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Border Business Indicators

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U.S.-Mexico Trade: 2010 Continues to Point Towards Trade Recovery

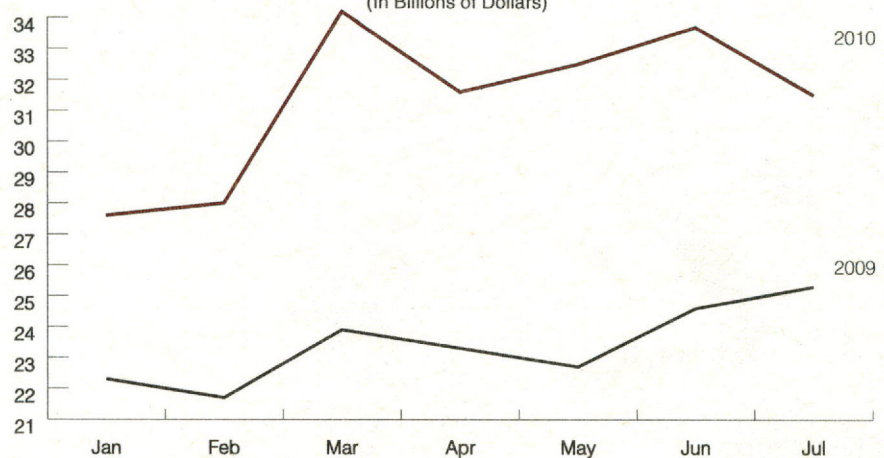
In the March 2010 issue of the *Border Business Indicators (BBI)*, it was stated that with the recession's effects culminating, the 2010 trade picture between the U.S. and Mexico could be much better than in 2009—double-digit growth. U.S.-Mexico trade figures registered gains in the past seven months in both U.S. exports to Mexico and U.S. imports from Mexico. Evident with the increases seen in the last quarter of 2009, the trend in trade growth has continued.

Total trade figures for January through July of 2010 showed this upward bearing. As the monthly percent changes continued in the positive for 2010, the year-to-date (YTD) total trade value marked an increase of 35.3 percent—\$219.1 billion—as opposed to \$163.8 billion in 2009 (See Chart 1). With 2009 in the past, the 2010 trade figures have indicated a rebound to levels prior to the recession and 2009. Even with the weakest quarter on record, Quarter 4, the 2008 final trade figures were the last highest trade figures recorded in the history of the trading partners. The July 2010 YTD trade figures marked a continual progression in the positive that may eclipse those of 2008 by the end of the year—overcoming the losses in 2009.

In Chart 2, the monthly dollar figures for U.S. export to Mexico are presented for 2009 and 2010. As noted, the recorded 2010 monthly dollar values were well above those in 2009. The increases ranged from 17.3 percent to 41.0 percent—the highest recorded for the month of March. The overall increase in export trade for 2010 YTD was 31.5 percent (\$90.3 billion) above that of 2009 (\$69.9 billion).

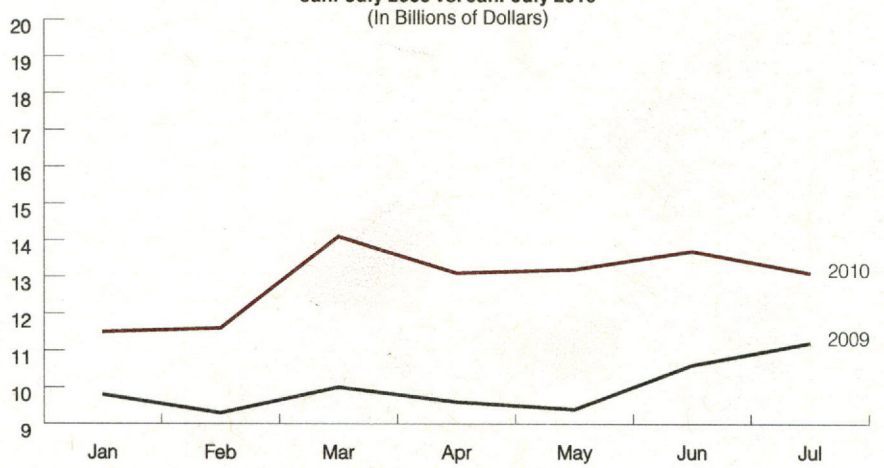
The trade figures for U.S. imports from Mexico fared even better. As with the

