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# U.S.-Mexico Trade: Negative Growth Continues in 2009—Jan. Figures Below Par

As reported in the February 2009 issue of the *Border Business Indicators*, 2008 ended with the highest figures in the history of trade between the U.S. and Mexico. Final tallies marked yet another high point in U.S.-Mexico trade surpassing the previous one of 2007. After 2000, trade between the countries remained flat but changed in 2004. The 2008 total trade between the trading partners registered an all-time high of \$367.4 billion or a 5.8 percent increase over 2007. U.S. exports to Mexico and U.S. imports from Mexico increased 11.0 percent and 2.4 percent respectively over 2007.

In previous years, the January trade dollar figures have been good indicators as to how the trade trend would fair for the remainder of the respective year. In comparing those monthly values, each registered increases over the previous years monthly figures. In January 2009, these figures may not be as indicative as pervious years due to the housing subprime crisis, the global financial crisis fueled by some major insitutions going bankrupt or closing, the U.S. automakers treading in dangerous waters and the Mexican peso's devaluation which all began to occur in or around the latter part of 2008.


As exhibited in Chart 1, ten years of January U.S. exports to Mexico values are shown. The January 2009 dollar figure decreased by 17.6 percent over the same period in 2008, but in comparison, there had been an increase of 11.2 percent in 2007. Furthermore for the first time in 2008, there had been a drop in the exports dollar value in November, but no change in value December of 2008.

On the other hand, U.S. imports from Mexico in January 2009 did not fair as

well either. For the first time in many years, U.S. imports recorded several consecutive negative percent changes. Those months were October (0.5 percent), No-

vember (21.3 percent), December 2008 (15.0 percent) culminated with the reported figure for January 2009—26.5 percent (See Chart 2).

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

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
# Note from the Director

Indicators of border business activity that were reported for January 2009 year-to-date (YTD) demonstrated six indicators increased and fourteen decreased. 2009 YTD comparisons to 2008 reported for the border are listed below:

- Pedestrian bridge crossings into Mexico were up 3.7 percent.
- Pedestrian bridge crossings into Texas were up 4.8 percent.
- Vehicle bridge crossings into Mexico fell 7.4 percent.
- · Vehicle bridge crossings into Texas fell 2.8 percent.
- Truck bridge crossings into Mexico lost 19.0 percent.
- Truck bridge crossings into Texas lost 24.7 percent.
- Rail car bridge crossings into Mexico went down 36.5 percent.
- Rail car bridge crossings into Texas went down 24.4 percent.
- Revenues data collected by U.S. Customs was not available at press time.
- Revenues collected by U.S. bridge operators registered a loss of 11.8 percent.
- Tourist visas issued for entry into Mexico data was not available at press time.
- Total employment was up 0.7 percent, with 3,636 jobs gained. The average unemployment rate for the border in January 2009 was 7.7 percent.
- Total building permits issued fell 19.1 percent.
- Total building permit values decreased 29.1 percent.
- Power connections in service for residential were up 0.9 percent, commercial were up 0.2 percent and industrial were down 1.5 percent.
- Air passenger arrivals were down 15.2 percent, and departures were down 13.9 percent.
- Total cargo for the Port of Brownsville increased 3.8 percent.
- Inbound cargo for the Port of Corpus Christi went down 8.0 percent, and outbound cargo went down 3.8 percent.

January 2009 Year-to-Date (In Billions of U.S.\$)









Pedestrians into Texas All Cited Cities Jan. 2008 vs. Jan. 2009: Up **4.8**%



#### Vehicles into Mexico All Cited Cities Jan. 2008 vs. Jan. 2009: Down **7.4%** (In Millions)





Trucks into Texas All Cited Cities Jan. 2008 vs. Jan. 2009: Down **24.7**% (In Thousands)







Percent of Unemployment All Cited Cities Combined Jan. 2008 vs. Jan. 2009: Up **43.1**% (In Percent)







(Value of Permits In Millions of U.S.\$): Down 29.1%







Port of Corpus Christi (Cargo in U.S. Tons)





In Chart 3, the trend line for total trade is shown. Evident is the upward trend for the most part of the first three quarters of 2008 and the dramatic dip which are evident in Charts 1 and 2.

Even though U.S exports had averaged double-digit growth for the most part of 2008, and U.S. imports had been robust throughout most of that year. The fact remains that the drop in U.S. imports in the 4th quarter and U.S. exports did not sustain its double-digit increases in the last two months. This in turn allowed the U.S. to register a small increase over the 2007.

The year 2009 may not turn out to be a record setting year, but it may reach trade levels of 2005 which was right after the recession of 2002-2004. By comparing figures, January 2005 total trade figure registered total trade with Mexico at \$21.3 billion while the January 2009 figure was \$22.3 billion. If 2009 trade follows the that of 2005, the total trade for the whole year of 2009 should be in the vicinity of

\$91.2 billion. This is provided that what fuels U.S.-Mexico trade gets back on track.

If the U.S. comes out of the recession within the year as stated, trade could

bounce back at the rate of 2005. In the next *Border Business Indicators*, these trade trends will be reviewed and discussed.
