Office of the Secretary of State

To limit the number of issues presented to the public for consideration at any one election, the legislature enacted Article 2.01b of the Texas Election Code. The secretary of state, to clarify this legislation, has promulgated an emergency rule to further define what offices and issues may be legally considered in the November 2 election.

The Department of Public Welfare proposes to amend its concept of the household in determining eligibility for food stamps. The proposed amendment would emphasize the sharing of food rather than the sharing of shelter in defining household membership. This proposed change reflects change in the United States Department of Agriculture policy. At the same time, DPW proposes increased costs for microfilm records.

In preparation for the upcoming hunting seasons, the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department has adopted emergency and permanent rules governing hunting, fishing, and trapping in several wildlife management areas.





Black Gap Wildlife Management Area in Brewster County and Sierra Diablo Wildlife Management Area In Culberson and Hudspeth Counties 127.70.04.001

The Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission is responsible for establishing seasons, bag limits, and means and methods for harvesting wildlife resources on its wildlife management areas.

Permanent rules have been filed and will become effective at the time prescribed by law. In order to make these rules administratively effective prior to the hunting seasons established therein, they are being filed under the emergency provisions of the Administrative Procedure and Texas Register Act.

Therefore, the Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission is repealing Rule 127.70.04.001, which constitutes the Black Gap Wildlife Management Area in Brewster County and Sierra Diablo Wildlife Management Area in Culberson and Hudspeth Counties Hunting, Fishing, and Trapping Proclamation No. 21, 1975-76, to become effective immediately on filing with the secretary of state.

The repeal of this rule is promulgated under the authority of Sections 81.401-81.404 and 82.201-82.207, Texas Parks and Wildlife Code.

127.70.04.002-.060

The Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission is responsible for establishing seasons, bag limits, means, and methods for harvesting wildlife resources on its wildlife management areas under authority of Sections 81.401-81.404 and 82.201-82.207, Texas Parks and Wildlife Code.

Permanent rules have been filed and will become effective at the time prescribed by law.

In order to make these rules administratively effective prior to the hunting seasons established therein, they are being filed under the emergency provisions of the Administrative Procedure and Texas Register Act at this time.

Therefore, the Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission is promulgating Emergency Rules 127.70.04.002-.060, which constitute Black Gap Wildlife Management Area in Brewster County and Sierra Diablo Wildlife Management Area in Culberson and Hudspeth Counties Hunting, Fishing, and Trapping Proclamation No. 22, 1976-77, to become effective immediately on filing with the secretary of state.

These rules are promulgated under the authority of Sections 81.401-81.404 and 82.201-82.207, Texas Parks and Wildlife Code.

.002. Application. These rules apply to all species of fish, game animals, game birds, and furbearing animals in the Black Gap Wildlife Management Area in Brewster County, and Sierra Diablo Wildlife Management Area in Culberson and Hudspeth Counties.



- .003. Authority. These rules are issued pursuant to Sections 81.401-81.404 and 82.201-82.207, Texas Parks and Wildlife Code.
- .004. Effective Date. These rules are effective on and after the first day of September, 1976, until amended, modified, or revoked.
- .005. Finding of Fact. After having conducted continuous research and investigations of the supply, economic value, environment, breeding habits, and sex ratios of the wildlife resources and the factors affecting their increase or decrease, it is deemed expedient and in the interest of sound conservation practices to allow such wildlife resources to be taken and possessed in accordance with the regulations herein set forth.
- .006. Consent. None of the wildlife resources of the Black Gap Wildlife Management Area and the Sierra Diablo Wildlife Management Area may be taken except by holders of permits that have been issued by the Parks and Wildlife Department.
 - .007. Open Seasons -- General Rules.
- (a) Open seasons are given by their opening and closing dates and include all days between such opening and closing dates.
- (b) Seasons are closed during the hours between one-half hour after sunset and one-half hour before sunrise.
- (c) Impoundments on the Black Gap Wildlife Management Area are closed to fishing.
- (d) Access to the Rio Grande and camps on the Rio Grande are closed to fishermen during deer and javelina seasons.
- (e) Hours during which migratory birds may be taken may be further restricted by the Migratory Game Bird Rules 127.70.02.002.007.
- (f) It is unlawful to take any of the wildlife resources of the areas except during the open seasons as indicated in these rules.

(Rules 127.70.04.008-.009 reserved.)

.010. Definitions.

- (a) "Department" or "Parks and Wildlife Department" is defined, as the context requires, as either the Parks and Wildlife Department or a specifically authorized employee thereof.
- (b) The following are "game animals": wild antelope, wild black bear, wild deer, wild elk, wild javelina, wild desert bighorn sheep, wild gray or cat squirrels, and wild fox or red squirrels. (Section 63.001, Texas Parks and Wildlife Code)
- (c) A "buck deer" is defined as a deer having a hardened antler protruding through the skin.
- (d) An "antlerless deer" is defined as a deer having no hardened antler protruding through the skin.
- (e) The following are "game birds": wild turkey, wild ducks of all varieties, wild geese of all varieties,

- wild brant, wild grouse, wild prairie chicken or pinnated grouse, wild pheasants of all varieties, wild partridge of all varieties, wild quail of all varieties, wild red-billed pigeons and wild band-tailed pigeons, wild mourning doves, wild white-winged doves, wild snipe of all varieties, wild shore birds of all varieties, wild Mexican pheasants or chachalacas, wild plover of all varieties, and wild sandhill cranes. (Section 64.001, Texas Parks and Wildlife Code)
- (f) "Migratory birds" are wild ducks, geese, brant, mourning and white-winged doves, common snipe or Wilson's snipe or jacksnipe, plover, sandhill cranes, coot, rail, gallinules, and woodcock.
- (g) A "bearded hen" is defined as a female turkey possessing a clearly visible beard protruding through the feathers of the breast.
- (h) The following are "fur-bearing animals": wild beaver, wild otter, wild mink, wild ring-tailed cat, wild bad Jer, wild polecat or skunk, wild raccoon, wild muskrat, wild opossum, wild fox, and wild civet. (Section 71.001, Texas Parks and Wildlife Code)

.011. General Regulations.

- (a) Hunters, fishermen, and campers will be required to occupy designated campsites only.
- (b) All hunters, fishermen, and campers will be required to register at headquarters on arrival and departure.
- (c) All vehicles will be restricted to use of designated roads. Fishermen and campers will be required to use Maravillas Canyon and Horse Canyon Roads only, while going to and from the Rio Grande. Parking will be permitted only in designated areas.
- (d) From the point where the Maravillas Canyon Road enters the Rio Grande Valley downstream to the area boundary, all fishermen will be confined to the area between the road and the river. From the same point upstream to the area boundary, all fishermen will be confined to an area within 300 yards of the river.
- (e) Use of firearms except during open season, disturbance or removal of plants, rocks, artifacts, or other objects is prohibited.
- (f) The strewing of refuse, litter, trash, or garbage is prohibited.
- (g) No person may possess or consume alcoholic beverages within the areas.
- (h) No person may hunt, take, or kill, or attempt to hunt, take, or kill any game bird, game animal, or other protected species of wildlife from a motor vehicle or from any aircraft or any airborne device.
- (i) Employees of the Parks and Wildlife Department may remove parts from specimens harvested on management areas for scientific investigation when needed.
- (j) Any person hunting deer or javelina on any wildlife management area, other than bowhunters during a special archery-only season, must visibly wear a

minimum of 400 square inches of daylight fluorescent orange material with 144 square inches appearing on both the chest and back.

