Kerrville, Texas, Mon. 18 1899 [either September or December]

Dear Grandfather,

Didn't you receive my other letter? I wrote to you about two weeks ago but had not received any answer yet. General James Longstreet and his wife were over here and went to Fredericksburg last Sunday. I suppose you saw them there. It is seems funny to be able to speak to one of the leading generals at the battle of Gettysburg when so many were killed there. I am staying up at the hotel now and I help do the calling in the

morning. I get up at 5 o'clock every morning. We will take up Latin at the 1st of next term. We have had lost of bad weather here lately. Mr. Bert Parsons just now told me he was coming over to Fredericksburg next Friday if it is not a bad day and he asked me to go with him and I told him I would.

We are all well here and I hope you are over there.

I close now giving my best regards to Aunt Tony, Little Karl and the rest.
