observed that the receipts during the year, exceed the disbursements during the same period of time, \$325,507.44.

By comparing this showing with the receipts of the fiscal year ending August 31, 1886 (see Comptroller's report for 1886, page 2) an increase appears in receipts for the year ending August 31, 1887, over that of the former year, \$238,994.41.

It is with pleasure that reference is made to this healthy condition of the State's finances; and in noting this increase in receipts, with the same rate of taxation in force, it is attributed largely to the fidelity and promptness of tax collectors during the past year.

These officers have been specially instructed by this department to be diligent in the collection of back taxes, or rather, delinquent taxes of former years, and much credit is due them for the manner in which they have responded.

Notwithstanding the stringency of the times, the drouth, etc., collections on delinquent and insolvent lists show a marked increase over former years. Collections of taxes due for 1886 have been equally close; indeed, in some sections of the State, the insolvent lists and sales to the State are remarkably small. I deem it but simple justice that the tax collectors should be complimented upon the manner in which they have discharged their duty. While it is to be expected that every public officer shall faithfully and fully discharge the duties incumbent upon him, yet the showing made by the tax collectors of this State during the past year being almost unprecedented, is considered worthy of special notice.

Conforming to the provisions of article 4761 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by the Twentieth Legislature, requiring tax collectors to adjust and finally settle their accounts with the State on or before the first day of May of each year, the following instructions to collectors were issued by this department:

To Tax Collectors:

Your attention is directed to the following law, passed by the Twentieth Legislature of the State of Texas, and approved by the Governor, March 30, A. D. 1887:

CHAPTER 85.—[S. B. No. 188.] *An act to amend an act to amend article 4761 of the Revised Civil Statutes of the State of Texas, approved April 24, 1879.*

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Texas: That article 4761 of the Revised Civil Statutes shall hereafter read as follows:

Article 4761. The collectors of taxes shall, at the close of each month, pay over to the State Treasurer all moneys collected by them during the month, for the State, excepting such amounts as they are allowed by law to pay in the counties, reserving only their commissions on the same; and to enable them to do so, they may, at their own risk, secure and send the same to the Treasurer by express, or in postoffice orders, at not more than the usual rate of exchange, to be paid by the State; that the collectors of taxes shall pay over to the State Treasurer all balances in their hands belonging to the State, and finally adjust and settle their accounts with the Comptroller on or before the first day of May of each year; that the Treasurer, whenever he may receive from the collectors of taxes postoffice orders, shall collect the same and pay the money so collected in the treasury on the deposit warrant of the Comptroller, and the money, when so deposited, shall be a credit to the tax collector. It shall be the duty of the Comptroller to enforce a strict observance of the provisions of this article, but no public moneys shall be paid to the Comptroller except such as are made payable directly to him as collector of the same under existing statutes, and expressly provided by law to be paid to him as receiver of taxes; and in addition to the reports required by law to be made by tax collectors, they shall make a monthly statement under oath, on forms to be provided by the Comptroller, showing the amounts collected each month, and the funds to which they belong. Any collector of taxes failing to comply with the provisions of this article shall be fined in a sum not less than five hundred and not more than one thousand dollars, and each failure to make the required report shall constitute a separate offense; and it shall be the duty of the Comptroller to notify the county attorney, or district attorney, of the county in which the collector resides, and the sureties on the bond of said collector, of any failure to comply with the provisions of this law.

SEC. 2. The necessity for the passage of this bill, and the near approach of the close of the present session of the Legislature, creates an imperative public necessity that the constitutional rule requiring bills to be read on three several days be suspended, and it is so enacted, and that this act take effect and be in force from the passage, and it is so enacted.

FISCAL AND APPROPRIATION YEAR.

The attention of your excellency is called to the complications in adjusting the State's accounts, arising from the fact that the fiscal, occupation, and appropriation years, end at different dates ; the fiscal year ending August 31, the occupation year ending June 30, and the appropriation year ending February 28.

If these years closed on the same date, much more satisfactory reports and estimates could be furnished for the purpose of comparison ; they would not seem so conflicting as at present, and it would simplify the estimating of receipts and expenditures of the State Government for any given period.

I only allude to this briefly at this time, as it is my intention to make a more extended reference to the subject in the next annual report of this department.

BONDED DEBT.

For a detailed statement of the bonded debt of the State, reference is made to Table No. 43.

The total amount of bonds outstanding, is \$4,237,730, of which

apportionment of available school fund to the various counties, can be seen in table No. 65.

RAILROADS.

Annual reports required from railway companies under article 4249 of the Revised Statutes are compiled in Table No. 58, a summary of which shows the extent of railroad operations in the State for the year ending October 1, 1887.

TAXABLE VALUES.

The assessed values for 1887 appear in Table No. 59, giving in detail the taxable property of each county, which is summed up as follows :

The summary of this table shows the increase and decrease in values of all taxable property for this year over 1886.

The increase in values comes mainly from lands, town and city lots, and railroads.

While there has been this advance in the total taxable values of the State, the shrinkage in cattle values amount to \$9,844,388, notwithstanding an increase in numbers of 126,728 head. From the records in this department this appears to be the first time in many years that all the tax rolls were completed and filed in this office in time to be used in the Comptroller's Annual Report. Much more satisfactory statistics can be presented and estimates of receipts are more reliable when the actual assessed values are at hand to deal with. And for bringing about this result the tax assessors should be commended for their diligence and promptness during the past year.

ESTIMATE OF STATE REVENUE, RECEIPTS AND EXPENDITURES FOR 1887-8.

The attention of your excellency is called to Table No. 73 receipts and expenses of the State Government for the fiscal year ending August 31, 1888. Summed up, it gives the following result:

This estimate of receipts is based on increased values for 1887 over 1886 of \$19,887,278, and shows a cash balance in the State Treasury on the thirty-first of August, 1888, of \$1,187,670.03.

Reasoning upon the basis that there will be no shrinkage in values next year, but that on the contrary, an increase may be confidently expected unless in the event of some great calamity, and, in view of the fact that there will probably be no unusual demand upon the next Legislature for extraordinary appropriations, apart from an ample provision for furnishing the new Capitol, putting the grounds in order, etc., there would seem to be abundant evidence to warrant the Twenty-first Legislature in favoring a reduction of taxes.

While even a temporary suspension of payment by the State, should never be permitted to occur, the accumulation in the State Treasury of more money, gathered from the people by taxation than is really necessary for an efficient and economical administration of the government, should be guarded against and avoided with equal zeal.

CONCLUSION.

It has been my earnest endeavor to conduct the work of this department in accordance with law and upon strict business principles. The results which have been attained, are evidenced by the record herewith submitted.

It is with pleasure that I express my appreciation of the uniform courtesy extended to this department by your excellency, as also by all other officers of the State government.

To my co-laborers, who have been associated with me in the office during the past year, and who have so faithfully and ably discharged the duties imposed upon them, I extend my most grateful and sincere thanks.