(Rules 127.70.04.012-.015 reserved.)

- .016. Means and Methods. It shall be unlawful to take or kill or attempt to take or attempt to kill any game animals or game birds except by the means and methods authorized in these rules.
 - .017. Rifle and Shotgun.
- (a) It shall be lawful to shoot game animals and game birds, other than migratory game birds, with a rifle or shotgun capable of and designed for being shot from the shoulder.
- (b) It is unlawful to shoot any migratory game bird with a shotgun that is not permanently plugged to three-shot capacity.
- (c) It is unlawful to use any rimfire ammunition, .22 caliber jet gun, or rocket gun in the shooting of deer and javelina.

(Rule 127.70.04.018 reserved.)

- .019. Hunting Deer with Dogs.
- (a) It shall be unlawful to use a dog or dogs in hunting, pursuing, or taking deer.
- (b) It shall be lawful to use a dog or dogs in trailing wounded deer.
- (c) A wounded deer is defined as a deer leaving a blood trail.

(Rules 127.70.04.020-.023 reserved.)

- .024. Hunting Permits.
- (a) Any special permit that may be issued for the hunting of wildlife species on the Black Gap and Sierra Diablo Wildlife Management Areas shall be made available to applicants in such a way as to give all applicants an impartial opportunity to obtain such a permit to the extent of the total number issued.
- (b) All hunting and trapping shall be by special permit.
- .025. Checking Game. All game birds, game animals, and furbearers taken or killed on the Black Gap and Sierra Diablo Wildlife Management Areas must be checked at area headquarters before the hunter or trapper leaves the premises.
- .026. Fishing Permits. Fishing privileges shall be extended to the public in a fair and impartial manner.
 - .027. Tagging of Game.
- (a) The sex of any deer to be taken shall be determined at the time of the hunt and stipulated on the permit issued by the Parks and Wildlife Department.
- (b) The carcass of any deer in the possession of any person shall have attached thereto a tag issued to such person on his valid hunting license; in addition, a special tag issued from the area headquarters must be

attached to each deer until the deer is processed for consumption.

(Rules 127.70.04.028-.031 reserved.)

- .032. Open Seasons and Bag Limits for Game Animals and Predators. It shall be unlawful to take any game animals at any time other than during the open seasons provided in these rules, or to take more than the daily limits, or to have in possession more than the possession limits.
 - .033. Deer -- By Permit Only.
 - (a) Black Gap Unit: No open season.
- (b) Sierra Diablo Unit: Open season: November 27-December 2, 1976. Bag limit: one deer, sex to be determined at time of hunt.
 - .034. Javelina.
- (a) Black Gap Special Javelina Season: January 15-20, 1977, by permit. Bag limit: one javelina.
 - (b) Sierra Diablo Unit: No open season.
 - .035. Squirrel. No open season.
- .036. Predatory Animals. No open season, except coyotes may be taken by permit holders during any open-game season.
 - .037. Turkey. No open season.
 - .038. Quail.
- (a) Black Gap Unit: Open season: October 2-3, 9-10; November 13-14, 20-21, 27-28; December 4-5, 11-12, 18-19, 1976. Bag limit: 12 quail per day.
 - (b) Sierra Diablo Unit: No open season.
 - .039. Migratory Birds.
 - (a) Black Gap Unit:
- (1) Mourning doves: Open season: September 4-6, 11-12; October 2-3, 9-10; from noon to sunset. Bag limit: 10 doves per day.
- (2) White-winged doves: Open season: September 4-6, 11-12 from noon to sunset. Bag limit: 10 white-winged doves per day.
- (b) Sierra Diablo Unit: No open season on either species of dove.
 - .040. Pheasant. No open season.

(Rules 127.70.04.041-.045 reserved.)

.046. Furbearers. No open season.

(Rules 127.70.04.047-.049 reserved.)

- .050. Fish. It shall be unlawful to take or possess any fish in greater numbers or at any time other than as permitted under the general fishing laws applicable in Brewster and Culberson Counties.
 - .051. Seasons.
- (a) Impoundments on the Black Gap Widlife Management Area are closed to fishing.



- (b) Access to the Rio Grande and camps on the Rio Grande is closed to fishermen and campers during the deer and javelina seasons.
- .052. Means and Methods. Means and methods of fishing shall be the same as provided by general and special laws for the counties of Brewster and Culberson.
- .053. Bag Limits. Bag limits for fish shall be the same as provided by general and special laws for the counties of Brewster and Culberson.

(Rules 127.70.04.054-.059 reserved.)

.060. Penalties.

- (a) Section 81.006, Texas Parks and Wildlife Code, provides a penalty of not less than \$25 nor more than \$100 upon conviction of any person who shall violate any of these rules, or who shall hunt or fish at any time other than the times specified by the Parks and Wildlife Commission.
- (b) The rules and regulations herein promulgated are cumulative of all general and special laws enacted by the legislature regulating the taking of wildlife.

- (a) Open seasons are given by their opening and closing dates and include all days between such opening and closing dates.
- (b) Except for fishing, seasons are closed during the hours between one-half hour after sunset and onehalf hour before sunrise.
- (c) Hours during which migratory birds may be taken may be further restricted by the Migratory Game Birds Rules 127.70.02.002-.007.
- (d) It is unlawful to take any of the wildlife resources of the area except during the open seasons as indicated in these rules.
- (e) Except by special permit, firearms may be possessed by visitors to the area only during specified public hunting periods.

(Rules 127.70.05.008-.009 reserved.)

.010. Definitions.

- (a) "Department" or "Parks and Wildlife Department" is defined, as the context requires, as either the Parks and Wildlife Department or a specifically authorized employee thereof.
- (b) The following are "game animals": wild antelope, wild black bear, wild deer, wild elk, wild javelina, wild desert bighorn sheep, wild gray or cat squirrels, and wild fox or red squirrels. (Section 63.001, Texas Parks and Wildlife Code)
- (c) A "buck deer" is defined as a deer having a hardened antler protruding through the skin.
- (d) An "antlerless deer" is defined as a deer having no hardened antler protruding through the skin.
- (e) The following are "game birds": wild turkey, wild ducks of all varieties, wild geese of all varieties, wild brant, wild grouse, wild prairie chicken or pinnated grouse, wild pheasants of all varieties, wild partridge of all varieties, wild quail of all varieties, wild red-billed pigeons, and wild band-tailed pigeons, wild mourning doves, wild white-winged doves, wild snipe of all varieties, wild shore birds of all varieties, wild Mexican pheasants or chachalacas, wild plover of all varieties, and wild sandhill cranes. (Section 64.001, Texas Parks and Wildlife Code)

