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TEXAS DOCUMENTS

The *Texas Register* is currently in the process of converting to the numbering system found in the *Texas Administrative Code* (TAC). To aid the reader in this conversion, both the 10-digit *Register* number and the new TAC number will be listed for agencies whose rules have been published in the TAC. Emergency, proposed, and adopted rules sections of the *Register* are divided into two classifications: codified and noncodified. Codified rules appear in title number order. Non-codified rules appear in alphabetical order as they have in the past. An "Index of TAC Titles Affected" appears at the end of this issue.

Titles 1, 4, 7, 10, 13, 16, 19, 22, 25, 31, 34, 37, and 43 only of the TAC have now been published. Documents classified in the *Texas Register* to titles not yet published and certain documents affecting titles of the code have been accepted in the non-TAC format and may be renumbered or revised, or both, when initially codified in the TAC.

Under the TAC scheme, each agency rule is designated by a TAC number. For example, in the citation 1 TAC §27.15:

1 is the title (agencies grouped together by subject title which are arranged alphabetically)

TAC is the *Texas Administrative Code*

§27.15 is the section number (27 represents the chapter number and 15 represents the individual rule within the chapter)

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Pursuant to the Administrative Procedure and Texas Register Act, Texas Civil Statutes, Article 6252-13a, an agency must give at least 30 days notice of its intention to promulgate certain action on a rule. The purpose of proposing rule action is to give interested persons an opportunity to review the proposal and make oral or written comments. "Opportunity for public hearing must be granted if requested by at least 25 persons, by a governmental subdivision or agency, or by an association having at least 25 members." Proposed action is effective as notice on the date published in the *Register*. Unless a later date is specified or unless a federal statute or regulation requires implementation of the action on shorter notice, the proposed date of adoption is 30 days after publication. The notice must include a brief explanation of the proposed action; a fiscal impact statement; a request for comments on the proposed action from any interested person; the text of the proposed action, in compliance with the rules of the Texas Register Division; and a statement of the legal authority under which the proposed action is to be promulgated. The certification information, which includes the earliest possible date that the agency may file notice to adopt the proposal, follows each published submission of proposed action. A telephone number for further information is also published.

TITLE 22. EXAMINING BOARDS

Part XXIX. Texas Board of Land Surveying

Chapter 663 Standards of Responsibility and Rules of Conduct

The Texas Board of Land Surveying proposes new §663.11 (408.02.00.011) concerning certification and monumentation of surveys. This section is being proposed for the protection of the

consumer, to insure that any survey work appearing under the seal or signature of a registered or licensed surveyor has minimum monumentation that the consumer public can rely upon.

Betty J. Pope, executive secretary has determined that for the first five-year period the rule will be in effect, there will be no fiscal implications as a result of enforcing or administering the rule.

The executive secretary has also determined that for each year of the first five years the rule as proposed is in effect, the public benefits anticipated as a result of enforcing the rule as proposed will be protection of the consumer, insuring that any survey work appearing under the seal or signature of a registered or licensed surveyor has minimum monumentation that the consumer public can rely upon. There will be no economic cost to individuals who are required to comply with the rule as proposed.

This section is proposed under Texas Civil Statutes, Article 5282C, §9, which provides the Texas Board of Land Surveying with the authority to make and enforce all reasonable and necessary rules, regulations, and bylaws not inconsistent with the Texas Constitution, the laws of this state, and this Act.

§663.11 (408.02.00.011). *Certification and Monumentation of Surveys.*

(a) When delineating a property or boundary line as an integral portion of any survey, which survey is defined in the Land Surveying Practices Act of 1979, §2, subsection (1) or (3), the surveyor shall set, or leave as found sufficient, stable and reasonable permanent survey markers to represent or reference the property or boundary corners, angle points, and points of curvature or tangency. All such survey markers shall be shown and described with sufficient evidence of the location of such markers on the surveyors' plat and called for in the surveyors' written description of the surveyed premise.

