

## WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 17 GEORGE RANCH HISTORICAL PARK AND MUSEUM TOUR AND LUNCHEON Depart 8:30am - Return 4:30pm (EST)

We'll travel to Richmond, Texas to capture the sights, sounds, and colors of 100 years of Texas history at the George Ranch Historical Park. We'll experience Victorian life in the 1890's with the elegantly furnished Victorian mansion, complete with outbuildings, carriage house, greenhouse and grape arbor, blacksmith's shop, cowboy quarters, and more. 
