One year ago we were looking forward to many changes. I had mentioned that House Bill 2436 would expand the scope of our state asbestos law to include commercial buildings. It didn't happen. The legislature ran out of time and we are looking to try a run at it next year. I had also spoken of our new requirements for our Asbestos Advisory Committee. We received nominees and now have a committee. In fact by the time you read this, the new committee will have met and discussed proposed changes to the rule. Many issues have arisen since the rule was amended in September 1994 and are being addressed in these proposed changes. Look for this proposal to be published in the June or July Texas Register. Although the committee is meeting to discuss this issue and others, the committee still lacks the general public members. We received some nominations, but not enough. If you know of someone who is not licensed, but has an interest in quality of services and health aspects of the asbestos industry, please let them know that we need them as representatives of the public.

We have been issuing many Notices of Violation because of late or incorrect demolition or renovation notifications. Also, many of the required fees for notifications have not been paid. Soon, NOV's will be issued on those late payees. Although it may not seem like paperwork should affect the health of the workers or public citizens

surrounding these asbestos abatement projects, it does. For our programs to operate efficiently, we cannot waste resources hunting for the projects. This is why we need proper and timely notifications. We also are a fee-funded program, like many in Texas, and require fees in order to perform our duty of insuring that the Texas asbestos industry is one that provides asbestos abatement services that people can trust with their health. Fees are also used to put the burden on the affected industry and avoid a state income tax. So it's a really good deal when you think about it. Therefore, everyone involved must adhere to the requirements to notify promptly and pay the fees or it is only logical to expect retribution. We do occasionally run into some problems with billing because of the address listed on the notification and we have been working those problems as they occur and find ways to permanently fix those problems. All suggestions are appreciated.

We would also like to welcome aboard our new Licensing Program Administrator, Jim Vass, P.E. He will be leading our licensing and training sections and lending a fresh approach to meeting our customer needs.

ENFORCEMENT PROGRAM

CONSULTANTS

Education:

There has been a rumor floating around that the Texas Department of Health (TDH) was going to relax the

education requirements for individual consultants **This is not true.** The requirements as listed in the rules will continue to be in effect.

Responsibilities: Some consultants have complained that they can't force abatement contractors to follow their specifications. This is handled in two ways. First, the consultant is supposed to be the official representative of the building owner, if allowed by the contract between the building owner and the consultant. If the abatement contractor is not following the specifications and the applicable regulations, then they don't get paid if they violate the terms of the contract. This needs to be a part of the specifications. Second, if the contractor is not following the specifications, they are performing consulting work and may face the issuance of a Notice of Violation (NOV) for \$10,000 for doing consulting work without a license or accreditation, and in violation of the conflict of interest provision for public buildings. Consultants are also required to design the containment and other engineering controls (including negative air). This means the consultant shall produce drawings which show the work to be performed and where it is to be performed. The consultant is also the only one who may declare a project clear and complete and authorize the tearing down of the containment.

We consistently are finding plans and specifications not signed by the consultant. Both are required by §295.47(a)(1) of the Texas Asbestos Health Protection Rules (TAHPR). This is being enforced and will receive additional attention. Consultants are the primary persons who can ensure abatement projects are properly performed and that the public health is protected. You have a tremendous responsibility to fulfill.

Future Consideration: One proposal we've received is to require a licensed asbestos consultant to obtain a stamp (a seal similar to what is used by Professional Engineers and other professions) and that the specifications which are required to be signed by the consultant, also are stamped with the seal. Some consultants already do this. It is another way to ensure the

rules requirements have been fulfilled and that the consultants approved specifications are in use. The building owner/operator is the person who should have the one original copy with the original signature and stamp. Your comments on the idea for the stamp may be sent anytime before we propose a rule change so that we take into account the thoughts of the regulated community.

Phone Consultation: We are experiencing a dramatic rise in phone calls asking for our policy or interpretation of the rules. It is very difficult for us in the central office to answer all your calls in a quick and responsive manner. The regional inspectors and industrial hygienists are aware of the policies and interpretations. While we in Austin can only provide a general answer, the regional people can get more specific in most cases because they are either more familiar with your situation or they can visit to be better able to provide an answer. They have always been good about calling the central office whenever they have something new or there is a question in their mind about how to rule on the specific question. TDH employees cannot act as a consultant for how to perform a specific job. They can, however, tell you if you will be in compliance with the law. A licensed consultant is trained and licensed to make those professional judgements which must be made to ensure the public health.

Personnel: Ms. Elizabeth Grimsley has joined the enforcement section as of March 1, 1996. She has several years experience working in the industry in other states and graduate work in environmental health. Ms Grimsley will be reviewing the reports from the regional inspectors and preparing the NOV's. She will also be performing specialized inspections with other members of the enforcement and licensing programs and regional inspectors.

NOTIFICATION AND INFORMATION SECTION

NEW POLICY FOR THE NOTIFICATION OF PHASED PROJECTS

The phasing of projects is a reality that exists in all areas of the construction industry, including renovations and the abatement of asbestos-containing materials. The endeavors made by building owners, consultants and contractors to notify about these projects have been confusing and haphazard. The improper notifications have resulted in wasted inspection efforts, noncompliance with the notification provisions and a notification fee invoicing fiasco. Due to all of the notification problems, the Asbestos Programs Branch has determined that there is a need to issue some guidance on the notification of phased projects.

A copy of the new policy has been enclosed with this bulletin. There are a few aspects of the policy that need to be emphasized and explained. The first qualification of a phased project is that all of the abatement must be performed by the same contractor. This should not be a problem because of the contract arrangements that are made between the owner and a contractor. A new contractor would have to sign and be a party to a new contract, so, by policy, it is a new project and would require a separate notification. This will prevent all of the duplicate notifications that have been submitted and all of the scheduling problems, around which the Department's inspectors have been trying to perform inspections.

A key part of this new policy is the verbal communication that is required to be made with the Department's inspector. At no time should an inspector attempt to perform an inspection during a time when abatement work is not being done. To ensure that an inspector will not attempt a futile inspection, it will be the responsibility of the building owner or contractor to call the inspector. It is a waste of time and money for the inspector and the State to attempt to perform an inspection on an inactive abatement project.

The purpose of this policy is to allow some flexibility to the rules. The policy is an attempt to assist the regulated community in adapting the notification procedures to meet a special set of circumstances, without making changes to the rules. The Asbestos Programs Branch hopes that the regulated community will follow the guidelines of the policy.

You can get the notification in either WordPerfect 5.1 or WordPerfect for Windows, 6.1. Please specify which format you need and include a self-addressed, stamped return mailer for the diskette. Please allow 1 to 2 weeks for completion.

LICENSING PROGRAM

Personnel: Mr. James Vass, PE, is the new Administrator, Asbestos Licensing Program. He has several years of experience in the oil and gas industry. His expertise will help us evaluate the needs in the industrial and manufacturing operations.

Project Manager License: We are considering renaming this license to Project Monitor. This will better describe the position and remove some of the confusion of terminology as used in the general industry. This licensee is the eyes and ears of the consultant on an abatement project. He or she may keep notes of the activities of the abatement contractor and report findings to the consultant. Only the consultant may make changes to the plans and specifications or interpret what those documents mean. The consultant may appoint the project manager (monitor) to conduct the visual inspection upon completion of the project. This delegation must be in writing. Only the consultant may declare the project to be clear and authorize the demolition of the containment.
