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# U.S.-Mexico Trade: Activity at the Major U.S.-Mexico Border Ports

U.S.-Mexico border ports processed \$93.4 billion or 77.8 percent of the total trade dollar value of U.S.-Mexico merchandise (\$120.1 billion) crossing the border for the period January-April 2008. The percent share was down compared to 81.4 percent for the same period last year. The list below shows the top three types of merchandise —SITC 2-Digit—traversing at the nine major U.S.-Mexico border ports. Each port handled over \$1 billion in merchandise (both U.S. exports and imports) from January to April 2008. —B. Garcia

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


# Note from the Director

Indicators of border business activity that were reported for April 2008 year-to-date (YTD) demonstrated ten indicators increased and twelve decreased. 2008 YTD comparisons to 2007 reported for the border are listed below:

- · Pedestrian bridge crossings into Mexico were up 1.9 percent.
- · Pedestrian bridge crossings into Texas were down 4.3 percent.
- Vehicle bridge crossings into Mexico fell 4.5 percent.
- · Vehicle bridge crossings into Texas fell 15.3 percent.
- · Truck bridge crossings into Mexico gained 1.6 percent.
- Truck bridge crossings into Texas gained 3.4 percent.
- Rail car bridge crossings into Mexico went up 0.9 percent.
- Rail car bridge crossings into Texas went down 7.6 percent.
- Revenues collected by U.S. Customs decreased 7.0 percent.
- Revenues collected by U.S. bridge operators registered a gain of 11.9 percent.
- Tourist visas issued for entry into Mexico were down 1.6 percent.
- Total employment was up 1.3 percent, with 6,210 jobs gained. The average unemployment rate for the border in April 2008 was 4.7 percent.
- Total building permits issued rose 1.2 percent.
- Total building permit values decreased 50.8 percent.
- Power connections in service for residential were up 2.2 percent, commercial were up 1.5 percent and industrial were down 3.5 percent.
- Air passenger arrivals were down 4.2 percent, and departures were down 3.3 percent.
- Total cargo for the Port of Brownsville increased 16.4 percent.
- Inbound cargo for the Port of Corpus Christi went down 3.1 percent, and outbound cargo went down 13.1 percent.

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








Pedestrians into Texas All Cited Cities Apr. 2007 vs. Apr. 2008: Down 10.6% (In Millions)




Trucks into Mexico All Cited Cities Apr. 2007 vs. Apr. 2008: Up **13.0%** (In Thousands)









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


Air Passenger Activity All Cited Cities






Port of Brownsville Total Cargo Apr. 2007 vs. Apr. 2008: Up 6 9% (In Thousands of Metric Tons)
