APPORTIONED REGISTRATION MANUAL

Purpose:

This manual has been prepared as a guide to securing apportioned registration in Texas and should provide basic information needed when preparing applications for apportioned registration. Of course, the contents will not cover every unique situation which may arise. Contact the Vehicle Titles and Registration Division (VTR), Registration Auditing Branch in Austin or your local VTR Regional Office if additional information is needed.

The Registration Auditing Branch processes all apportioned renewal applications during the annual renewal period (January 1 - April 15). Renewals should be submitted to the Registration Auditing Branch by January 15, 1998. After April 15, renewals <u>must</u> be submitted to the Regional Offices.

<u>All</u> new accounts and supplemental applications must be handled by the local Regional Offices. Do not submit these applications to the Registration Auditing Branch in Austin.

APPORTIONED REGISTRATIONS

Summary

The International Registration Plan (IRP) is a program for licensing commercial vehicles (trucks, trailers and buses) engaged in interstate operations among member jurisdictions (states or provinces). Currently there are 49 states plus the Canadian Provinces of Alberta, British Columbia and Saskatchewan that are member jurisdictions of the IRP. Refer to pages 45 - 49 for a list of participating jurisdictions. The District of Columbia is a new member of the IRP for the 1998 - 1999 registration year.

In this program, an interstate carrier files an application for apportioned registration with the state or province where the carrier is based. On the application, the carrier lists the vehicles in the fleet and the miles in each state the vehicle has traveled. The base jurisdiction collects the license registration fee and distributes it to the other jurisdictions based on the percentage of miles the carrier has traveled in a given jurisdiction. The base jurisdiction also issues a license plate showing that the fees are "apportioned" and a cab card showing the jurisdiction and weights for each state or province for which the carrier has paid fees.

The base license plate and the cab card are the only <u>registration</u> credentials that a carrier needs to operate in member jurisdictions under the International Registration Plan.

Fee Coverage

The payment of fees for apportioned plates and cab cards cover only the license plates and registration fees for the jurisdictions printed on the cab cards.

The fees **do not** include the following:

- 1. Any motor fuel taxes or fuel permit fees.
- 2. Any permits to exceed the maximum length, width, height or axle limitations.
- 3. Any operating authority as required by any state or province.
- 4. Any registration or license fee from a state or province that is not a member of the IRP.

Refer to pages 50 - 63 for addresses and telephone numbers to obtain fuel permits, operating authority and oversize and overweight permits from member jurisdictions.

Who Must Obtain IRP Registration

You must obtain apportioned registration for your fleet if you operate in Texas and any other IRP jurisdiction and:

- your fleet is used for the transportation of persons for hire or is designed, used or maintained primarily for the transportation of property, and
- is a power unit with 3 or more axles (regardless of weight), and/or
- is a combination of vehicles where the weight of the combination is over 26,000 lbs. (Arizona over 6,000 lbs.)

Vehicles or combinations thereof, having a gross vehicle weight of 26,000 lbs. or less, two-axle vehicles, and buses used in transportation of chartered parties may be proportionally registered at the option of the registrant.

In Texas, the only vehicles that must be apportioned are the power units. This is true of other jurisdictions except for vehicles that travel into **California**; then you must register all full trailers, semi-trailers and converter gears in addition to your power units. **Wyoming** requires that fleets with **intrastate** operating authority must apportion trailers.

Full trailers and semi-trailers are issued a cab card and an apportioned license plate. Converter gears are issued a cab card only.

If you do not travel into California and/or you do not have Wyoming intrastate operating authority, you must secure token trailer plates from your local County Tax Assessor-Collector.

Exemptions

These vehicles do not need to be licensed with apportioned registration:

- 1. Government owned vehicles.
- 2. City pickup and delivery vehicles.
- 3. Buses used to transport chartered groups.
- 4. Recreational vehicles.
- 5. Vehicles displaying a restricted plate.

How Fees Are Apportioned

The following is a simplistic example of how the registration for a power unit in Texas is apportioned. The operator of this unit drives in Texas, Oklahoma, Kansas, Louisiana and Arkansas and drives 20,000 miles per year in each jurisdiction, for a total annual mileage of 100,000. The operator (a for-hire carrier) chose the gross weight of 80,000 lbs. for each state. The apportioned license fee is computed as follows:

^{*} a 30 cent reflectorization fee (per vehicle) is added to each Texas apportioned fee.

Certain Texas counties have a local county fee consisting of a County Road and Bridge Fee and some counties also include a Child Safety Fund Fee that is added to the apportioned fee. See page 31 for a list of counties and the amount to be added to each vehicle.

In addition to the apportioned registration fees due, there is an administrative fee of \$2.00 for each apportioned license plate.

A booklet containing fee charts of IRP member jurisdictions is available upon request from the Registration Auditing Branch or your local VTR Regional Office.