- (f) "Migratory birds" are wild ducks, geese, brant, mourning and white-winged doves, common snipe, Wilson's snipe or jacksnipe, plover, sandhill cranes, coot, rail, gallinules, and woodcock.
- (g) A "bearded hen" is defined as a female turkey possessing a clearly visible beard protruding through the feathers of the breast.
- (h) The following are "fur-bearing animals": wild beaver, wild otter, wild mink, wild ring-tailed cat, wild badger, wild polecat or skunk, wild raccoon, wild muskrat, wild opossum, wild fox, and wild civet. (Section 71.001, Texas Parks and Wildlife Code)
 - .011. General Regulations.
- (a) Hunters may occupy designated campsites only.
- (b) All hunters and fishermen will be required to register at headquarters on arrival and departure.
- (c) All vehicles will be restricted to use of designated roads.
- (d) Use of firearms except during open hunting season, and disturbance or removal of plants, rocks, artifacts, or other objects is prohibited.
- (e) The strewing of refuse, litter, trash, or garbage is prohibited.
- (f) No person may possess or consume alcoholic beverages within the areas.
- (g) No person may hunt, take, or kill, or attempt to hunt, take, or kill any game bird, game animal, or other protected species of wildlife from a motor vehicle, or from any aircraft or any airborne device.

- .016. Means and Methods. It shall be unlawful to take or kill or attempt to take or attempt to kill any game birds or game animals except by the means and methods authorized in these rules.
 - .017. Rifle and Shotgun.
- (a) It shall be lawful to shoot game animals with a rifle or shotgun capable of and designed for being shot from the shoulder.
- (b) It shall be lawful to shoot game birds with a shotgun capable of and designed for being shot from the shoulder.
- (c) It is unlawful to shoot any game bird with a rifle or to shoot any migratory game bird with a shotgun that is not permanently plugged to three-shell capacity.

- (d) It is unlawful to use any rimfire ammunition, .22 caliber jet gun, or rocket gun in the shooting of deer and javelina.
- (e) If muzzle-loading rifles are used, they must not be equipped with telescopic sights.

.018. Archery.

- (a) It is lawful to hunt deer, bear, turkey, and javelina during the open seasons provided therefor with a longbow and arrow only if:
- (1) the bow is capable of shooting a hunting arrow equipped with a broadhead hunting point for a distance of 130 yards;
- (2) the arrow is equipped with a broadhead hunting point at least seven-eighths inch in width and not over one and one-half inches in width;
- (3) the arrow bears the name and address of the user in a non-water soluble medium; and
- (4) the arrow is not poisoned, drugged, or explosive.
 - (b) It is unlawful to use a crossbow.

.019. Hunting Deer with Dogs.

- (a) It shall be unlawful to use a dog or dogs in hunting, pursuing, or taking deer.
- (b) It shall be lawful to use a dog or dogs in trailing wounded deer.
- (c) A wounded deer is defined as a deer leaving a blood trail.

.024. Hunting Permits.

- (a) Any special permit that may be issued for the hunting of wildlife species on the Chaparral Wildlife Management Areas shall be made available to applicants in such a way as to give all applicants an impartial opportunity to obtain such a permit to the extent of the total number issued.

- .032. Open Seasons and Bag Limits for Game Animals and Predators. It shall be unlawful to take any game animals at any time other than during the open seasons provided in these rules, or to take more than the daily limits, or to have in possession more than the possession limits.
 - .033. Deer-- By Permit Only: Regular Season.
- (a) Open season: November 13-14, 27-28, and December 11-12, and 18-19, 1976.
- (b) Bag limit: one deer, sex to be determined at time of hunt.
 - (c) Possession limit: one deer.
- (d) The carcass of any deer in the possession of any person shall have attached thereto a tag issued to such person on his valid hunting license; in addition, a special tag issued from the area headquarters must be attached to each deer until the deer is completely processed.
- (e) Only muzzle-loading rifles of .45 caliber or larger, without telescopic sights, may be used.

.034. Javelina.

- (a) Open season: January 22-23 and February 19-20, 1977.
 - (b) Bag limit: one javelina.
 - (c) Possession limit: one javelina.
 - .035. Squirrel. No open season.
- .036. Predatory Animals (Mountain Lions, Wildcats, and Coyotes). No open season, except coyotes may be taken by valid permit holders during any open-game season
 - .037. Turkey. No open season.

.038. Quail.

- (a) Open season: October 9-10, 16-17, 23-24, 30-31; November 6-7, 20-21; December 4-5, 1976; January 1-2, 8-9, 15-16, 29-30; February 5-6, 12-13, 26-27, 1977.
 - (b) Bag limit: 12 quail per day.
- .039. Migratory Birds. Mourning doves: Open season: October 9-10, 16-17, 23-24, 30-31; November 6-7, 1977; and January 1-2, 8-9, 15-16, 1977. Shooting hours: from noon to sunset; except on January 1-2, 8-9, and 15-16, mourning doves may be hunted from 30 minutes before sunrise to sunset. Bag limit: 10 doves per day.
 - .040. Pheasant. No open season.

(Rules 127.70.05.041-.045 reserved.)

.046. Furbearers. No open season. (Rules 127.70.05.047-.049 reserved.)

- .050. Fish. It shall be unlawful to take or possess any fish in greater numbers or at any time other than as permitted in these rules.
- .051. Seasons. No closed seasons, except during periods when hunting is permitted on the area.
- .052. Means and Methods. Means and methods of fishing shall be limited to pole and line, rod and reel, artificial and natural baits, or throwline; hooks on throwline must be spaced not less than three horizontal feet apart.
- .053. Bag Limits. Bag limits for fish shall be the same as provided by proclamations issued by the Parks and Wildlife Commission for Dimmit County.

Therefore, the Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission is repealing Rule 127.70.06.001, which constitutes the J. D. Murphree Wildlife Management Area, Jefferson County, Hunting, Fishing, and Trapping Proclamation No. 17, 1975-76, to become effective immediately on filing with the secretary of state.

The repeal of this rule is promulgated under the authority of Sections 81.401-.404, Texas Parks and Wildlife Code.

In order to make these rules administratively effective prior to the hunting seasons established therein, they are being filed under the emergency provisions of the Administrative Procedure and Texas Register Act at this time.

Therefore, the Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission is promulgating Emergency Rules 127.70.06.002.060, which constitute the J. D. Murphree Wildlife Management Area, Jefferson County, Hunting, Fishing, and Trapping Proclamation No. 18, 1976-77, to become effective immediately on filing with the secretary of state.

- (b) All hunting and trapping shall be by special permit.
- .025. Checking Game. All game birds, game animals, and fur-bearers taken or killed on the J. D. Murphree Wildlife Management Area must be checked at area headquarters before the hunter or trapper leaves the premises.
- .026. Fishing Permits. Fishing privileges shall be extended to the public in a fair and impartial manner.
 - .027. General Regulations.
- (a) No business concessions such as selling, renting, leasing, or peddling goods, merchandise, or services to the public may be maintained within the area.