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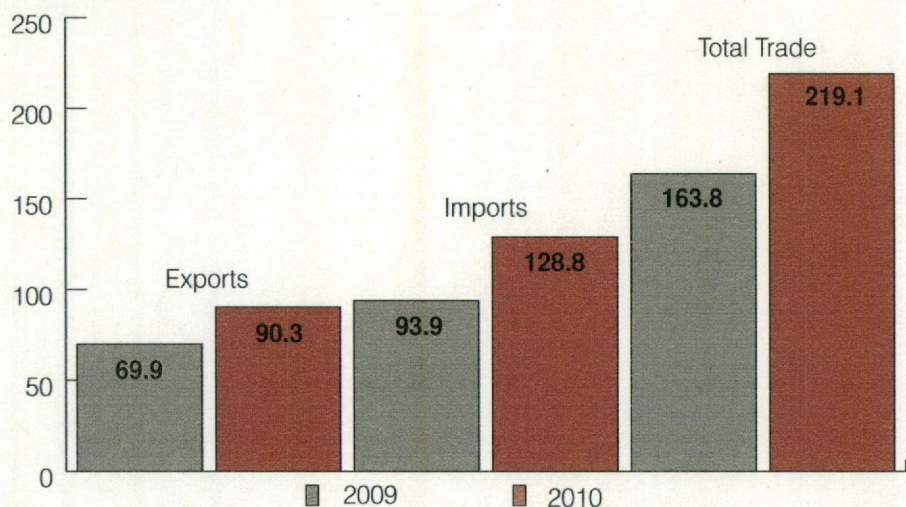
Note from the Director

Indicators of border business activity that were reported for July 2010 year-to-date (YTD) demonstrated twelve indicators increased and nine decreased. 2010 YTD comparisons to 2009 reported for the border are listed below:

- Pedestrian bridge crossings into Mexico were down 2.7 percent.
- Pedestrian bridge crossings into Texas were up 7.1 percent.
- Vehicle bridge crossings into Mexico fell 8.9 percent.
- Vehicle bridge crossings into Texas fell 14.1 percent.
- Truck bridge crossings into Mexico gained 14.2 percent.
- Truck bridge crossings into Texas gained 4.4 percent.
- Rail car bridge crossings into Mexico went up 15.4 percent.
- Rail car bridge crossings into Texas went up 14.3 percent.
- Revenues data collected by U.S. Customs was not available at press time.
- Revenues collected by U.S. bridge operators registered a gain of 0.9 percent.
- Tourist visas issued for entry into Mexico were down 1.8 percent.
- Total employment was up 1.6 percent, with 8,248 jobs gained. The average unemployment rate for the border in July 2010 was 9.5 percent.
- Total building permits issued rose 32.5 percent.
- Total building permit values increased 12.1 percent.
- Power connections in service for residential were up 1.2 percent, commercial were down 3.6 percent and industrial were down 0.2 percent.
- Air passenger arrivals were down 3.0 percent, and departures were down 2.7 percent.
- Total cargo for the Port of Brownsville decreased 7.7 percent.
- Inbound cargo for the Port of Corpus Christi went up 4.1 percent, and outbound cargo went up 7.8 percent.