Payments - Multi-Check Concept

Texas uses the multi-check concept. A carrier is required to submit one check for the Texas registration fees (payable to your local County Tax Assessor-Collector) and one check for the non-Texas fees (payable to the Texas Department of Transportation).

All checks, unless prior arrangements have been made with the VTR Regional Office, must be in the form of a cashier's check, money order, or be certified.

<u>Do not send fees with your renewal application.</u> You will receive a billing for all fees due the State of Texas and the IRP jurisdictions in which you operate.

Payments must be made at the VTR Regional Office that serves your area as indicated on the billing notice.

Federal Heavy Vehicle Use Tax

Due to Federal law, proof of payment of the Federal Heavy Vehicle Use Tax (HVUT) is required when licensing vehicles at 55,000 pounds or more gross weight or combined gross weight. Proof is not required on new or used units being titled and registered within sixty (60) days of the date shown on the bill of sale. See page 29 for a sample Schedule I (Form 2290).

Effective with the 1995 registration year, a registrant is required to provide proof of payment of HVUT when a vehicle weight is voluntarily increased to 55,000 pounds or more <u>during</u> a registration year.

In instances when the vehicle must be operated at the higher weight prior to the payment of HVUT, the registrant will be required to obtain a 72-hour or 144-hour temporary operating permit in lieu of a new cab card reflecting the higher weight.

Once proof of payment of HVUT has been presented, a new cab card reflecting the weight increase will be issued.

Acceptable proof of payment is a **copy** of a **receipted** Internal Revenue Service (IRS) Schedule I (Form 2290) for the tax period **July 1, 1997 through June 30, 1998.** The Schedule I (Form 2290) requires a listing of your equipment by vehicle identification number up to twenty-one (21) units. If your fleet exceeds 21 units, vehicle identification numbers are not required. However, the total number of units listed on LINE A, Part III, must be equal to, or more than, the number of registrations.

In lieu of a <u>receipted</u> IRS Schedule I (Form 2290), a copy of your Form 2290 (with Schedule I) <u>and</u> copies of both sides of the cancelled check will be acceptable proof of payment.

If you use owner/operators, copies of their receipted Schedule I (Form 2290) or copies of their Form 2290 (with Schedule I) <u>and</u> copies of both sides of their cancelled check must be included.

THIS INFORMATION MUST ACCOMPANY YOUR APPLICATION OR THE APPLICATION WILL BE RETURNED. Questions regarding this tax should be directed to the Internal Revenue Office at 1-800-829-1040 or to a local IRS office.

Proof of Financial Responsibility (Liability Insurance)

Texas has mandatory automobile liability insurance and has a financial responsibility law that requires a vehicle owner, when involved in an accident in which personal injury, death, or property damage of \$1,000.00 or more occurs, to show proof of his ability to respond to liability for damages when there is a reasonable probability of a judgement in the following amounts:

- 1. \$20,000.00 because of bodily injury to or death of one person in any one accident,
- 2. \$40,000.00 because of bodily injury to or death of two or more persons in any one accident, subject to limit of \$20,000.00 for one person, and
- 3. \$15,000.00 because of injury to or destruction of property of others in any one accident.

Current proof of financial responsibility <u>must be submitted with an application for initial</u> <u>registration, renewal of registration or transfer of registration.</u> This requirement is a MUST, regardless of whether registration is accomplished in person or by mail.

The most common evidence of financial responsibility is a liability insurance card issued to the policy holder by the insurance company. Examples of other types of acceptable proof include insurance policies and binders, pool coverage documents and certificates of self-insurance, bond, etc.

Leases:

When the lessor provides the insurance and the insurance documents reflect their name, a copy of the lease agreement with that company <u>must</u> be included with your apportioned renewal application.

The original or a photocopy of the evidence satisfies the requirement of proof of financial responsibility. All original documentation is returned to the applicant.

Questions about proper evidence of financial responsibility should be directed to your insurance company, your local VTR Regional Office or County Tax Assessor-Collector's Office.

Canadian Provincial Operating Authority

The government of the province of Alberta, Canada requires that all registrants desiring apportionment in Alberta must first possess Canadian Provincial Operating Authority before requesting apportionment in their province. Contact Alberta for the necessary forms. Refer to page 55 for the address and telephone number.

Motor Carrier Registration

An individual, association, corporation or other legal entity that controls, operates or directs the operation of one or more commercial motor vehicles which transport persons or cargo over a road or highway within the State of Texas is required to register as a commercial motor carrier in addition to registering the commercial motor vehicles with the Texas Department of Transportation. APPLICATIONS FOR TEXAS APPORTIONED REGISTRATION

How To Apply

Application forms are available from the Registration Auditing Branch in Austin or any of the VTR Regional Offices (addresses and telephone numbers are on pages 1 -3 of this booklet).