- (c) No person may enter or attempt to enter with a gun, rifle, or any other firearm on the area except persons duly selected through an impartial method to hunt on the area or bona fide employees of the department in the performance of their duties; provided, however, persons duly authorized by department employees in charge may cross the area to gain access to adjacent areas when traveling designated routes, and no hunting or fishing may be done while en route to adjacent areas; and provided that any person who crosses the area shall have in his possession evidence of his authority to enter the adjacent areas.
- (d) No person may possess or consume alcoholic beverages within the area.
- (e) No person may damage or attempt to damage any plant life, area levee facility, improvement, or property within the area.
- (f) Employees of the Parks and Wildlife Department may remore parts from specimens harvested on management areas for scientific investigation when needed.
- (g) No dogs are allowed within the area except that one dog per permit-holding hunter is permitted to retrieve dead or wounded waterfowl.
- (h) No person may dump trash or garbage or attempt to dump trash or garbage within the area, and no person may litter the area in any manner, and persons

authorized to hunt or fish shall leave their assigned area in a tidy condition.

- (i) No water skiing shall be permitted in or on the area.
- (j) Airboats are not permitted within the wildife management area except in Big Hill Bayou.
- (k) Boats, skiffs, or floating craft of any type may not be left overnight in the management area.

- .032. Open Seasons and Bag Limits for Game Animals and Predators. It shall be unlawful to take any game animals at any time other than during the open seasons provided in these rules, or to take more than the daily bag limits, or to have in possession more than the possession limits.

If any of these holidays fall on a Tuesday, Thursday, or Saturday, the next Wednesday, Friday, or Monday will be hunted in lieu thereof.

- .047. Nutria. Nutria may be taken in any number at any time, but by permit only.

(Rules 127.70.06.048-.049 reserved.)

.050. Fish. It shall be unlawful to take or possess any fish in greater numbers or at any time other than as permitted in these rules.

.051. Seasons.

- (a) In that portion of Big Hill Bayou which lies within the J. D. Murphree Wildlife Management Area, fishing will be permitted from January 16 through October 31, both days inclusive, from sunrise to sunset.
- (b) In the remainder of the wildlife management area, fishing will be permitted from March 1 through August 31, both days inclusive, from sunrise to sunset, except that when required for the proper management of waterfowl resources, compartments may be closed to fishing for temporary periods of time.

 - .052. Means and Methods.
- (a) A person may take fish within compartment and borrow-ditch areas only by means of rod and reel, pole and line, and throwline.
- (b) No fishing lines shall be left unattended at any time within compartment and borrow-ditch areas.
- (c) Means and methods of fishing in Big Hill Bayou shall be the same as provided by general and special laws and proclamations issued by the Parks and Wildlife Commission for Jefferson County, except that seines and nets other than 20-foot minnow seines are prohibited.
- (d) All other means and methods of taking fish within the J. D. Murphree Wildlife Management Area shall be unlawful.
- .053. Bag Limits. Bag limits for fish shall be the same as provided by general and special laws and proclamations issued by the Parks and Wildlife Commission for Jefferson County.

.054. Fish Size Limits. Fish size limits shall be the same as provided by general and special laws and proclamations issued by the Parks and Wildlife Commission for Jefferson County.

(Rules 127.70.06.055-.056 reserved.)

.057. Alligators. There shall be no open season or period of time for the taking of alligators on the area.

(Rule 127.70.06.058 reserved.)

.059. Penalties.

- (a) Section 81.006, Texas Parks and Wildlife Code, provides a penalty of not less than \$25 nor more than \$100 upon conviction of any person who shall violate any of these rules, or who shall hunt or fish at any time other than the times specified by the Parks and Wildlife Commission.
- (b) The rules and regulations herein promulgated are cumulative of all general and special laws enacted by the legislature regulating the taking of wildlife.
- .060. Penalty Application. These rules shall not apply to the Parks and Wildlife Department, its agents or employees, when in the course, acts, or procedures of conservation, removal of rough fish, or other practices deemed by the department to be in the best interest of game and fish culture and the preservation of the sports of hunting and fishing in the State of Texas.



Article 2.01b purports to establish the dates on which elections may be legally held in the State of Texas, but some question has arisen as to exactly what issues may be included on the ballot of the election held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November in even-numbered years. Due to the imminence of the upcoming November election, the secretary of state is promulgating these rules to clarify Article 2.01b of the Texas Election Code. The rules are promulgated under the authority of Article 1.03, Texas Election Code.

.001. What Elections May Be Held in the November General Election. The only issues which may be legally included on the ballot of the general election held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November in even-numbered years shall be the election of state and county officers and amendments to the constitution of this state submitted to the voters by the legislature. The offices of President and Vice-President of the United States are also voted on at this time every four years under the provision of Article 11.01 of the Texas Election Code.

.002. Prohibited Elections. No other elections of any type, including elections held by political subdivisions, bond elections, or local option elections, can be legally held on the same day as the general election held on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November in even-numbered years.

.003. Void Elections. Any election held on an unauthorized date is void.

The State Department of Highways and Public Transportation is proposing to amend Rule 101.09.00.001, which sets forth conditions under which the department will pretest and evaluate membrane curing compounds and joint sealing compounds which a producer intends for use on Texas highway projects.

The proposed amendment would add language to Section (a) whereby the cost of certain resampling and retesting of these compounds would be borne by the producer rather than the department.

Permission to stock pretested material is given under specified conditions, the agreement being by mutual consent and subject to cancellation should the established procedures be violated. The department will bear the expense of sampling and testing on materials acceptable (for stock) under the specifications, where the material is set aside for use on Texas highway projects only, and the producer will bear the cost of the inspection and testing of rejected material and of resampling and retesting material exceeding the six-month storage limit submitted for reapproval.

(b) These requirements also apply to joint sealing compound.



Food Stamps

Household Concept 326.15.26

The Department of Public Welfare proposes to amend the following rules about the household concept in the Food Stamp Program. These proposed amendments expand the definition of household in accordance with a change in United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) policy. All applications for food stamps are submitted on behalf of a household. Rule 326.15.26.001 defines household and Rule 326.15.26.004 defines economic unit for food stamp purposes. The language of Rules 326.15.26.002 and .005 is clarified. The proposed amendments make economic unit, cooking facilities, and common purchase of food all equal in defining a food stamp household.

Written comments are invited and may be sent to Susan Johnson, Administrator, Systems and Procedures Bureau-499, Department of Public Welfare, John H. Reagan Building, Austin, Texas 78701, within 30 days of the publication of this Register.

The amendments are proposed under the authority of Article 695c, Texas Civil Statutes.

.001. Household Concept.

(a) All applications shall be submitted on behalf of a household. A household is defined as any one of the following:

(1) a group of individuals who live [are living] as one economic unit, share [sharing] common cooking facilities, and for whom food is customarily purchased in common for home consumption by all members of the group;

(2) an individual living alone who purchases and prepares food for home consumption;

(3) an individual(s) [individual] residing with another [any other] person(s) [person or persons] who:

(A) is not a member of the economic group [unit] formed by such other person, or

(B) has and uses separate cooking facilities, or [and who]

(C) purchases [and prepares] food for home consumption separately from the other member of the

(4) an individual aged 60 or older who lives alone, or only with spouse, and who need not have cooking facilities if he *or she* participated in a delivered meal program or communal dining program; [or]

(5) a narcotics addict or alcoholic who is a participant in an approved drug addiction or alcoholic treatment and rehabilitation program and who receives meals through that program.