(b) All maps, plats, or sketches delineating routes, spaces or sites with ties to survey or property lines must bear the certification of a registered or licensed surveyor.

TITLE 25. HEALTH SERVICES

Part I. Texas Department of Health

Chapter 1. Texas Board of Health

Use of Department Facilities by Individuals, Groups, or Organizations Other Than Department Employees

The Texas Department of Health proposes new §§1.71-1.74 (301.01.05.001-.004) concerning use of department facilities by individuals, groups, or organizations other than department employees. These sections will replace existing department §§1.51-1.54 (301.01.04.001-.004) which have been proposed for repeal.

Stephen Seale, chief accountant III, Program Budgetary Services Division, has determined that for the first five-year period the rule will be in effect, there will be no fiscal implications as a result of enforcing or administering the rule.

Mr. Seale has also determined that for each year of the first five years the rule as proposed is in effect:

(A) The public benefits anticipated as a result of enforcing the rule as proposed will be clarification of existing department procedures by which individuals, groups, or organizations other than department employees will be permitted to use department facilities.

(B) There will be no economic cost to individuals who are required to comply with the rule as proposed.

The new sections are proposed under Texas Civil Statutes, Article 4418a, §3, which provides the Texas Board of Health with the authority to adopt rules for the conduct and performance of every duty imposed on the board and the Texas Department of Health.

§1.71 (301.01.05.001). Purpose. The purpose of these sections is to prescribe uniform procedures regarding the use of department facilities by individuals, groups, or organizations other than department employees.

§1.72 (301.01.05.002). Application. These sections apply to all department facilities.

§1.73 (301.01.05.003). Definitions. The following words and term, when used in this section, shall have the following meanings, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise.

Commissioner—Texas Commissioner of Health.

Department—Texas Department of Health.

Facilities—Institutions or physical plants, or part of either, under the control and management of the Texas Board of Health. This term encompasses both real and personal property and includes specifically, but is not limited to, meeting rooms, auditoriums, cafeterias, parking lots, outdoor grounds, and certain bulletin boards, wherever located within the State of Texas.

Organization—A public health-related organization or a public employee organization.

(A) Public health-related organization—Any nonprofit association, organization, or group which has as its primary pur-

pose the promotion and protection of the public health.

(B) Public employee organization—An organization or association of public employees acting as a representative of such employees to present grievances concerning wages, hours of work, or conditions of work or for any other lawful purpose.

§1.74 (301.01.05.004). Limited Use of Facilities. Organizations may have access to limited use of department facilities under the following conditions.

(1) Public employee organizations may have access for activities which are primarily for department employee-related purposes.

(2) Public health-related organizations may have access for activities which are primarily for public health purposes.

(3) The commissioner, or his designee, will decide if the use is primarily for an employee-related purpose or a public health purpose.

(4) The limited use will be made available to all qualified organizations on a nondiscriminating basis; for an equal number of times; and within any given period established by the commissioner or his designee.

(5) The use also will include organizations using facilities for the purpose of presenting or sponsoring educational or entertainment programs, provided that the programs are open to all department employees.

(6) Requests or applications for the limited use shall be made to the commissioner, or his designee, who may require applicants to provide such information as may be necessary for proper planning and scheduling of the requested use.

(7) The department may require reimbursement for any expense incurred by the department for utilities, janitorial services, repairs, or other expenditures necessitated by the limited use.

TITLE 37. PUBLIC SAFETY AND CORRECTIONS

Part I. Texas Department of Public Safety

Chapter 1. Organization and Administration

Public Information Policies

The Texas Department of Public Safety proposes amendments to §1.60 (201.01.04.010) concerning public information policies relating to requests for Department of Public Safety press cards. This rule promulgates the regulations for determining an appli-

cant's qualifications, application procedures, and issuance of press cards to working members of the news media. Language is deleted from paragraph (2), which removes the minimum age requirement and denial of application due to applicant's criminal history. Language is deleted from paragraph (3), which removes the thumbprint requirement and driver's license or DPS personal identification card number for use on press card.

