How To Use the Texas Register

Texas Register

The Texas Register (ISN 0362-4781) is published twice a week at least 100 times a year. Issues will be published on every Tuesday and Friday in 1983 with the exception of January 25, March 8, April 26, and November 29, by the Office of the Secretary of State, 201 East 14th Street, P.O. Box 13824, Austin, Texas 78711-3824, (512) 475-7886.

Material in the Texas Register is the property of the State of Texas. However, it may be copied, reproduced, or republished by any person for any purpose whatsoever without permission of the Texas Register director, provided no such republication shall bear the legend Texas Register or "Official" without the written permission of the director. The Register is published under Texas Civil Statutes, Article 6252-13a. Second class postage is paid at Austin, Texas, and additional entry offices.

Information Available: The nine sections of the *Register* represent various facets of state government. Documents contained within them include:

Governor – appointments, executive orders, and proclamations

Secretary of State – summaries of opinions based on election laws

Attorney General—summaries of requests for opinions, opinions, and open records decisions

Emergency Rules – rules adopted by state agencies on an emergency basis

Proposed Rules - rules proposed for adoption

Withdrawn Rules – rules withdrawn by state agencies from consideration for adoption, or automatically withdrawn by the Texas Register six months after proposal publication date

Adopted Rules -- rules adopted following a 30-day public comment period

Open Meetings - notices of open meetings

In Addition—miscellaneous information required to be published by statute or provided as a public service

Specific explanations on the contents of each section can be found on the beginning page of the section. The division also publishes monthly, quarterly, and annual indexes to aid in researching material published.

How To Cite: Material published in the *Texas Register* is referenced by citing the volume in which a document appears, the words "TexReg," and the beginning page number on which that document was published. For example, a document

published on page 2402 of Volume 6 (1981) is cited as follows: 6 TexReg 2402.

In order that readers may cite material more easily, page numbers are now written as citations. Example: page 2 in the lower left-hand corner of this page is written: "8 TexReg 2 issue date," while on the opposite page, in the lower right-hand corner, page 3 is written "issue date 8 TexReg 3"

How To Research: The public is invited to research rules and information of interest between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. weekdays at the *Texas Register* office, 503E Sam Houston Building, Austin. Material can be found by using *Register* indexes, the *Texas Administrative Code* (explained below), rule number, or TRD number.

Texas Administrative Code

The Texas Administrative Code (TAC) is the approved, collected volumes of Texas administrative rules currently being published by Shepard's/McGraw-Hill, in cooperation with this office.

How To Cite: Under the TAC scheme, each agency rule is designated by a TAC number. For example, in the citation 1 TAC §27.15:

1 indicates the title under which the agency appears in the *Texas Administrative Code* (a listing of all the titles appears below);

TAC stands for the Texas Administrative Code;

\$27.15 is the section number of the rule (27 indicates that the rule is under Chapter 27 of Title 1; 15 represents the individual rule within the chapter).

Proposed Rules

Before an agency may permanently adopt a new or amended rule, or repeal an existing rule, a proposal detailing the action must be published in the *Register* at least 30 days before any action may be taken. The 30-day time period gives interested persons an opportunity to review and make oral or written comments on the rule. A public hearing on the proposal may also be granted if such a procedure is requested by a governmental subdivision or agency, or by an association consisting of at least 25 members.

The proposal, as published in the *Register*, must include a brief explanation of the proposed action; a fiscal statement indicating effect on state or local government; a statement explaining anticipated public benefits and possible economic costs to individuals required to comply with the rule; a request for public comments; a statement of statutory authority under which the proposed rule is to be adopted (and the agency's interpretation of the statutory authority); the text of the proposed action; and a certification statement. The certification information, which includes legal authority, the proposed date of adoption or the earliest possible date that the agency may file notice to adopt the proposal, and a telephone number to call for further information, follows each submission.

TITLE 34. PUBLIC FINANCE Part I. Comptroller of Public Accounts

Chapter 3. Tax Administration Subchapter N. Ad Valorem Tax Division 34 TAC §§3.231-3.256

(Editor's note: The text of the following rules being proposed for repeal will not be published. The rules may be examined in the office of the Comptroller of Public Accounts, LBJ Building, Room 708, 111 East 17th Street, or in the Texas Register office, 503£ Sam Houston Building, Austin.)