.002. Non-Household Members.

(a) The following individuals residing with a household will not be considered household members for determining the household's eligibility or basis of issuance.

(1) Roomer. A roomer is an individual to whom a household furnishes lodging, but not meals, for compensation.

(2) Boarder. A boarder is an individual to whom a household furnishes meals, but not lodging. A household with three or more boarders is ineligible for participation.

- (3) Roomer-boarder. A roomer-boarder is an individual who pays the household for meals and lodging at a rate at least equal to a one-person coupon allotment and [but] who is not a member of the [household] economic unit. If an amount less than a one-person allotment is paid, the individual will be included with or excluded from the food stamp household in accordance with Rule 326.15.26.001. [Roomer-boarders must each pay the household an amount at least equal to a one-person monthly coupon allotment. If less than this amount is paid, these individuals will be included as members of the household.] A household with three or more roomer-boarders is ineligible for participation.
- (4) Attendant or housekeeper. An attendant or housekeeper is an individual necessary for medical or child-care reasons who is not a part of the household economic unit.
- (5) Ineligible alien. An ineligible alien is an individual who does not meet the citizenship or permanent alien status [as defined]. However, the income and resources of the ineligible alien [such individual], if not otherwise excluded from the household as a roomer, boarder, or attendant, will be considered available to the household in [for the purpose of] determining the eligibility and basis of issuance for the remaining household members.
- (6) Student tax dependents of ineligible households. A student shall not be considered a household member for food stamp purposes if he *or she* meets all of the following conditions:
 - (A) is 18 years of age or older,
- (B) is enrolled in an institution of higher education, and
- (C) is properly claimed as a tax dependent for federal income tax purposes by a member of another household which is not eligible for food stamps.
- (7) Others. Others are individuals who are not [a] part of the [household's] economic unit, or who do not share the common cooking facilities, or who [and do not normally] purchase their own food separately [with the household (e.g., a second family living with the food stamp household).

IA second family unit or group of individuals of three or more persons residing in the household should be considered in one of the following categories:

- [(A) as part of the economic unit of the household and their income, expense, and resources considered together with other members of the household,
- (B) as a second economic unit within the household, or
- (C) as roomer-boarders. In this situation, the household would be ineligible to participate.

- .004. Economic Unit Definition.
- (a) An economic unit is a group of individuals for whom food is customarily purchased and stored [in common] for use by all members of the group and for whom common living costs, such as [but not limited to] shelter costs, are customarily being met from the income and resources available to any individual within the group.
- (b) It is possible for more than one household to share common living quarters and even common shelter costs. In such situations, it is the responsibility of each person or group of persons to establish that they are in fact separate economic units and may apply as separate households.
- (c) Sharing of common living quarters and even common shelter costs by a group of individuals does not necessarily cause the group to be considered an economic unit. However, such sharing, along with the purchasing of food in common, are factors which strongly indicate that common living costs are shared by the group. Therefore, if any members of the group wish to be considered as separate economic units, they are responsible for establishing that they do constitute separate economic units.
 - .005. Head of Household Definition.
- (a) The head of the household is the person in whose name application is made for participation in the program, and is normally the individual who is the household's primary source of income. This person must be a household member except in cases in which the only adult member of an economic unit is an ineligible alien. In these cases, the ineligible alien adult (such an individual) may make application as head of the household on behalf of a (the) household of minors.



Texas Department of Labor and Standards

Employment Agency Division Rules Rules Concerning Labor Agencies 063.22.10

Under the authority of Article 5221a-5, Texas Civil Statutes, the Texas Department of Labor and Standards is adopting Rules 063.22.10.001-.014 as follows:

- .001. Communication and Correspondence. All communication and correspondence regarding this law should be addressed to the Division of Employment Agencies, Texas Department of Labor and Standards, P.O. Box 12157, Capitol Station, Austin, Texas 78711. If this is inconvenient, the individual should go through the local office of the Texas Department of Labor and Standards.
- .002. Notice List for Public Hearings. The department will notify all persons affected by such hearings in accordance with law. Any person wishing to receive a mailed notice of public hearings should contact the department in writing in order that they can be placed on a mailing list.

.003. Forms.

- (a) Any forms or applications necessary for the issuance of a labor agency license which are improperly completed will be returned for the applicant's completion. Failure to satisfactorily complete all required forms will necessarily delay final action on a license application.
- (b) The requirements for application, bonding, and occupation tax are described specifically in Section 3 and Section 4 of the Labor Agency Law, and applicants should consult these sections for requirements for licensing.
- (c) If facts arise during investigation for licensure which raise doubt as to the applicant's eligibility for a license under the Labor Agency Law, the department will attempt to contact each applicant in order to further ascertain such facts so that a preliminary administrative decis on in regard to licensure may be reached.
- .004. Complaints. Under Section 5 of the Labor Agency Law, complaints concerning licensed or unlicensed labor agents should be filed with the Commissioner of the Texas Department of Labor and Standards on forms to be provided on request. Such complaints must be sworn to before a notary public by the complainant.

005. Hearings.

- (a) At any time where the department is not required by law to provide administrative hearings to an applicant or a licensee, such individual may, on his or her own initiative, request a hearing before the department. This rule will only apply in uncontested cases and the granting of such a hearing will be at the sole discretion of the commissioner.
- (b) When, after a written complaint as described in Section 5 of the Labor Agency Law is filed and a preliminary administrative determination is made by the department that a hearing should be held to cancel the license of a labor agent, or at any other time when the department is required by law to provide an administrative hearing, such hearing will be held in compliance with the hearing procedures in the Labor Agency Law and the Administrative Procedure and Texas Register Act.
- .006. Prerequisite to Judicial Appeal. The administrative remedies as provided in the Labor Agency Law must be exhausted as a prerequisite to judicial appeal from any determination made by the department.
- .007. Consent to Service. Labor agents who are not available for service of process within the State of Texas will designate the Commissioner of the Texas Department of Labor and Standards as his or her agent for such service of process or pleadings. When such process is served, duplicate copies shall be filed in the office of the commissioner and the other immediately

forwarded by registered mail to the labor agent's address of record for which the process or pleadings are directed. No default in proceedings or action shall be taken against any party under this rule unless it shall be made to appear by affidavit of the commissioner that a copy of the process or pleadings was mailed to the respondent as herein required.