The registration year for Texas apportioned vehicles begins on April 1 and ends at midnight on March 31 of the next year. There is a 5 day grace period beyond this date before enforcement of expired plates begins.

There are two types of applications: manual (initial) and renewal. Manual forms are used when filing a new account in Texas. New accounts may be filed at any time during a registration year, but they must be filed with the VTR Regional Office that serves your area.

Renewal applications are computer generated forms that contain information about currently registered apportioned accounts. Each fleet has a separate renewal application. These forms are mailed to the carriers in December and must be updated and returned to this office by <u>January 15th</u> to insure that the apportioned plates are ready to be picked up at the VTR Regional Office before the current plates expire.

MANUAL APPLICATION FORMS

Complete and submit the following:

- Texas Apportioned Registration Application (Schedule A)
- Texas Schedule B (Mileage Schedule)
- International Registration Plan Cab Card Weight Schedule

Also include:

- Proof of payment of the Federal Heavy Vehicle Use Tax described on page 6, sample on page 29, if required
- Proof of financial responsibility (liability insurance) described on page 7

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING THE TEXAS APPORTIONED APPLICATION - SCHEDULE A

Manual Application Forms Fleet Information

- Name of Applicant Applicant's name shall be the full name of the operating carrier or name under which the individual does business.
- Physical Address Enter the address where the <u>registrant</u> has an established place of business, maintains operational records of the fleet and accrues mileage. The physical address must be in Texas and <u>cannot</u> be a post office box. Proof of Texas residency is required, which may include a current utility bill, telephone listing or Texas driver's license. Licensing companies must show the physical address of the registrant.
- Mailing Address Enter the street, city, state and zip code. A Texas address is required; however, you may utilize a post office box. Correspondence is sent to this address.
- License Year Enter the license year for which registration is being applied and fees are to be collected.
- Fleet Number The one or two digit number you have assigned to the fleet. (Fleet 5 is reserved for 5 year trailer accounts.) Please be consistent with your fleet number from one year to the next.

Account Number - Your assigned account number. If you have not been assigned a number, write the word "New."

Person Responsible - Person to contact during normal business hours regarding information on the application. Be sure to include their Texas telephone number and area code.

Vehicle Information

- 1. Owner's Equipment Number Enter the unit number or equipment number assigned by the registrant. Each piece or unit of equipment must have a specific IRP identifier. Limit this number to six digits.
- 2. Year Enter the model year of the vehicle.
- 3. Make of Vehicle Enter the manufacturer's make of the vehicle.
- 4. Vehicle Identification Number Enter the complete vehicle identification number (VIN) as shown on your vehicle's certificate of title. Do not merely list the last six digits of the VIN.
- 5. Vehicle Type Enter the type of vehicle by using the "Type" code key shown on the lower portion of form Schedule A.
- 6. Axles or Seats Enter the number of axles (including axles in a tandem group) or the rated seating capacity if the vehicle is a bus.
- 7. Unladen Weight Enter the actual weight of the vehicle, including the cab, body and all accessories the vehicle is equipped with for normal use on the highway excluding the weight of any load. This weight is indicated on your Texas title or Title Application Receipt (or Form 31).
- 8. Fuel Enter the type of fuel being used by the power unit; see "Fuel Key" shown on the form Schedule A.
- 9. Gross or Combined Gross Weight Enter the maximum gross weight or combined gross weight that is carried on the vehicle or vehicle combination at any one time.
- 10. Purchase Price of Vehicle Enter the actual purchase price of the vehicle paid by the current owner, including accessories or modifications attached to the vehicle.
- 11. Date of Purchase and/or Lease Enter the month and year in which the vehicle was purchased by the current owner, or if leased, enter the month and year when the lease was initiated.

- 12. Owner/Operator or Service Representative Enter the name of the lessor if the registrant is not the owner of the vehicle. This name is shown on your Texas title or Title Application Receipt.
- 13. Texas Title Number and or Title Application Receipt Document Number Enter the current Texas title number, or in the case of a recent purchase, list the Title Application Receipt Document Number (located in the upper right hand corner of the form) and date indicating that an application for Texas title has been filed. <u>Title Application Receipts over 120 days old are not acceptable</u>. In this case, contact your County Tax Assessor-Collector.
- 14. Current Texas License Number Enter the Texas license plate number that is presently displayed on the vehicle.
- 15. Apportioned Fee Computation is not required. The apportioned fee is derived by multiplying the full Texas registration fee times the Texas percent factor. See example below:

Trailer equipment fee - trailer equipment is a flat fee of \$15.30 per unit. Converter gears are issued "no-fee" Texas cab cards if you operate into California.

If your county has opted for the County Road and Bridge Fee and the Child Safety Fund Fee, the total fee is increased by the amount set by your county times the number of units.