Melvin C. Peeples, chief accountant III, has determined that for the first five-year period the rule will be in effect, there will be no fiscal implications as a result of enforcing or administering the rule.

Larry Todd, public information officer, has determined that for each year of the first five years the rule as proposed is in effect:

(A) The public benefits anticipated as a result of enforcing the rule as proposed will be:

(1) DPS press card applications will be simplified by eliminating certain information that had previously been requested.

(2) Applicants and the DPS Public Information Office will save time in processing applications.

(B) There will be no economic costs to individuals who are required to comply with the rule as proposed.

These amendments are proposed under Texas Civil Statutes, Article 4413(4), which provides the Public Safety Commission with the authority to formulate plans and policies for the enforcement of the criminal, traffic, and safety laws of the state, the prevention of crime, the detection and apprehension of violators of the laws,

and for the education of the citizens of the state in the promotion of public safety and law observance.

§1.60 (201.01.04.010). Requests for Department of Public Safety Press Cards. Department of Public Safety press cards are issued by the Public Information Office for the sole purpose of assisting department personnel in cooperating with working members of the news media. Press cards are not a pass or license, and they convey no immunity from arrest. The cards, which bear the signature of the director, are issued biennially and are of a different color for the two-year period. The following regulations govern the issuance of Department of Public Safety press cards:

(1) (No change.)

(2) Applicants must be employed by an eligible organization as defined in paragraph (1) of this section and must have job titles which reflect their responsibilities as working members of the news media. [Each applicant must be at least 18 years of age, must not be under indictment for any criminal offense, must not be on probation for any offense other than a traffic violation or Class C misdemeanor, and must not be on parole from any penal institution.]

(3) Applications must be made on forms provided by the Department of Public Safety. All blanks must be completed and the applicant's legal name must be used [and a legible thumbprint must be affixed]. A Texas driver's license or Department of Public Safety personal identification card number must be shown [because this number is used as the press card number]. Applications must be signed by both the applicant and employer, and must be mailed in the eligible organizations's letterhead envelope to the Public Information Office, Texas Department of Public Safety, P.O. Box 4087, Austin, Texas 78773.

(4)-(5) (No change.)

Pursuant to the Administrative Procedure and Texas Register Act, Texas Civil Statutes, Article 6252-13a, an agency may take final action on a rule 30 days after publication of the proposed action in the *Register*. Upon adoption of the action, "the agency, if requested to do so by an interested person either prior to adoption or within 30 days after adoption, shall issue a concise statement of the principal reasons for and against its adoption, incorporating in the statement its reasons for overruling the considerations urged against its adoption." If an agency takes final action on a rule with no changes made to the text as proposed, only the preamble of the notice and statement of legal authority will be published. The text, as appropriate, will be published only if final action is taken with changes made to the proposed action. The certification information, which includes the effective date of the final action, follows each published submission of final action. A telephone number for further information is also published.

An agency may withdraw proposed action or the remaining effectiveness of emergency action by filing a notice of withdrawal with the Texas Register Division. The notice will appear in this section of the *Register* and is generally effective immediately upon filing with the Texas Register Division.

TITLE 16. ECONOMIC REGULATION

Part I. Railroad Commission of Texas

Chapter 9. Liquefied Petroleum Gas Division

Subchapter B. Basic Rules

The Railroad Commission of Texas adopts amendments to §9.51 (051.05.03.041) with changes to the proposed text published in the August 21, 1981, issue of the *Texas Register* (6 TexReg 3063).

These amendments are necessary in order to bring the LP-gas licensees in compliance with the present day safety rules of the Liquefied Petroleum Gas Division due to the fact that the increase in vapor pressure of commercial propane to 208 psig exceeds the design working pressure 200 psig containers.