- .008. Subagents. Each labor agent must provide a complete list of all employees who assist that labor agent in any of the activities covered by the Labor Agency Law. This list must be revised on a monthly basis as to any terminations or new hires and such information may be filed with the nearest local office of the Texas Department of Labor and Standards.
- .009. Transfer of Registered Office. Each labor agent should notify the department at least 24 hours before he changes the address of his registered office.
- .010. Transportation of Workers Out of State. Each time a labor agent transports more then 20 common or agricultural workers out of the State of Texas in a common conveyance, such as a bus or truck, he should notify the nearest office of the department at least 48 hours before departure of such vehicle. Such notice should include the time and place of departure, worksite destination of the vehicle, and license plate number of the vehicle.
 - .011. Vehicles Used for Transporting Workers.
- (a) In every vehicle used for the transportation of employees, there must be conspicuously displayed a sign or poster listing the rate of compensation for the work to be performed by the transportees. This notice must be printed in both English and Spanish and the sign may be no less than 8-1/2 by 11 inches, or standard letter size, and the lettering will be no smaller than one-quarter inch. This notice must be displayed in the area of the vehicle where the workers ride and it must contain wage rates for all the types of work to be performed on the job and all necessary information regarding overtime pay.
- (b) The wage-rate notice as described must be posted in the transporting vehicle upon or before inception of the transporting trip to the job site. Any posting or notification of such information after the transportation has begun shall not be considered as being in compliance with this rule.
- (c) All transporting vehicles as described in Subsection (g), Section 7A, of the act, shall have prominently displayed at the entrance of the vehicle the name of the labor agent and the number of his labor agency license. The department defines "entrance" to mean the outside door of the vehicle by which the driver enters. The department requires that letters and numbers used must be at least two inches in height and of a size which is clearly discernible from a vehicle traveling parallel to the transporting vehicle.

.012. Examinations.

- (a) Examinations pursuant to Subsection (c), Section 3, of the act, shall be given to the applicant in any office of the department within 96 hours after he has given written notice to the Austin office of the department that he is ready to take the examination.
- (b) The fee for such examination shall be \$25 per person per examination. An applicant may take the examination until he achieves a satisfactory score, but each retest will require a separate examination for which a \$25 fee will be charged. Successful completion of this examination is a prerequisite of the issuance of a license under this statute.
- .013. Duplicate License. Section 10(b) of the act requires the display of a duplicate license by labor agents. The department will furnish to each licensed labor agent a pocket-size card for this purpose, and the card will contain the agent's photograph. Every subagent employed by the labor agent who carries out for his or her employer the duties of a labor agent as described in the act must carry a duplicate of such pocket card identifying his or her labor agent employer.

.014. Liability Insurance.

(a) Liability insurance as described in Subsection (e), Section 7A, must provide coverage for the licensee in not less than the following amounts:

All vehicles, regardless of amount of passengers carried: Bodily injury to or death of one person-\$100,000; coverage for loss or damage in any one accident to property of others "excluding cargo"-- \$50,000.

Operation of vehicle or vehicles designed for transportation of 12 or less passengers: Minimum limit for bodily injuries to or death of all persons injured or killed in any one accident—\$300,000.

Operation of vehicle or vehicles designed for transportation of more than 12 passengers: Minimum limit for bodily injuries to or death of all persons injured or killed in any one accident-- \$500,000.

- (b) Liability insurance as described in Subsection (e), Section 7A, of the act and above, may be purchased from any insurance carrier authorized to do business in the State of Texas.
- (c) Since Section 7A(e) requires insurance coverage for vehicles operated or owned by a licensee for the transportation of workers, the department stresses that the insurance requirements apply to both owned and non-owned vehicles.
- (d) Satisfactory evidence of insurance in force shall be filed with the department in connection with any license application or renewal.

(e) Satisfactory evidence that other insurance is in force which satisfied in whole or part the insurance coverage requirements will be accepted as showing compliance with the insurance requirement to the extent of such coverage. (Example: Licensees with existing workman's compensation insurance may meet part of the liability requirements of this act.)

- .005. Finding of Fact After having conducted continuous research and investigations of the supply, economic value, environment, breeding habits, and sex ratios of the wildlife resources and the factors affecting their increase or decrease, it is deemed expedient and in the interest of sound conservation practices to allow such wildlife resources to be taken and possessed in accordance with the regulations herein set forth.
- .006. Consent. None of the wildlife resources of the Black Gap Wildlife Management Area and the Sierra Diablo Wildlife Management Area may be taken except by holders of permits that have been issued by the Parks and Wildlife Department.
 - .007. Open Seasons -- General Rules.
- (a) Open seasons are given by their opening and closing dates and include all days between such opening and closing dates.
- (b) Seasons are closed during the hours between one-half hour after sunset and one-half hour before sunrise.
- (c) Impoundments on the Black Gap Wildlife Management Area are closed to fishing.
- (d) Access to the Rio Grande and camps on the Rio Grande are closed to fishermen during deer and javelina seasons.
- (e) Hours during which migratory birds may be taken may be further restricted by the Migratory Game Bird Rules 127.70.02.002-.007.
- (f) It is unlawful to take any of the wildlife resources of the areas except during the open seasons as indicated in these rules.

.010. Definitions.

(a) "Department" or "Parks and Wildlife Department" is defined, as the context requires, as either the Parks and Wildlife Department or a specifically authorized employee thereof.

- (b) The following are "game animals": wild antelope, wild black bear, wild deer, wild elk, wild javelina, wild desert bighorn sheep, wild gray or cat squirrels, and wild fox or red squirrels. (Section 63.001, Texas Parks and Wildlife Code)
- (c) A "buck deer" is defined as a deer having a hardened antler protruding through the skin.
- (d) An "antlerless deer" is defined as a deer having no hardened antler protruding through the skin.
- (e) The following are "game birds": wild turkey, wild ducks of all varieties, wild geese of all varieties, wild brant, wild grouse, wild prairie chicken or pinnated grouse, wild pheasants of all varieties, wild partridge of all varieties, wild quail of all varieties, wild red-billed pigeons and wild band-tailed pigeons, wild mourning doves, wild white-winged doves, wild snipe of all varieties, wild shore birds of all varieties, wild Mexican pheasants or chachalacas, wild plover of all varieties, and wild sandhill cranes. (Section 64.001, Texas Parks and Wildlife Code)
- (f) "Migratory birds" are wild ducks, geese, brant, mourning and white-winged doves, common snipe or Wilson's snipe or jacksnipe, plover, sandhill cranes, coot, rail, gallinules, and woodcock.
- (g) A "bearded hen" is defined as a female turkey possessing a clearly visible beard protruding through the feathers of the breast.
- (h) The following are "fur-bearing animals": wild beaver, wild otter, wild mink, wild ring-tailed cat, wild badger, wild polecat or skunk, wild raccoon, wild muskrat, wild opossum, wild fox, and wild civet. (Section 71.001, Texas Parks and Wildlife Code)

.011. General Regulations.

- (a) Hunters, fishermen, and campers will be required to occupy designated campsites only.
- (b) All hunters, fishermen, and campers will be required to register at headquarters on arrival and departure.
- (c) All vehicles will be restricted to use of designated roads. Fishermen and campers will be required to use Maravillas Canyon and Horse Canyon Roads only, while going to and from the Rio Grande. Parking will be permitted only in designated areas.

- (g) No person may possess or consume alcoholic beverages within the areas.

- (h) No person may hunt, take, or kill, or attempt to hunt, take, or kill any game bird, game animal, or other protected species of wildlife from a motor vehicle or from any aircraft or any airborne device.
- (i) Employees of the Parks and Wildlife Department may remove parts from specimens harvested on management areas for scientific investigation when needed.
- (j) Any person hunting deer or javelina on any wildlife management area, other than bowhunters during a special archery-only season, must visibly wear a minimum of 400 square inches of daylight fluorescent orange material with 144 square inches appearing on both the chest and back.