Texas fee charts are included in this booklet for your use in determining Texas fees. The chart on page 39 is for tractor-trailer combinations and the chart on page 41 is for single trucks that <u>do not</u> pull trailers.

<u>Please do not send fees with your application</u>. A billing notice is mailed to you as soon as the proper fees are calculated. Payment is not required until the plates are picked up at the VTR Regional Office.

Do not list vehicles if:

- They are not operated interstate
- They are not titled in Texas
- The Federal Heavy Vehicle Use Tax has not been paid (if required)
- You cannot provide proof of financial responsibility

A signature is required on the Schedule A.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING SCHEDULE B FOR MANUAL APPLICATIONS

Fleet Information

- Name of Applicant Applicant's name shall be the full name of the operating carrier or name under which the individual does business (same as on Schedule A).
- Physical Address Enter the address, including county name, where the registrant has an established place of business, maintains operational records of the fleet and accrues mileage. The physical address must be in Texas and cannot be a post office box. Proof of Texas residency is required, which may include a current utility bill, telephone listing or Texas driver's license.
- Account Number Enter the Texas assigned IRP account number. If you have not been assigned a number, leave this area blank and a permanent IRP number will be assigned when your application is processed.
- Type of Operation This portion of the form must be completed. Enter all applicable data. It is important to provide us with your Federal Tax Identification Number or social security number to be used in the case of refunds. Provide your TXDOT Motor Carrier Registration Number issued by the Motor Carrier Division. If you are a hazardous materials carrier, check the box and sign the statement declaring knowledge of the applicable provisions of any state motor carrier safety regulation or hazardous materials regulations. Provide your title and the date.

NOTICE OF FEDERAL MOTOR CARRIER SAFETY REGULATIONS AND HAZARDOUS MATERIALS REGULATIONS FOR OWNERS OF THE FOLLOWING LISTED VEHICLES:

- * VEHICLES WEIGHING IN EXCESS OF 10,000 LBS.
- * FARM VEHICLES WEIGHING IN EXCESS OF 10,000 LBS.
- * VEHICLES TRANSPORTING 15 OR MORE PASSENGERS
- * VEHICLES TRANSPORTING HAZARDOUS MATERIAL REQUIRING A PLACARD

"Payment of required registration fees is a declaration of knowledge that Texas has adopted and enforces the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Regulations and Hazardous Materials Regulations, and it is the obligation of the registrant to be familiar with applicable requirements."

Mileage Information - Estimated Mileage Only

On an initial apportioned application in Texas, use estimated miles in all states and Canadian Provinces in which you anticipate movement of your vehicles. The estimated mileage figures should be realistic for your particular operation. We recommend the use of the Estimated Mileage Guide on page 30.

Mileage figures should reflect <u>fleet</u> miles, not individual vehicle miles. On the mileage schedule form, record your estimates to the right of the jurisdiction in which you anticipate travel. Total all mileage and record your total figure in the space to the right of the box labeled "Total Actual Miles Plus Estimated Miles 2."

Computation of percentages is not required; we compute these figures for you. Percentages are shown on the billing notice that you will receive. However, if you choose to compute percentages, divide each jurisdiction's mileage by the total miles. List the percentage beside each jurisdiction in the space provided. Carry the percentage out five places (example: .53261).

The Texas mileage percentage is equal to 100% minus the percentage of estimated mile jurisdictions with which you are apportioning. Texas claims all miles estimated in jurisdictions that do not require apportioned registration and grant free interstate reciprocity movements.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING THE INTERNATIONAL REGISTRATION PLAN TEXAS CAB CARD WEIGHT SCHEDULE

<u>Manual or Renewal Forms</u> - There is no need to submit a cab card weight schedule on renewal applications if weights are to remain the same as the previous year.

Name of Applicant - Enter the applicant's name as it appears on the Schedule A and B for this fleet.

Apportioned Account Number (IRP Account Number) - Enter the assigned account number for this fleet. Check the correct box indicating if the application is a new account (original) or a renewal. Check "supplement" if you are adding vehicles to an existing fleet. Provide the fleet number and/or supplement number, if applicable.

In order for a registrant's cab cards to be prepared properly and reflect the correct weights in each jurisdiction, this form must be completed.

If the weights in the IRP jurisdictions are to be comparable with your Texas weight, make that statement on the face of your cab card weight schedule and we will automatically put in the proper weight.

If the weights vary, a separate entry must be made. If the weights are going to be uniform, then only one entry is necessary, such as "all units," and the desired weight entered for each jurisdiction.

All vehicles listed on the cab card weight schedule must be in the same order as they appear on the Apportioned Application Schedule A.

Apportioned License Plates and Cab Cards

An apportioned license plate and cab card are issued to each vehicle in the fleet. The cab card lists the apportioned IRP jurisdictions and the applicable unladen, gross or combined gross weight.

Cab cards only are issued on converter gears if you operate into California.

