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Note from the Director

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Indicators of border business activity for the month of June demonstrated a significant increase of sixteen indicators over eight indicators that decreased. In addition, for the year-to-date (YTD) figures, ten indicators were up and two were down. Selected YTD comparisons to 1998 reported by border cities include the following:

- Southbound pedestrian crossings into Mexico were down 2.9 percent. Harlingen dropped 23.8 percent, Del Rio fell 11.5 percent, Brownsville was off 6.8 percent and Rio Grande declined 4.1 percent.
- Northbound pedestrian crossings into Texas were up 1.0 percent. Roma increased 29.1 percent, Progreso rose 12.6 percent, while Laredo jumped 8.3 percent and Eagle Pass gained 5.5 percent.
- Southbound vehicle crossings were up 5.7 percent. Roma rose 22.3 percent, Harlingen increased 21.5 percent, Pharr and Progreso gained 15.6 percent, and McAllen-Hidalgo jumped 13.7 percent.
- Northbound vehicle bridge crossings into Texas were up 9.1 percent. Harlingen jumped 24.5 percent, McAllen-Hidalgo increased 23.0 percent, Progreso gained 16.0 percent and Presidio posted an increase of 15.9 percent YTD.
- Southbound truck shipments into Mexico were up 4.7 percent. Progreso increased 48.0 percent, Roma rose 39.7 percent and Eagle Pass was up 35.7 percent.
- Northbound truck shipments into Texas were up 11.8 percent with Roma increaseing 25.3 percent, Pharr gained 21.4 percent and Eagle Pass posted a 19.2 percent increase YTD.
- Southbound shipments by rail were up 8.6 percent.
- Northbound shipments by rail were up 19.8 percent.
- Revenues collected by U.S. Customs were down slightly by 0.5 percent YTD.
- Revenues collected by U.S. Bridge operators were up 13.1 percent.
- Building permits issued were up 8.8 percent. Laredo rose 23.9 percent, Brownsville gained 12.8 percent, McAllen-Hidalgo was up 7.2 percent, while Eagle Pass declined 2.1 percent.
- Building permit values were up with a YTD increase of 30.5 percent. Harlingen increased 115.0 percent, McAllen was up 75.6 percent, El Paso rose 25.3 percent and Laredo reported a 24.2 percent increase.
- Total employment was up with 9,225 jobs lost YTD. The average unemployment rate in June 1999 was 10.6 percent for the border.



Southbound pedestrian crossings into Mexico for June were down 8.9 percent compared to May. Eagle Pass declined 17.7 percent, Roma fell 15.4 percent, McAllen-Hidalgo was down 15.2 percent and Progreso dropped 9.6 percent, El Paso was off 7.9 percent, and Laredo fell 7.6 percent. Del Rio, however, increased 24.4 percent. YTD, total southbound pedestrian crossings into Mexico were up 2.9 percent. El Paso southbound pedestrian crossings, which made up 34.7 percent of all crossings in June, increased 11.9 percent. Laredo, accounting for 27.8 percent of total crossings, was up 3.7 percent and Brownsville, with an 18.5 percent share YTD, was down 6.8 percent.

% Share Pedestrians for June 1999





YTD total northbound pedestrian crossings into Texas were up 1.0 percent. El Paso, accounting for 41.3 percent of the northbound crossings, was up 1.7 percent YTD. Laredo, with a 25.3 percent of all northbound crossings, was up 8.3 percent and Brownsville, with 15.5 percent of all northbound pedestrian crossings, down 13.9 percent in crossings YTD.



Export Rail YTD % Change 98-99







Total U.S. Customs revenues, for June, for the former District of Laredo, increased 37.9 percent from May's figures. Progreso was up 113.5 percent, McAllen-Hidalgo increased 49.4 percent, Eagle Pass rose 41.8 percent, Laredo gained 38.8 percent, Del Rio increased 24.4 percent, and Brownsville grew 15.0 percent. Rio Grande fell 3.9 percent. YTD revenue figures were down 0.5

percent compared to May 1998. Laredo, accounting for 63.8 percent of the former district's revenue in June was up 2.5 percent YTD. McAllen-Hidalgo, with 14.0 percent of total revenues, was down 20.5 percent YTD. Eagle Pass, accounting for 11.8 percent of all revenues, was up 25.5 percent YTD. Brownsville, with 8.6 percent of total revenues in June declined 5.4 percent YTD.





% Share Revenues June 1999





Tourist Visas YTD June 98-99







Residential Phones % Change June 98-99









Passenger Arrivals % Change YTD 98-99







% Share June 1999 Inbound Cargo