(Rules 127.70.04.012-.015 reserved.)

.016. Means and Methods. It shall be unlawful to take or kill or attempt to take or attempt to kill any game animals or game birds except by the means and methods authorized in these rules.

.017. Rifle and Shotgun.

- (a) It shall be lawful to shoot game animals and game birds, other than migratory game birds, with a rifle or shotgun capable of and designed for being shot from the shoulder.
- (b) It is unlawful to shoot any migratory game bird with a shotgun that is not permanently plugged to three-shot capacity.
- (c) It is unlawful to use any rimfire ammunition, .22 caliber jet gun, or rocket gun in the shooting of deer and javelina.

(Rule 127.70.04.018 reserved.)

019. Hunting Deer with Dogs.

- (a) It shall be unlawful to use a dog or dogs in hunting, pursuing, or taking deer.
- (b) It shall be lawful to use a dog or dogs in trailing wounded deer.
- (c) A wounded deer is defined as a deer leaving a blood trail.

(Rules 127.70.04.020-.023 reserved.)

.024. Hunting Permits.

- (a) Any special permit that may be issued for the hunting of wildlife species on the Black Gap and Sierra Diablo Wildlife Management Areas shall be made available to applicants in such a way as to give all applicants an impartial opportunity to obtain such a permit to the extent of the total number issued.
- (b) All hunting and trapping shall be by special permit.
- .025. Checking Game. All game birds, game animals, and furbearers taken or killed on the Black Gap and Sierra Diablo Wildlife Management Areas must be checked at area headquarters before the hunter or trapper leaves the premises.

- .026. Fishing Permits. Fishing privileges shall be extended to the public in a fair and impartial manner.
 - .027. Tagging of Game.
- (a) The sex of any deer to be taken shall be determined at the time of the hunt and stipulated on the permit issued by the Parks and Wildlife Department.
- (b) The carcass of any deer in the possession of any person shall have attached thereto a tag issued to such person on his valid hunting license; in addition, a special tag issued from the area headquarters must be attached to each deer until the deer is processed for consumption.

- .032. Open Seasons and Bag Limits for Game Animals and Predators. It shall be unlawful to take any game animals at any time other than during the open seasons provided in these rules, or to take more than the daily limits, or to have in possession more than the possession limits.

- (b) Sierra Diablo Unit: Open season: November 27-December 2, 1976. Bag limit: one deer, sex to be determined at time of hunt.
 - .**034**. Javelina.
- (a) Black Gap Special Javelina Season: January 15-20, 1977, by permit. Bag limit: one javelina.
 - (b) Sierra Diablo Unit: No open season.
 - .035. Squirrel. No open season.
- .036. Predatory Animals. No open season, except coyotes may be taken by permit holders during any open-game season.
 - .037. Turkey. No open season.
 - .038. Quail.
- (a) Black Gap Unit: Open season: October 2-3, 9-10; November 13-14, 20-21, 27-28; December 4-5, 11-12, 18-19, 1976. Bag limit: 12 quail per day.
 - (b) Sierra Diablo Unit: No open season.
 - .039. Migratory Birds.
 - (a) Black Gap Unit:
- (1) Mourning doves: Open season: September 4-6, 11-12; October 2-3, 9-10; from noon to sunset. Bag limit: 10 doves per day.
- (2) White-winged doves: Open season: September 4-6, 11-12 from noon to sunset. Bag limit: 10 white-winged doves per day.
- (b) Sierra Diablo Unit: No open season on either species of dove.
- .040. Pheasant. No open season. (Rules 127.70.04.041..045 reserved.)

- .046. Furbearers. No open season.
- (Rules 127.70.04.047-.049 reserved.)
- .050. Fish. It shall be unlawful to take or possess any fish in greater numbers or at any time other than as permitted under the general fishing laws applicable in Brewster and Culberson Counties.
 - .051. Seasons.
- (a) Impoundments on the Black Gap Widlife Management Area are closed to fishing.
- (b) Access to the Rio Grande and camps on the Rio Grande is closed to fishermen and campers during the deer and javeling seasons.
- .052. Means and Methods Means and methods of fishing shall be the same as provided by general and special laws for the counties of Brewster and Culberson.
- .053. Bag Limits. Bag limits for fish shall be the same as provided by general and special laws for the counties of Brewster and Culberson.

- .060. Penalties.
- (a) Section 81.006, Texas Parks and Wildlife Code, provides a penalty of not less than \$25 nor more than \$100 upon conviction of any person who shall violate any of these rules, or who shall hunt or fish at any time other than the times specified by the Parks and Wildlife Commission.
- (b) The rules and regulations herein promulgated are cumulative of all general and special laws enacted by the legislature regulating the taking of wildlife.



- (e) The following are "game birds": wild turkey, wild ducks of all varieties, wild geese of all varieties, wild brant, wild grouse, wild prairie chicken or pinnated grouse, wild pheasants of all varieties, wild partridge of all varieties wild quail of all varieties, wild red-billed pigeons or wild band-tailed pigeons, wild mourning doves, wild white-winged doves, wild snipe of all varieties, wild shore birds of all varieties, wild Mexican pheasants or chachalacas, wild plover of all varieties, and wild sandhill cranes. (Section 64.001, Texas Parks and Wildlife Code)
- (f) "Migratory birds" are wild ducks, geese, brant, mourning and white-winged doves, common snipe or Wilson's snipe or jacksnipe, plover, sandhill cranes, coot, rail, gallinules, and woodcock.
- (g) A "bearded hen" is defined as a female turkey possessing a clearly visible beard protruding through the feathers of the breast.
- (h) The following are "fur bearing animals": wild beaver, wild ofter, wild mink, wild ring-tailed cat, wild badger, wild polecat or skunk, wild raccoon, wild muskrat, wild opossum, wild fox, and wild civet. (Section 71.001, Texas Parks and Wildlife Code)
- .011. Possession of Weapons It shall be unlawful for any person to possess any type of firearms, or bow and arrow, on any wildlife management area, except persons possessing a bona fide permit issued by the Parks and Wildlife Department to hunt on the area, or commissioned law enforcement officers and department employees in the performance of their duties.

(Rules 127.70.06.012:.015 reserved)

- .016. Means and Methods. It shall be unlawful to take or kill or attempt to take or attempt to kill any game animals or game birds except by the means and methods authorized by these rules.
 - 017. Rifle and Shotgun.
- (a) It shall be lawful to shoot game animals and game birds, other than migratory game birds, with a rifle or shotgun capable of and designed for being shot from the shoulder.
- (b) It is unlawful to shoot any migratory game bird with a shotgun that is not permanently plugged to three-shell capacity.

(Rule 127.70.06.018 reserved.)

- .019. Migratory Birds: Means and Methods.
- (a) The following means and methods shall be lawful in the taking of migratory birds on the area:
- (1) artificial decoys, manual or mouth-operated birdcalls, shotgun not larger than 10 gauge and permanently plugged to three-shell capacity;



- (2) taking from floating craft (other than a sinkbox) which is beached, at anchor, or tied within or alongside a fixed hunting blind;
- (3) taking by the use of power boats, sail boats, or other craft when used solely as a means of picking up dead or injured birds.
- (b) All other means and methods of taking migratory birds on the area shall be unlawful.