The <u>original</u> cab card (no copies) must be carried in the cab of the vehicle to which it is issued. No exceptions!

The license plates and cab cards must be picked up at the VTR Regional Office indicated on the billing that you will receive after your application is processed.

REVIEW THE STATES SHOWN ON THE BILLING FOR ANY ERRORS. ANY CORRECTIONS MUST BE MADE BY THE REGISTRATION AUDITING BRANCH BEFORE THE PLATES AND CAB CARDS ARE PICKED UP!

RENEWAL APPLICATION FORMS

Complete and submit the following:

- Computer generated Texas Apportioned Registration Application
- Texas Renewal Application Mileage Schedule (Schedule B)
- International Registration Plan Cab Card Weight Schedule. This form is optional for renewal applications. See page 13 for instructions on completing the form.

Also include:

- Proof of payment of the Federal Heavy Vehicle Use Tax described on page 6, sample on page 29, if required
- Proof of financial responsibility liability insurance described on page 7

INSTRUCTIONS FOR UPDATING THE TEXAS APPORTIONED RENEWAL APPLICATION SCHEDULE A (COMPUTER FORM)

A carrier currently registered in Texas with apportioned license plates receives a renewal packet that includes a computer generated form called the Renewal Schedule A.

This computer generated renewal application is a printout of all vehicles registered in the fleet as of the printing date in the upper right hand corner. It also contains the following information:

- Fleet information (name, address, account number, type of operation)
- Vehicle information (equipment number, year, make, vehicle identification number, Texas title number, etc.)
- States and weights schedule (IRP jurisdictions and weight limits currently registered). Vehicles are listed under their registered weight group.

Update vehicle or weight information directly on the renewal form by drawing a THIN line through the items that require changes. Vehicle information <u>must</u> remain legible. Do NOT use wide tip markers or "White Out."

Delete vehicles by simply drawing a THIN line across the page through the vehicle information. Again, do NOT use wide tip markers or 'White Out."

Delete the following:

- Vehicles that are no longer in the fleet
- Vehicles that do not have current proof of the Federal Heavy Vehicle Use Tax (if required)
- Vehicles that do not have current proof of financial responsibility
- Vehicles listed on the renewal (Schedule A) that do not show a current Texas title number (zeros are shown for the title number). The vehicle will be deleted from the account unless you provide the Title Application Receipt Document Number and date. Receipts over 120 days old are not acceptable. In this case, contact your County Tax Assessor-Collector.

Each vehicle added to the renewal must also have a current apportioned license plate, and you must provide the plate number on the form. Contact your local VTR Regional Office to obtain apportioned plates if you do not currently have them for the vehicles being added.

If you are filing a renewal application but did not receive the computer generated application form, use a manual application form. Refer to page 9 for instructions on how to complete the Texas Apportioned Application, Schedule A. Use the instructions on page 16 for completing the renewal mileage schedule.

Mileage Information (Schedule B) - Renewal Application

The Texas Renewal Application, Mileage Schedule must have mileage listed that was generated in all jurisdictions by the fleet during the period from **July 1, 1996 through June 30, 1997.** See definition of preceding year on page 27. List in the proper space, to the right of the jurisdiction, the total number of miles operated by the fleet. Mileage must be shown for each jurisdiction in which the fleet operates or plans to operate.

All actual miles operated during the mileage year of July 1, 1996 through June 30, 1997 must be shown. Place a #1 next to the jurisdictions in which you plan to continue operations and mark the box to the left of the jurisdiction. Any jurisdictions in which you show actual miles but in which you no longer plan to operate should be labeled #3. Do not mark the box to the left of the jurisdiction. These miles are not included in either total. Should you decide during this registration year (April 1, 1998 through March 31, 1999) to resume operations in one of these jurisdictions, the miles listed as #3 are required to be used and are changed to estimated miles.

If you expect to operate into a jurisdiction that is new to your operation and you did not have actual miles there, you must estimate mileage. Label it as an estimate by placing a #2 next to the jurisdiction. Mark the box to the left of the jurisdiction. Do not estimate miles in jurisdictions that allow reciprocity. Refer to the estimated mileage guide on page 30.

Percent factors for the actual mile jurisdictions are based on the total of actual miles. Percent factors for estimated jurisdictions are based on the total actual miles plus estimated miles.

If your initial application was **FILED** on April 2, 1997 or later, you must again show estimated mileages and label such miles with a #2.

Fees are billed for each IRP jurisdiction in which miles were generated or miles are estimated. IRP jurisdictions are automatically updated based on the mileage schedule. It is not necessary to compute the percentages. We compute the percent factors and list them on the billing notice that you will receive. However, if you choose to compute percentages, divide the actual mile jurisdictions (labeled with #1) by the total actual fleet miles figure. Divide the estimated mile jurisdictions (labeled with #2) by the total actual miles plus estimated miles figure.