The Comptroller of Public Accounts proposes the repeal of §§3.231-3.256, relating to ad valorem taxes. The state ad valorem tax has been repealed by constitutional amendment. The amendment was approved by the voters of Texas on November 2, 1982. For that reason, the Comptroller of Public Accounts no longer has any responsibility for ad valorem taxes of any kind, and these sections are superfluous.

Billy Hamilton, director of revenue estimating, has determined that for the first five-year period the repeals will be in effect there will be no fiscal implications to state or local government as a result of the repeals. There is no anticipated economic cost or benefit to individuals as a result of the repeals.

Open Meetings

Agencies with statewide jurisdiction must give at least seven days notice before an impending meeting. Institutions of higher education or political subdivisions covering all or part of four or more counties (regional agencies) must post notice at least 72 hours prior to a scheduled meeting time. Although some notices may be received too late for publication before the meeting is held, all those filed are published in the *Register*. Notices concerning state agencies, colleges, and universities must contain the date, time, and location of the meeting, and an agenda or agenda summary. Published notices concerning county agencies include only the date, time, and location of the meeting. These notices are published alphabetically under the heading "Regional Agencies" according to the date on which they are filed.

Any of the governmental entities named above must have notice of an emergency meeting, or an emergency revision to an agenda, and the reason for such emergency posted for at least two hours before the meeting is convened. Emergency meeting notices filed by all governmental agencies will be published. However, notices of emergency additions or revisions to a regional agency's agenda will not be published since the original agenda for the agency was not published.

All notices are posted on the bulletin board outside the Office of the Secretary of State on the first floor of the East Wing in the State Capitol. These notices may contain more detailed agendas than space allows to be published in the *Register*.





Wieding, et al., are "persons affected" as defined in Texas Civil Statutes, Article 4590f, §3(r), and, if the finding is affirmative, whether the amendment to Radioactive Materials License 8-1431 was properly issued under TRCR Part 43.



Texas Tech University Consultant Proposal Request

In accordance with the provisions of Texas Civil Statutes, Article 6252-11(c), Texas Tech University is soliciting proposals from qualified consultants to perform a study of the university's reproduction services.

To be considered, the consultant must not represent any vendor or manufacturer of reproduction equipment or service. Also, general management consultants with no demonstrable expertise in the analysis of reproduction services will not be considered.

Proposals must include an outline of activities to be performed and their related time frames, an estimate of time required by university personnel, a quoted fee for performing the study, and an itemized estimate of additional expenses. At least three professional references must also be included in the proposal. The study outline must include the following activities.

Organization and Procedures Evaluation. The consultant must determine the current methods of obtaining reproduction services and must determine buying authorities and organizational responsibilities throughout the university. From this evaluation should come a preliminary report analyzing the current issues and problems and possible courses of action to be investigated during alternative evaluations.

Inventory and Cost Analysis. The consultant will perform an accurate inventory of reproduction equipment on campus. The inventory will include historical volume data, price plans, and current equipment and supplies cost. This analysis must also include all labor and facilities allocated for providing or administering reproduction services.

Data Collection. The consultant will perform an indepth data collection effort of all reproduction sources available to university personnel. This effort must include manual logging of all reproduction devices on campus (approximately 130 machines) to determine the origin of the work, the machine used, job size and special job requirements; a search of appropriate records to quantify the amount of printing being sent off campus to commercial establishments; and a solicitation of the opinions of system users via an opinion questionnaire.

Data Evaluation. The consultant will compile and summarize all data in a report on the current system that will include a comprehensive cost analysis; a simulation of productivity performance of each device in the study, including queue and turnaround; a summary and analysis of questionnaire data; and the consultant's findings and opinions as to what alternative courses of action are open to the university.

Alternatives. The consultant will perform alternative simulations of system changes based on the direction given by the user committee. These simulations will be in the same format as the current system simulation. The

simulations will continue until a system has been developed that meets the study objectives and satisfies the user committee.

Final Report. The consultant will prepare a final report that will include a detailed description of all phases and activities related to the study effort, all summary data and simulation comparisons, the final recommendation agreed to by the user committee, and a detailed plan for its implementation.

Implementation. The consultant will develop an implementation plan for system changes. The consultant will also provide a methodology for tracking the changes and their actual, versus projected, impact on cost and productivity.

Support Tools. The consultant should include samples of the various data processing reports and other support tools to be used during the study effort.


