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#### Note from the Director

Indicators of border business activity for the month of January demonstrated an increase of eight indicators while fourteen indicators decreased. Tourism is not available. In addition, year-to-date (YTD) figures, fifteen indicators finished up and seven ended in a decrease. Tourism is not available. Selected 2001 YTD comparisons to 2000 reported by border cities include the following:

- Southbound pedestrian crossings into Mexico were down 4.0 percent. Laredo fell 4.8 percent, Rio Grande jumped 41.5 percent, McAllen registered a decrease of 6.9 and El Paso rose 1.6 percent.
- Northbound pedestrian crossings into Texas were up 4.9 percent. Laredo gained 1.7 percent. El Paso went up 8.9 percent. Brownsville dropped 2.9
- Southbound vehicle crossings were down 3.3 percent. Brownsville grew by 1.0 percent, and Eagle Pass fell 0.8 percent. El Paso went down 1.9 percent and Pharr decreased 2.9 percent. Laredo gained 0.6 percent.
- Northbound vehicle crossings were down 8.3 percent. Eagle Pass fell 0.3 percent. Del Rio dropped 3.1 percent. Roma decreased 2.2 percent, El Paso went down 5.4 percent, Brownsville declined 26.3 percent and Pharr increased 4.4 percent.
- Southbound truck crossings into Mexico were up 4.3 percent. Eagle Pass went down 8.4 percent. Pharr increased 8.9 percent, and Laredo rose 8.0 percent. Del Rio was down 2.8 percent. Progreso gained 34.2 and Rio Grande grew 35.2 percent.
- Northbound truck crossings into Texas went up 0.1 percent, Pharr gained 5.9 percent and Eagle Pass posted a 7.5 percent increase. Brownsville decreased 16.7 percent, Laredo rose 0.5 percent, Del Rio marked a drop of 1.0 percent. Rio Grande had a gain of 61.7 percent.
- Southbound shipments by rail were up 9.3 percent.
- Northbound shipments by rail were up 10.2 percent.
- Revenues collected by U.S. Customs went up by 12.3 percent.
- Revenues collected by U.S. Bridge operators were up 5.4 percent.
- Total building permits issued were up 15.5 percent. Laredo fell 2.3 percent, Eagle Pass gained 2.6 percent, while McAllen-Hidalgo rose 13.2 percent, and Brownsville registered an increase of 4.9 percent. Del Rio gained 17.0 percent. El Paso showed a 45.3 percent increase.
- Total building permit values increased 32.4 percent. Laredo decreased 0.03 percent, and Brownsville fell 25.4 percent. Del Rio was down 23.9 percent. McAllen increased 58.2 percent. El Paso was up 105.1 percent.
- Total employment was up 2.1 percent, with 8,984 jobs gained. The average unemployment rate in January 2001 was 8.3 percent for the border.

## Texas Fairs Very Well Against Its U.S.-Mexico Border Counterparts

In the February issue of the *Border Business Indicators*, the closing 2000 trade figures between the United States and Mexico were delineated. As in previous years, the U.S.-Mexico border states have handled the bulk of the trade. In 2000, these states' border ports processed \$204.333 billion or 82.5 percent of the \$247.632 billion of the total dollar trade value. (See Table 1 & 2) *Note: Figures may not match February's article due to rounding.* 

In both Exports and Imports, Texas ran away with the largest share of the dollar amount crossing its border ports. Second were those of California with Arizona's a distant third and New Mexico at the far end (See Table 2). All the border states experienced an increase in the total dollar value of goods processed in 2000.

Chart 1 demonstrates the percent share of the total U.S.-Mexico trade which transited at the respective states' border ports. The 2000 shares are almost identical to 1999 with slight drops in Texas' and California's.

With the current down turn in the stock market and the slowing of the U.S. economy, it will be of much interest to see the initial figures for U.S.-Mexico trade. Our next issue will focus on the initial months of 2001.





