ANNUAL MEETING INFORMATION

The annual meeting will be held in Kerrville at Schreiner College on September 25 and 26 (Friday and Saturday). The meeting will be held in the Dietert Auditorium. Exhibitor displays and refreshments during the meeting will be located in the Moody Science Hall, the adjacent building. Registration will be from 11:30 AM to 1:00 FM in the auditorium lobby. - Schedule of Events The meeting will begin at 1:00 FM on Friday with the annual business meeting. This will be followed by a panel discussion on "Fond Management for Recreational Fishing." Included in the panel discussion will be presentations on fertilization and supplemental feeding, a catch—and—release case history, managing for trophy fish, management of panfish/prey, fee fishing and a special invited presentation by Dr. Bill Davies from Auburn University entitled "Developing Appropriate Harvest Strategies for Warmwater Fish Populations in the Southeastern United States." A beer and barbecue social is scheduled for Friday evening. Contributed papers will be presented Saturday morning and the meeting should adjourn by 12:00 PM.