(Rules 127.70.06.020-.023 reserved.)

- .024. Hunting Permits
- (a) Any special permit that may be issued for the hunting of wildlife species on the J. D. Murphree Wildlife Management Area shall be made available to applicants in such a way as to give all applicants an impartial opportunity to obtain such a permit to the extent of the total number issued.
- (b) All hunting and trapping shall be by special permit.
- .025. Checking Game. All game birds, game animals, and fur-bearers taken or killed on the J. D. Murphree Wildlife Management Area must be checked at area headquarters before the hunter or trapper leaves the premises.
- .026. Fishing Permits. Fishing privileges shall be extended to the public in a fair and impartial manner.
 - .027. General Regulations.
- (a) No business concessions such as selling, renting, leasing, or peddling goods, merchandise, or services to the public may be maintained within the area.
- (b) No overnight camping will be allowed within the boundaries of the area except as may be permitted under stipulated lease agreements or permits issued by the department.
- (c) No person may enter or attempt to enter with a gun, rifle, or any other firearm on the area except persons duly selected through an impartial method to hunt on the area or bona fide employees of the department in the performance of their duties; provided, however, persons duly authorized by department employees in charge may cross the area to gain access to adjacent areas when traveling designated routes, and no hunting or fishing may be done while en route to adjacent areas; and provided that any person who crosses the area shall have in his possession evidence of his authority to enter the adjacent areas.
- (d) No person may possess or consume alcoholic beverages within the area.
- (e) No person may damage or attempt to damage any plant life, area levee facility, improvement, or property within the area.
- (f) Employees of the Parks and Wildlife Department may remove parts from specimens harvested on management areas for scientific investigation when needed.

- (g) No dogs are allowed within the area except that one dog per permit-holding hunter is permitted to retrieve dead or wounded waterfowl.
- (h) No person may dump trash or garbage or attempt to dump trash or garbage within the area, and no person may litter the area in any manner, and persons authorized to hunt or fish shall leave their assigned area in a tidy condition.
- (i) No water skiing shall be permitted in or on the area.
- (j) Airboats are not permitted within the wildife management area except in Big Hill Bayou.
- (k) Boats, skiffs, or floating craft of any type may not be left overnight in the management area.

(Rules 127.70.06.028-.031 reserved.)

- .032. Open Seasons and Bag Limits for Game Animals and Predators. It shall be unlawful to take any game animals at any time other than during the open seasons provided in these rules, or to take more than the daily bag limits, or to have in possession more than the possession limits
- ...033. Game Animals. No open season.

(Rules 127.70.06.034 - .036 reserved.)

- .037. Turkey No open season.
- .038. Quail. No open season
- .039. Migratory Birds.
- (a) Teal ducks only: Open season to correspond with the season set for teal ducks by the Migratory Game Birds Rules 127 70.02.002-.007.
- (b) Other migratory waterfowl: ducks, geese, and coots. Open season: Every Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday of the duck season for Jefferson County as set in the Migratory Game Birds Rules 127.70.02.002-.007, except there will be no hunting on Thanksgiving, Christmas, or New Year's Day. If any of these holidays fall on a Tuesday, Thursday, or Saturday, the next Wednesday, Friday, or Monday will be hunted in lieu thereof
- (c) Bag and possession limits: To correspond with the bag and possession limits set by the Migratory Game Birds Rules 127.70.02.002-.007.
 - (d) Other migratory birds: No open season.

(Rules 127.70.06.040-.042 reserved.)

- .043. Fur Bearing Animals. Fur bearing animals may be taken in any number at any time, but by permit only, and the pelts may not be taken for sale except during the open season provided in these rules. Mink may not be hunted with dogs.
- .044. Muskrat. The pelts of muskrats may be taken for sale only during the period November 15 through March 15. (Section 72.002, Texas Parks and Wildlife Code)

- .045. Mink. The pelts of mink may be taken for sale only during the period November 15 through January 15. (Section 72.002, Texas Parks and Wildlife Code)
- .046. Other Fur-Bearing Animals. The pelts of furbearing animals other than muskrat and mink may be taken for sale only during the period December 1 through January 31 at any time. (Section 72.002, Texas Parks and Wildlife Code)
- .047. Nutria Nutria may be taken in any number at any time, but by permit only.

(Rules 127.70,06.048-.049 reserved.)

.050. Fish. It shall be unlawful to take or possess any fish in greater numbers or at any time other than as permitted in these rules.

.051. Sea. ons

- (a) In that portion of Big Hill Bayou which lies within the J. D. Murphree Wildlife Management Area, fishing will be permitted from January 16 through October 31, both days inclusive, from sunrise to sunset.
- (b) In the remainder of the wildlife management area, fishing will be permitted from March 1 through August 31, both days inclusive, from sunrise to sunset, except that when required for the proper management of waterfowl resources, compartments may be closed to fishing for temporary periods of time.
- (c) Powered skiffs, powered boats, or powered floating craft of any type with motor not to exceed 25 horsepower will be permitted within compartments during the period from March I through August 31.
- (d) Boats, skiffs, or floating craft of any type are not permitted in the ditches along the west boundary of compartments 5, 6, 7, 8, and 9, and the north boundary of compartment 11, during the period from March 1 through August 31, both days inclusive.
 - ,052. Means and Methods.
- (a) A person may take fish within compartment and borrow-ditch areas only by means of rod and reel, pole and line, and throwline.
- (b) No fishing lines shall be left unattended at any time within compartment and borrow-ditch areas.
- (c) Means and methods of fishing in Big Hill Bayou shall be the same as provided by general and special laws and proclamations issued by the Parks and Wildlife Commission for Jefferson County, except that seines and nets other than 20-foot minnow seines are prohibited.
- (d) All other means and methods of taking fish within the J. D. Murphree Wildlife Management Area shall be unlawful.
- .053. Bag Limits. Bag limits for fish shall be the same as provided by general and special laws and proclamations issued by the Parks and Wildlife Commission for Jefferson County.

.054. Fish Size Limits. Fish size limits shall be the same as provided by general and special laws and proclamations issued by the Parks and Wildlife Commission for Jefferson County.

(Rules 127.70.06.055:.056 reserved.)

.057. Alligators. There shall be no open season or period of time for the taking of alligators on the area.

(Rule 127.70.06.058 reserved.)

.059. Penalties

- (a) Section 81.006, Texas Parks and Wildlife Code, provides a penalty of not less than \$25 nor more than \$100 upon conviction of any person who shall violate any of these rules, or who shall hunt or fish at any time other than the times specified by the Parks and Wildlife Commission
- (b) The rules and regulations herein promulgated are cumulative of all general and special laws enacted by the legislature regulating the taking of wildlife.
- .060. Penalty Application. These rules shall not apply to the Parks and Wildlife Department, its agents or employees, when in the course, acts, or procedures of conservation, removal of rough fish, or other practices deemed by the department to be in the best interest of game and fish culture and the preservation of the sports of hunting and fishing in the State of Texas.
