U.S.-Mexico Trade: Exports and Imports Double-Digit Increases in Quarter 1 2006

As previously mentioned in the March 2006 issue of the *Border Business Indicators*, U.S. and Mexico total trade registered an all-time high of \$290.2 billion in 2005—the highest figure to date in the trading history of the trading partners. Quarter 1 2006 figures increased in both U.S. exports to Mexico and U.S. imports from Mexico. But unlike last year, the increases in Q1 2006 were in the double-digits—at this pace 2006 trade figures will surpass those of 2005 (See Table 1).

Both U.S. exports to Mexico and U.S. imports from Mexico, in 2006, have had healthy increases over the same period in 2005. This year's exports and imports were up, 16.8 percent and 22.1 percent respectively. In turn, the dollar value of total trade was 19.9 percent for 2006.

U.S. exports showed an increase, but the U.S. still registered a trade deficit with Mexico (\$14.8 billion) for Q1 2006. This deficit was higher compared with Q1 2005 (\$10.9 billion).

The trade of goods between the two countries has for the most part been at the U.S.-Mexico border. The percentage of the dollar value of goods in trade between them has been historically in the 80s. First quarter figures for 2006 set that percentage at 79.4 percent. The border continued to be the main channel between the trading partners as exhibited in Table 2.

Table 3 provides a detailed look at the total dollar value of trade activity, U.S. exports plus U.S. imports, at the individual border ports of entry on the U.S.-Mexico border for Quarter 1 2006. A comparison with the same period in 2005 is also provided. As shown, the Port of Laredo registered the highest total of the border ports (\$24.6 billion) followed by El Paso (\$11.7 billion).

On the back page, Tables 4 and 5 provide the dollar value of U.S. exports to Mexico and U.S. imports from Mexico for the same time periods.

In future issues of the *Border Business Indicators*, these trends in trade activity will be reviewed and presented.

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
Note from the Director

Indicators of border business activity for March 2006 year-to-date (YTD) demonstrated thirteen indicators increased and nine decreased. 2006 YTD comparisons to 2005 reported for the border are listed below:

- Pedestrian bridge crossings into Mexico were up 0.8 percent.
- Pedestrian bridge crossings into Texas were up 3.4 percent.
- Vehicle bridge crossings into Mexico fell 1.8 percent.
- Vehicle bridge crossings into Texas fell 2.6 percent.
- Truck bridge crossings into Mexico gained 12.0 percent.
- Truck bridge crossings into Texas gained 8.5 percent.
- Rail car bridge crossings into Mexico went down 1.9 percent.
- Rail car bridge crossings into Texas went up 21.8 percent.
- Revenues collected by U.S. Customs decreased 4.4 percent.
- Revenues collected by U.S. bridge operators registered a gain of 11.8 percent.
- Tourist visas issued for entry into Mexico were down 4.6 percent.
- Total employment was up 3.2 percent, with 15,233 jobs gained. The average unemployment rate for the border in March 2006 was 5.9 percent.
- Total building permits issued rose 14.8 percent.
- Total building permit values decreased 1.9 percent.
- Power connections in service for residential were up 2.7 percent, commercial were up 2.6 percent and industrial were down 1.1 percent.
- Air passenger arrivals were down 0.3 percent, and departures were up 0.1 percent.
- Total cargo for the Port of Brownsville increased 31.9 percent.
- Inbound cargo for the Port of Corpus Christi went up 4.8 percent, and outbound cargo went down 8.5 percent.

March 2006 Year-to-Date (In Billions of U.S.\$)










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Vehicle Bridge Crossings from Mexico to Texas

Rail Cars into Mexico All Cited Cities Mar. 2005 vs. Mar. 2006: Down **0.6%** (In Thousands)



Customs Revenues for the District of Laredo Mar. 2005 vs. Mar. 2006: Down 22.8% (In Millions of U.S.\$)





Bridge Revenues All Cited Cities Mar. 2005 vs. Mar. 2006: Up 11.2% (In Millions of U.S.\$)





(Departures - In Thousands): Down 3.0%