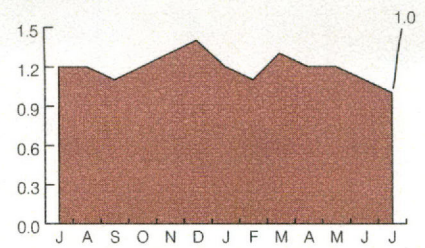

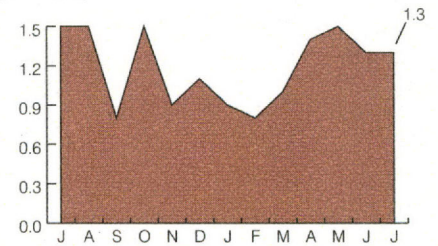

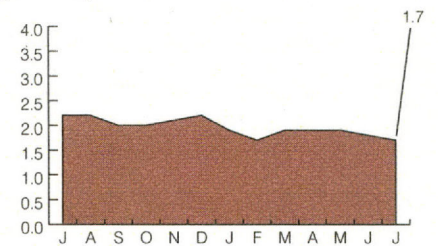

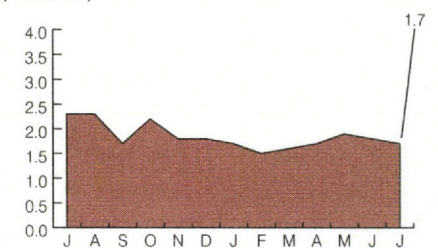

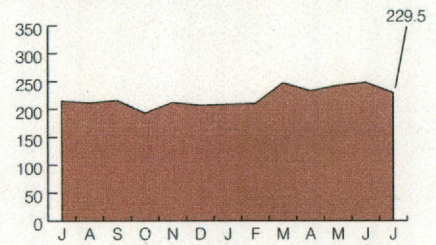

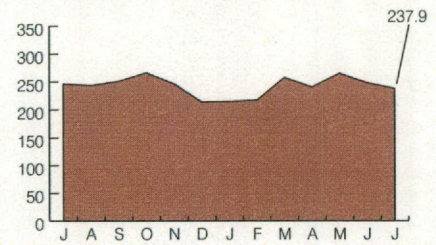

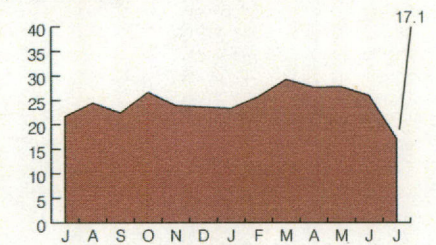

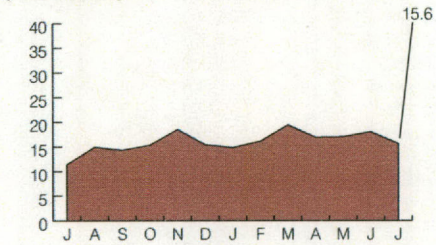

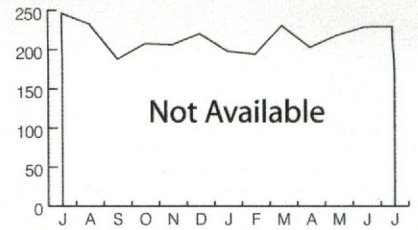

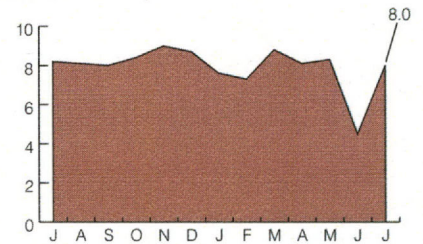

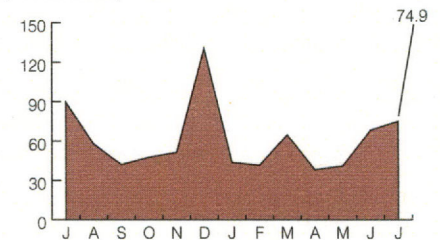

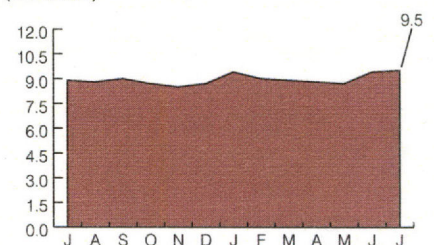

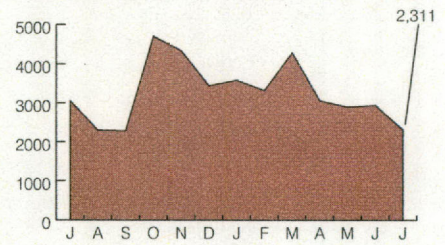
Percent of Unemployment All Cited Cities Combined

