NOTES ON THE ISSUE

Seadock, Inc., of Houston has applied to the State of Texas for a license to construct and operate a deepwater port off the coast of Texas. The facility would accommodate tankers weighing up to half a million tons. Notice of that application appears under General Land Office in the "In Addition" section.

The Department of Parks and Wildlife is proposing a rule which would authorize that agency to provide objective comments to the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers on permits related to operations in navigable waters. A recent revision of federal regulations concerning activities involving wetlands has created a need for the proposed rule.

The Attorney General has received two requests for opinions concerning the purview of the Open Records Act (Article 6252-17a, Texas Civil Statutes), which ensures the people of Texas full and complete information regarding the affairs of government. Exceptions are made only as the law specifies.

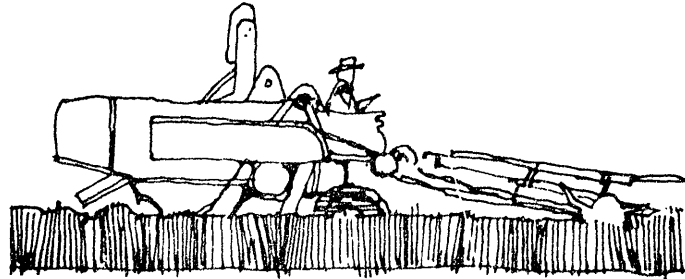

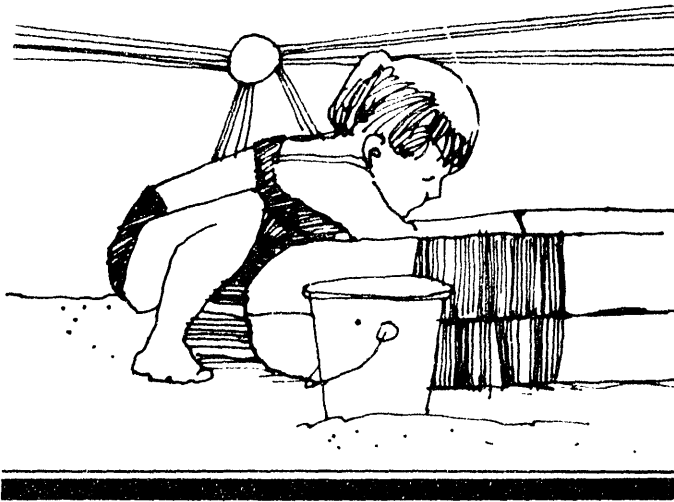

The Open Meetings Act (Article 6252-17, Texas Civil Statutes) requires that an agency with statewide jurisdiction have notice posted for at least seven days before the day of a meeting. A political subdivision covering all or part of four or more counties, or an institution of higher education, must have notice posted for at least 72 hours before the scheduled meeting time. 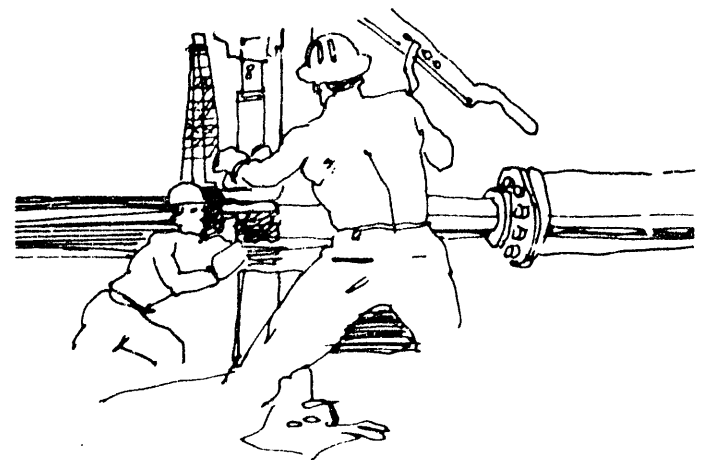