Southbound pedestrian crossings into Mexico for January were down 12.5 percent. Rio Grande increased 68.5 percent, Brownsville fell 24.4 percent, Eagle Pass lost 33.7 percent, El Paso decreased 33.5 percent, and Laredo dropped 25.1 percent. Progreso jumped 29.9 percent, and McAllen-Hidalgo was down 24.8 percent. YTD southbound pedestrian crossings into Mexico fell 4.0 percent. El Paso's southbound pedestrian crossings, which made up 26.1 percent of all crossings, increased 1.6 percent YTD. Laredo, accounting for 20.3 percent of total crossings, decreased 4.8 percent YTD. Brownsville, with a 12.7 percent share, decreased 2.7 percent YTD. Progreso, with 9.4 percent share, declined 7.0 percent.

#### % Share Pedestrians for January 2001





Progreso increased 29.4 percent, Brownsville was down 23.9 percent, El Paso decreased 30.7 percent, and Laredo fell 26.1 percent. YTD northbound pedestrian crossings into Texas were up 4.9 percent. El Paso, accounting for 35.2 percent of northbound crossings, was up 8.9 percent YTD. Laredo, with 24.8 percent of all northbound crossings, was up 1.7 percent YTD. Brownsville, with 15.6 percent of all northbound pedestrian crossings, decreased 2.9 percent in crossings YTD.

Southbound vehicle bridge crossings into Mexico were down 11.8 percent in January from December's figures. Eagle Pass was down 18.9 percent, Del Rio fell 16.6 percent, Rio Grande dropped 17.5 percent, and McAllen-Hidalgo declined 9.1 percent, and Brownsville went down 8.0 percent. Harlingen decreased 18.3 percent, and Laredo lost 14.2 percent. YTD southbound vehicle bridge crossings decreased 3.3 percent. Laredo, with 22.7 percent of all

southbound traffic, was up 0.6 percent YTD. Brownsville, with 20.7 percent of all southbound vehicle bridge crossings, had a 1.0 percent increase YTD. El Paso, accounting for 15.1 percent of all southbound vehicle crossings, fell 1.9 percent YTD. McAllen-Hidalgo, with 16.2 percent of all southbound vehicle crossings, experienced a 3.0 percent increase YTD.

Southbound truck crossings into Mexico were down 7.4 percent in January. Harlingen rose 7.5 percent, Del Rio increased 19.1 percent, and Pharr went up 16.3 percent. Rio Grande gained 32.0 percent. Laredo jumped 3.8 percent and Brownsville increased 11.4 percent. YTD southbound truck crossings were up 4.3 percent. Laredo, with 63.5 percent of all southbound crossings,

experienced a 8.0 percent increase YTD. Brownsville, with a 9.8 percent of all southbound crossings, had a 5.5 percent decrease YTD. Pharr, with 11.7 percent, registered an increase of 8.9 percent YTD. Eagle Pass, with 4.6 percent of all truck crossings, fell 8.4 percent YTD.



Southbound rail shipments into Mexico decreased 0.1 percent in January compared to December. Brownsville increased 51.8 percent, while Laredo fell 8.8 percent. Eagle Pass rose 3.0 percent. YTD southbound rail shipments into Mexico from Texas were up 9.3 percent. Laredo which accounted for 59.3 percent of all southbound rail shipments, was up 6.6 percent YTD. Eagle Pass, accounting for 26.5 percent of all southbound rail shipments, increased 10.9 percent YTD. Brownsville, with 14.2 percent of all southbound rail shipments, showed an increase of 18.4 percent YTD.

#### Export Rail YTD % Change 00-01





Northbound rail shipments into Texas decreased 0.9 percent in January. Laredo fell 1.7 percent, Brownsville was down 14.1 percent, and Eagle Pass rose 9.6 percent. YTD total northbound shipments into Texas from Mexico were up 10.2 percent. Laredo, which accounted for 74.6 percent of all northbound rail shipments, were up 14.4 percent YTD. 



## % Unemployed January 00-01







#### Passenger Arrivals % Change YTD 00-01







#### % Share January 2001 Inbound Cargo







YTD figures showed a 60.3 percent increase in Break Bulk tonnage –73.0 percent of total tonnage. Grain –1.3 percent of total tonnage– had a YTD decrease of 26.4 percent. Petroleum –24.6 percent of total tonnage- rose 6.8 percent. YTD total tonnage was up 39.8 percent.