The amended rule will permit the LP-gas licensees in the State of Texas to introduce commercial propane having a maximum vapor pressure of 210 psig into those containers in service in Texas prior to September 1, 1981, having a design working pressure of 200 psig, thus saving the LP-gas industry and consumers millions of dollars in cost for replacement containers.

The amendments will bring the rule up-to-date, and will save the LP-gas industry and consumers millions of dollars without compromising safety standards. Every comment received expressed wholehearted support for adoption of the proposed amendments. No comments were received opposing adoption.

These amendments are adopted under the authority of Texas Natural Resources Code, Texas Civil Statutes, Article 113.051 (Vernon's 1978), which provides the commission with authority to protect the health, welfare, and safety of the general public.

§9.51 (051.05.03.041). Maximum Vapor Pressure and Container Working Pressure.

(a) The maximum vapor pressure of the product at 100°F which may be transferred to a container shall not exceed the design working pressure of the container.

(b) Exception: 200 psig working pressure vessels in service in Texas prior to September 1, 1981, may be continued, in service for (commercial) propane, provided that they are fitted with relief valves set for 250 psig normal start to discharge and are used in compliance with the other rules of this chapter. For the purpose of this exception, "commercial propane" is defined as having a vapor pressure not in excess of 210 psig at 100°F. This exception does not apply to LP-gas motor fuel and mobile fuel containers, which are regulated by LPG Safety §9.181 (051.05.03.170) of this title (relating to Liquid and Vapor Withdrawal Fuel Systems.)

TITLE 22. EXAMINING BOARDS

Part XI. Board of Nurse Examiners

Chapter 217. Licensure and Practice

The Board of Nurse Examiners for the State of Texas adopts new §§217.3, 217.8, and 217.9 with changes to the proposed text published in the August 28, 1981, issue of the *Texas Register* (6 TexReg 3169).

These new sections provide for the handicapped candidate to write the SBTPE and also for reactivation of a registered nurse from the inactive status, and to simplify the duplicate or substitute credential requests.

These new sections will provide a procedure for handicapped candidates to take the licensing examination. The procedure to reactivate a license from an inactive status is detailed.

Duplicate and substitute credentials have been combined for easier reference.

No comments were received regarding adoption of the new sections.

These new sections are adopted under the authority of Texas Civil Statutes, Article 4514, §1, which provides authorization for the board to make and enforce all rules and regulations necessary for the performance of its duties and conducting of proceedings before it, to establish standards of professional conduct for all persons licensed under the provisions of this law in keeping with its purpose and objectives, to regulate the practice of professional nursing, and to determine whether or not an act constitutes the practice of professional nursing, not inconsistent with this Act. Such rules and regulations shall not be inconsistent with the provisions of this law.

§217.3. Handicapped Candidate.

(a) A handicapped candidate for the SBTPE who otherwise is qualified shall not be deprived of the opportunity to take the licensing examination solely by reason of that handicap. Such handicaps may include but not be limited to, visual and hearing impairments and/or other physical disabilities.

(b) Requests for modification of the SBTPE itself and/or the procedures for administering the SBTPE must be submitted to the board at least 130 days prior to the examination date. The request shall include an evaluation of the disability by the candidate's physician or psychologist.

(c) Handicapped candidates requiring a separate examination room will write the SBTPE in Austin.

§217.8. Reactivation from Inactive Status.

(a) A registered nurse who is not practicing professional nursing and whose license has been in an inactive status for less than four years may reactivate the license by completing the application form and paying a \$5.00 reactivation fee and the current re-registration fee.

(b) A registered nurse who is not practicing professional nursing and whose license has been in an inactive status for more than four years will submit the following:

- (1) an application form;
- (2) verification of employment as a registered nurse in another state; or
- (3) evidence of a refresher course or an agreement to supervised employment or agreement to refresher course;
- (4) current photo; and
- (5) reactivation fee of \$10 plus the current re-registration fee.

§217.9. Duplicate or Substitute Credentials.