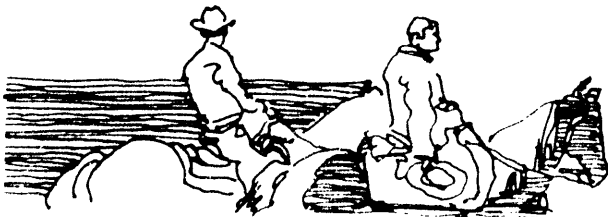

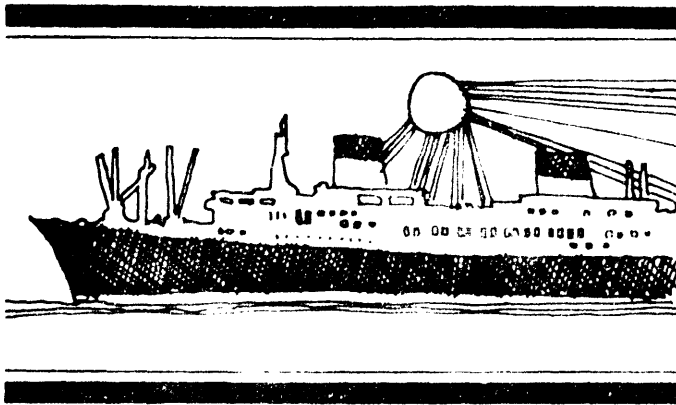

Notice is given of the receipt by the State of Texas of an application for a license to construct and operate a deepwater port in the Gulf of Mexico off the coast of Texas. The application was submitted on December 31, 1975, by Seadock, Inc., Suite 720, Two Greenway Plaza East, Houston, Texas 77046 to the Department of Transportation, United States Coast Guard. The application was received by the Commissioner of the General Land Office on February 6, 1976.

The proposed deepwater port will be located on the Outer Continental Shelf in the Gulf of Mexico approximately 26 miles south of Freeport, in waters 100 feet deep, and beyond the territorial limits of the United States. The facility will be capable of handling vessels of up to about 500,000 dead weight tons, depending upon vessel draft. Maximum throughput of the facility will be four million barrels per day.

The application consists of the Application Proper and an Environmental Report and Summary. Copies of the application are available for public study and review at the General Land Office, 1700 North Congress, Austin, and at the office of the County Judge of Brazoria County.

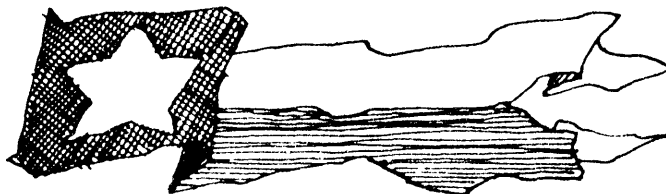

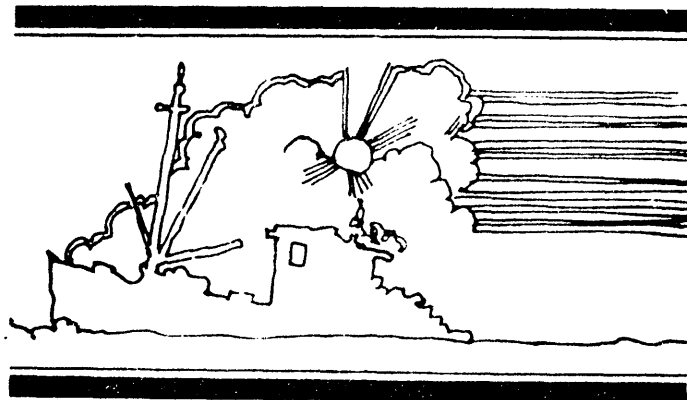

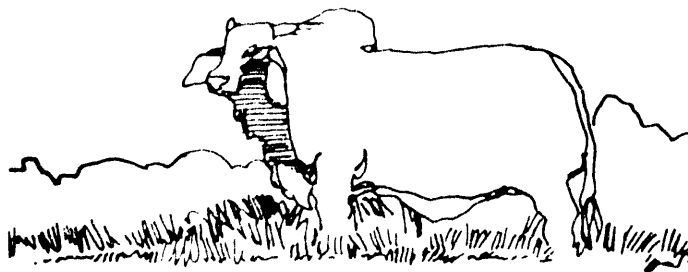
Should any person wish to contest any application for a Declaratory Ruling or Exemption Certificate, that person must file a notice of intent to contest the application with the Chairman of the Commission within twelve (12) days after the enclosed listing is published. The first day for calculating this 12-day period is the first calendar day following the dating of the publishing. The 12th day will expire at 5 p.m. on the 12th consecutive day after said publishing if the 12th day is a