List the percentages, rounded off to five places, beside each jurisdiction in the space provided. Example: .53261.

The Texas mileage percentage is equal to 100% minus the percentage of the actual mile jurisdictions. The state of Texas claims all miles operated in jurisdictions that do not require apportioned registration and grant free interstate reciprocity movements.

Supplemental Applications - Adding/Deleting Vehicles In A Fleet

After an original application is filed and processed, vehicles can be added or deleted by filing a supplemental application form with the VTR Regional Office in your area.

Vehicles that are added as replacement units for deleted vehicles can be exchanged on a one for one basis in Texas at a charge of \$2.00 each for new apportioned license plates, provided the vehicle gross weights are the same. If your county assesses the local County Road and Bridge Fee and the Child Safety Fund Fee, you are billed accordingly.

Credits cannot be transferred from one account or fleet to another.

Several states have exceptions to their credit exchange policies. The following states allow credit only if the vehicles are exchanged on the same supplement:

Alabama	Florida	Mississippi	Saskatchewan
Arkansas	Illinois	New Jersey	Tennessee
British Columbia	Kansas	North Carolina	Utah

The state of California does not allow exchange credit.

In regard to the Colorado ownership tax, the credit applies to ownership tax exceeding ten dollars. If the vehicle being used for credit paid ten dollars or less (after the percent is applied), all ownership tax must be paid on the new vehicle.

Indiana does not allow credit on vehicles exchanged for vehicles of different types. For example, a straight truck exchanged for a truck-tractor is charged full fees in Indiana.

The apportioned license plate and cab card on deletions must be surrendered to the VTR Regional Office at the time the supplement is filed in order to receive exchange credit.

You are provided a billing on each supplemental application processed. The billing includes any fees for vehicles for which credit is not allowed.

Information on credits and refunds may be obtained from your VTR Regional Office.

Once a vehicle is apportioned, you may surrender your current Texas license plate to the VTR Regional Office for authorization of any refund due.

The same requirements must be met on supplemental applications as on original or renewal applications in regard to Texas title, IRS Schedule I (Form 2290), proof of financial responsibility and the cab card weight schedule.

TEMPORARY REGISTRATION

Temporary IRP Apportionment Authorization (AP-50)

Temporary Apportionment Authorization may be obtained from the VTR Regional Offices. The authorizations are issued in bulk to <u>approved</u> apportioned carriers and are valid for 45 days. A supplement must be filed within 20 days of receiving the temporary authorization. Loss of the Temporary Authority (AP-50) can result in assessment of a full registration fee and loss of the issuance privilege.

Texas 72/144 Hour Trip Permits

Trip permits may be obtained from any Texas County Tax Assessor-Collector's Office, VTR Regional Offices and the Registration Auditing Branch of the Vehicle Titles and Registration Division in Austin. The cost of the permits is \$25.00/\$50.00 for each vehicle in a "double bottom combination" excluding the converter axle. This permit provides for vehicles to be temporarily registered for the legal maximum weight in Texas.

Trip permits may also be obtained by calling the Texas Department of Transportation, Motor Carrier Division at 1-800-299-1700.

Permits are also available from independent permit companies, providing 24 hour service to most areas of the United States. Telephone numbers are listed below.

Applicants filing for Texas apportioned license plates who are not licensed as of **midnight April 5**, 1998 will be required to purchase regular registration to operate on <u>Texas</u> highways. Temporary 72/144 hour permits may be purchased in lieu of regular registration provided the vehicle has not been apprehended. The 72/144 permit allows operation in <u>Texas only</u> for apportioned vehicles.

One Trip Permit (Hunter's Permit)

One trip permits may be purchased at the same locations as the 72/144 hour trip permits listed above. One trip permits are issued to <u>unladen</u> vehicles at a cost of \$5.00 each and allow for the temporary movement of an unregistered vehicle. The permit is valid for 15 days from the date the registration is effective.

AUDITS

Apportioned carriers shall be required to preserve the "Operational Records" on which the registration application is based, plus the operational records for the **three** prior mileage reporting periods. Notice of intent to audit will be given the carrier. Authenticity of mileage and registration will be verified and assessment will be made for any deficiency found due. Any apportioned carrier who refuses to comply with the mileage reporting requirements shall **not** be entitled to apportioned registration privileges.

The VTR Regional Office that serves your area will conduct the audit of the operational records; therefore, questions concerning an audit of these records or record keeping should be directed to your local VTR Regional Office.

Records - These are <u>not</u> to be sent in with the renewal application.