(a) A registered nurse whose original certificate of registration or re-registration is lost or destroyed may obtain a duplicate by filing a form containing identifying information, notarized affidavit, and paying a fee.

(b) A registrant who wants his or her original certificate of registration or current certificate or re-registration issued in a name other than that under which the original

was issued may secure a substitute certificate by submitting:

- (1) a duly executed affidavit;
- (2) the required fee;
- (3) a photograph properly identified; and
- (4) the original of the certificate of registration.

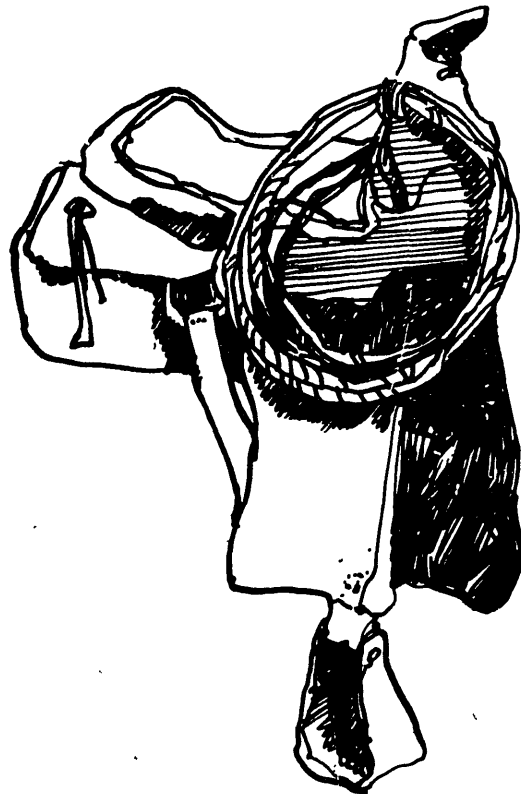

The Texas Open Meetings Act, Texas Civil Statutes, Article 6252-17, requires that an agency with statewide jurisdiction have notice posted for at least seven days before the day of a meeting. An institution of higher education must have notice posted for at least 72 hours before the scheduled meeting time. Although some notices may be received and filed too late for publication before the meeting is held, all filed notices will be published in the *Register*. 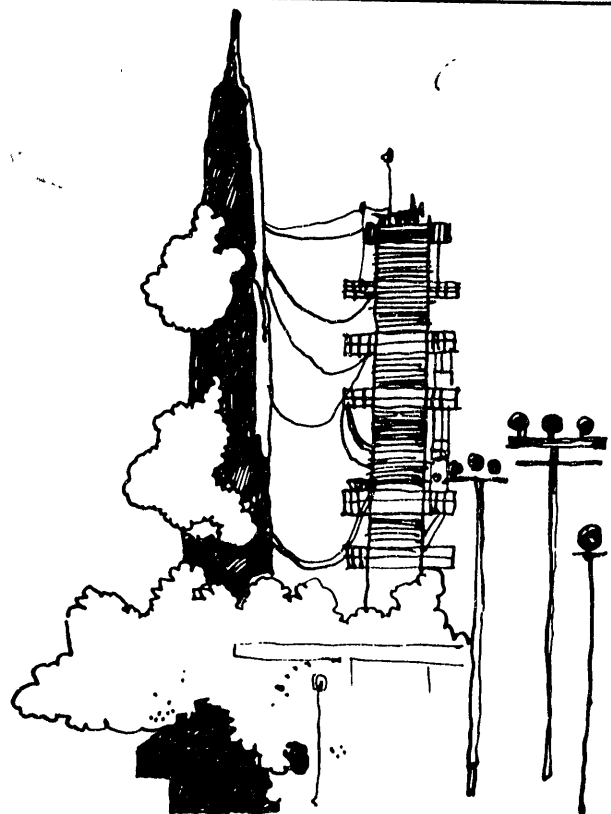