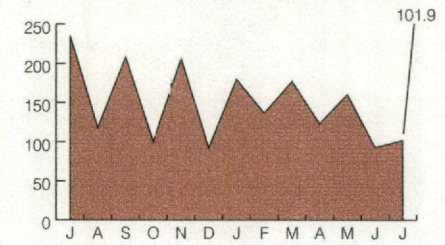

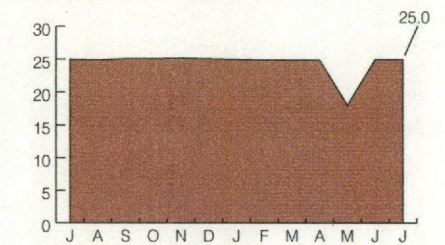

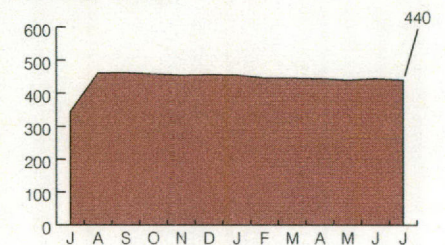

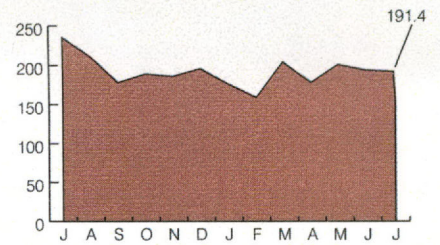

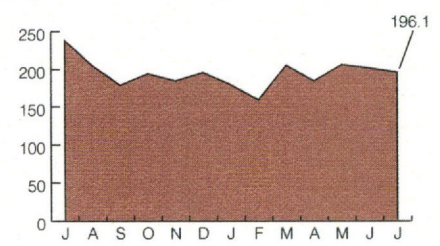

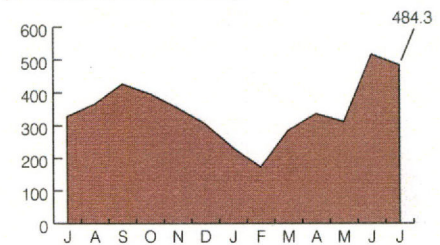

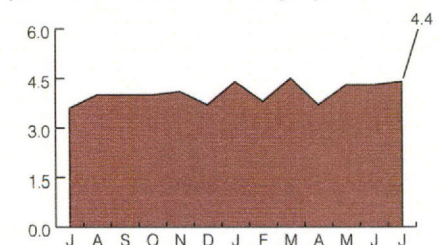

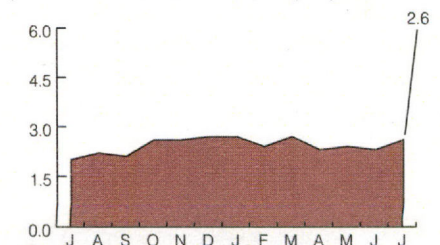

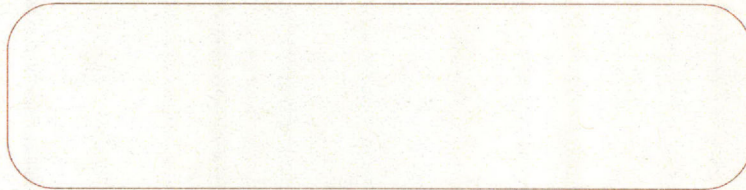

export merchandise, import merchandise dollar value was above in comparison to last year's figure. These dollar values for the period January to July 2010 are exhibited. (See Chart 3) As with the export figures, the U.S. imports from Mexico experienced double-digit gains. Unlike the export figures, imports did record higher rates of positive change. The range of growth for imports were from 28.8 percent to 45.1 percent—May 2010. The YTD dollar value for imports in this period was \$128.8 billion compared with \$93.9 billion for the same period in 2009, a 38.1 percent increase.

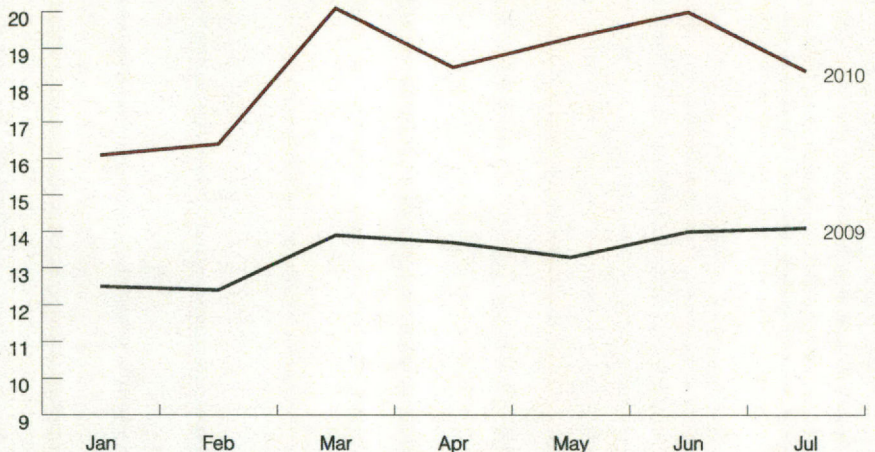
The balance of trade between the trading partners continued with the U.S. in deficit with Mexico. In 2010 YTD, the trade deficit was \$38.4 billion. The deficit for the same period last year was \$24.1 billion, an increase of 59.3 percent. This was due to the strong showing of U.S. exports to Mexico.

If the trend in trade continues at the current pace, 2010 figures will surpass

2009, but they may surpass that of 2008. The only thing in the way is another recess-

sion. In future *BBIs*, these activities will be monitored.—*B. Garcia*