Operational records kept by the carrier shall be documents supporting miles traveled in each jurisdiction and the total miles traveled. These documents can be fuel reports, trip sheets, logs, or computer runs that can be supported by source documents, when requested. An acceptable source document to verify fleet mileage is some type of "Individual Vehicle Mileage Record." See the example on page 32. I.V.M.R.'s should contain the following basic information:

- 1. Date (starting and ending)
- 2. Trip origin and destination
- 3 Beginning and ending odometer reading and/or route of travel
- 4. Total trip mileage including all movement, loaded, empty, deadhead and/or bobtail miles
- 5. Mileage by jurisdiction
- 6. Unit number or vehicle identification number (power/trailer)
- 7. Vehicle fleet number
- 8. Registrant's name
- 9. Driver's signature

An I.V.M.R. must be completed for each movement of the vehicles. A recap is required of mileage traveled by each individual truck on a monthly or quarterly basis with mileage totaled separately for each jurisdiction in which the vehicle traveled.

The recaps, along with the mileage source documents, must be made available when an audit of the mileage records is conducted. Registrants must be able to explain any unaccounted time lapse of vehicle movement.

Computer printouts and monthly reports, such as fuel reports, are merely recaps and are not acceptable at face value. These must be supported by an I.V.M.R. in order to be of any use during an audit. Trip leases during the mileage reporting period should be attached to the I.V.M.R. Miles operated under trip permits shall be included.

When the apportioned license plates are picked up at the VTR Regional Office, carriers are required to sign documentation stating they understand what constitutes acceptable records. Please refer to example on page 33.

VI

TYPES OF OPERATIONS

Owner-Operator Vehicles

Proportional registration for owner-operators may be accomplished in one of the following procedures:

- 1. The owner-operator (lessor) may be the registrant and the vehicle may be registered in the name of the owner-operator. The allocation of fees shall be according to the operational records of the owner-operator. The plate and cab card shall be the property of the lessor; or
- 2. The lessee may be the registrant at the option of the lessor and the vehicle may be registered by the carrier, but in both the owner-operator's name and that of the carrier as lessee, with allocation of fees according to the records of the carrier. The plates and cab cards shall be the property of the lessee.

Any refunds are issued in the name of the registrant (lessee). It is the obligation of the carrier as lessee to reimburse the lessor for the unused portion of any registration fees transferred to a newly acquired vehicle when the lease is cancelled between the parties.

Rental Vehicles

The following definitions are applicable to rental vehicles:

- 1. **Rental owner** means an owner principally engaged in renting one or more rental fleets to others or offering for rental the vehicles of such fleets without drivers.
- 2. **Rental fleet** means five or more vehicles which are rented or offered for rental without drivers and which are designated by a rental owner as a rental fleet.
- 3. Renting and leasing means the giving of possession and control of a vehicle for valuable consideration for a specified period of time.
- 4. A <u>rental transaction</u> for the rental of a vehicle shall be deemed to occur in the jurisdiction where such vehicle first comes into the possession of the user.

Rental fleets owned by any person or firm engaging in the business of renting such vehicles shall be extended full interstate and intrastate privileges, provided that:

- 1. The operational records of the fleet are maintained by the owner rental company.
- 2. Such vehicles are part of a rental fleet which are identifiable as being part of such fleet.

- 3. Such person or firm has received approval from the jurisdiction to apportion such rental fleet.
- 4. Such person or firm registers the vehicles in accordance with Articles III, IV, VI and VII of the International Registration Plan.

Household Goods Carriers

Household goods carriers, using equipment leased from service representatives, may elect to base the equipment in the base jurisdiction of the service representative or that of the carrier.

If the base jurisdiction of the service representative is elected, the equipment shall be registered in the service representative's name and the carrier as lessee. The apportionment of fees shall be according to the combined mileage records of the service representative and those of the carrier. Such records must be kept or made available in the service representative's base jurisdiction.

If the election is the base jurisdiction of the carrier, the equipment shall be registered by and in the name of the lessor. The apportioning of fees shall be according to the mileage records of the carrier and service representative which must include intrastate miles operated by those vehicles. The records must be kept or made available in the base jurisdiction of the carrier. Service representatives properly registered under this election shall be fully registered for operations under their own authority as well as under the authority of the carrier.

Equipment owned and operated by owner-operators, other than service representatives, and used exclusively to transport cargo for the household goods carrier, shall be registered by the carrier in the base jurisdiction of the carrier, but in both the owner-operator's name and that of the carrier as lessee. The apportionment of fees shall be according to the mileage records of the carrier.

Trip-Leased Vehicles

An apportioned operator may trip-lease equipment to another apportioned fleet operator and the lessor shall be responsible for reporting the miles traveled by the leased equipment on the proportional application. The lessee shall be the person using and operating the equipment under a lease agreement.

The leased vehicle must bear proportional credentials and be operated only in the jurisdictions to which fees have been paid, otherwise a trip permit will be required.

An apportioned vehicle may be trip-leased to a non-apportioned carrier. The lessor shall be responsible for reporting the mileage traveled by the leased equipment. The leased vehicle must bear proportional credentials and can be operated in the IRP jurisdictions only if fees have been paid to such IRP jurisdictions, otherwise a trip permit will be required.

