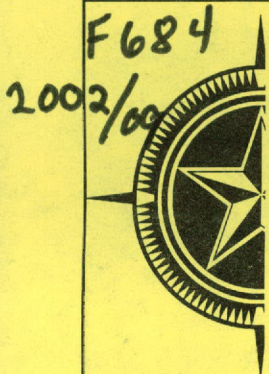

There are 4-5 people handling phone registrations, but you may be on hold for a length of time; DO NOT leave a message and then call back as that will put you at the end of the line in first-come, first-served order of taking calls.

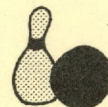

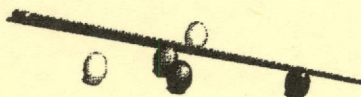

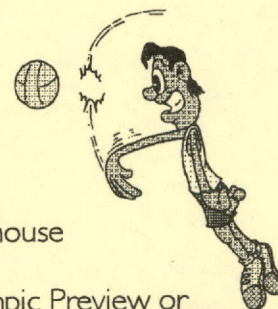