working day. If the twelfth day is a Saturday, Sunday, or state holiday, the last day shall be extended to 5 p.m. of the next day that is not a Saturday, Sunday, or state holiday. When notice of intent to contest is mailed to the Chairman of the Commission, P.O. Box 15023, Austin, Texas 78761, it must be postmarked no later than the day prior to the last day allowed for filing notice of intent to contest.

The contents and form of a notice of intent to contest an application for an Exemption Certificate or Declaratory Ruling must meet the minimum criteria set out in THFC-ERR 8, Section A(4). Failure of a contesting party to supply the minimum necessary information in the correct form by the 12th day will result in a defective notice of intent to contest, and such application will be considered uncontested.

The fact that an application is uncontested will not mean that it will be approved. Regardless of whether or not an application is formally contested, it will be approved only if the Commission determines that it qualifies under the criteria of Sections 3.02, 3.03, or 6.02 of Article 4418(h), Vernon's Annotated Texas Statutes and THFC-ERR 8 and 11.

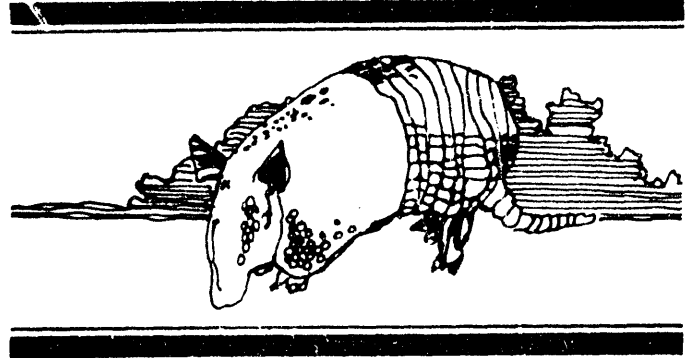

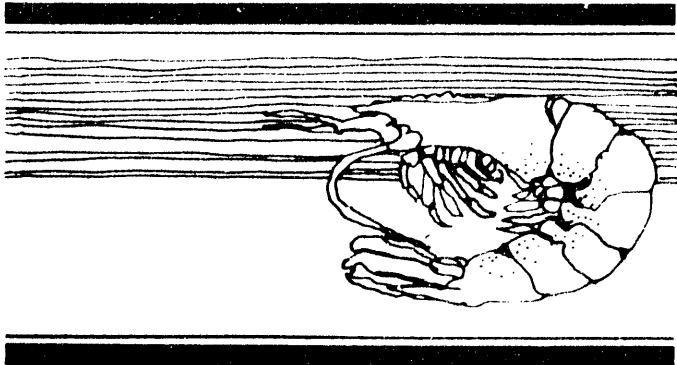

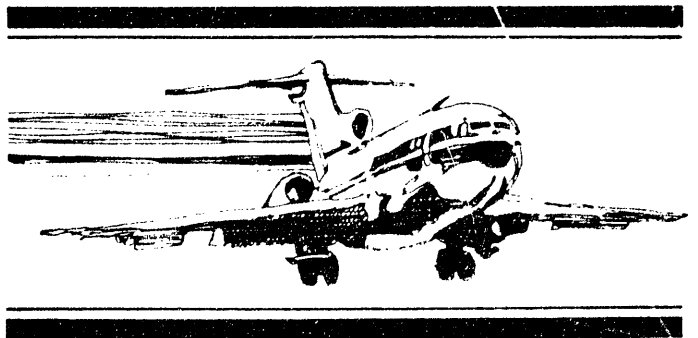