VII

DEFINITIONS

Apportionable Fee - Any periodic recurring fee required for licensing or registering vehicles, such as, but not limited to registration fees, license or weight fees.

Apportionable Vehicle - Any vehicle, used or intended for use in Texas and one or more IRP member jurisdictions that allocate or proportionally register vehicles and used for the transportation of persons for hire, or designed, used, or maintained primarily for the transportation of property and:

- 1. is a power unit having a gross vehicle weight in excess of 26,000 pounds; or
- 2. is a power unit having three or more axles, regardless of weight; or
- 3. is used in combination, when the weight of such combination exceeds 26,000 pounds gross vehicle weight.

Vehicles, or combinations thereof, having a gross vehicle weight of 26,000 pounds or less and two-axle vehicles and buses used in transportation of chartered parties may be proportionally registered at the option of the registrant.

Auxiliary Axle - "Auxiliary axle" means an auxiliary undercarriage assembly with a fifth wheel and tow bar used to convert a semi-trailer to a full trailer.

Axle - "Axle" means an assembly of a vehicle consisting of two or more wheels whose centers are in one horizontal plane, by means of which a portion of the weight of a vehicle and its load, if any, is continually transmitted to the roadway. For purposes of registration under the IRP, an "axle" is any such assembly whether or not it is load-bearing only part of the time. For example, a single-unit truck with a steering axle and two axles in a rear-axle assembly is an apportionable vehicle even though one of the rear axles is a so-called "dummy," "drag," "tag," or "pusher" type axle.

Axle Weight - The weight transmitted to the surface by one axle or a combination of axles in a tandem assembly.

Base Jurisdiction - The state where the registrant has an established place of business, where mileage is accrued by the fleet, and where operational records of such fleet are maintained or can be made available.

An <u>established place of business</u> is construed to mean a physical structure owned, leased or rented by a fleet registrant and designated by street number or road location, and which is open during normal business hours and in which are located:

- 1. a telephone or telephone publicly listed in the name of the fleet registrant; and
- 2. a person or persons conducting the fleet registrant's business; and
- 3. the operational records of the fleet or such records can be made available at the site.

Base Plate - The plate issued by the base jurisdiction and the only registration identification plate issued for the vehicle by any member jurisdiction.

Base plates shall be identified by having the word "APPORTIONED" and the jurisdiction's name on the plate.

Cab Card - A registration card issued only by the jurisdiction for a vehicle of an apportioned fleet which identifies the vehicle, base plate, registered weight by jurisdictions and showing the jurisdictions where the vehicle is properly registered.

Carrier - An individual, partnership or corporation engaged in the business of transporting goods or persons.

Chartered Party - A group of persons who, pursuant to a common purpose and under a single contact, and at a fixed charge for the vehicle in accordance with the carrier's tariff, lawfully with the Interstate Commerce Commission, have acquired the exclusive use of a passenger-carrying motor vehicle to travel together as a group to a specified destination or for a particular itinerary, either agreed upon in advance, or modified by the chartered group after having left the place of origin.

Combination - A power unit used in combination with trailers and semi-trailers.

Combined Gross Weight - The weight of the power unit, trailer and the maximum load.

Commercial Vehicle - Any vehicle operated for the transportation of persons or property in advancement of any commercial or industrial enterprises, for hire or not for hire.

Converter Gear - An auxiliary under-carriage assembly with a fifth wheel and tow bar used to convert a semi-trailer to a full trailer (sometimes called a "converter dolly").

Credentials - The cab card and apportioned plate issued for vehicles registered under the apportioned registration program.

Deadhead - To operate a commercial vehicle from one point to another without transporting any type of cargo.

Double-Bottom Combination - A combination of a power unit pulling two (2) semi-trailers or a semi-trailer and a full trailer.

Fifth Wheel - A device used to connect a truck-tractor or converter gear to a semi-trailer.

Financial Responsibility - The ability of a vehicle owner to respond to liability for damages when there is a reasonable probability of a judgement in the following amounts:

- 1. \$20,000.00 because of bodily injury to or death of one person in any one accident,
- 2. \$40,000.00 because of bodily injury to or death of two or more persons in any one accident.
- 3. \$15,000.00 because of injury to or destruction of property of others in any one accident.

Fleet - One or more apportionable vehicles.

Gross Vehicle Weight - The weight of the vehicle without load plus the weight of any load thereon.

I.C.C. - An abbreviation for the United States Interstate Commerce Commission.

International Registration Plan (IRP) - An agreement between Texas and a number of other states for prorating fees between jurisdictions based on mileage traveled by a fleet in each jurisdiction.

Interstate Operations - Vehicle movement between or through two or more jurisdictions.

Intrastate Operations - Vehicle movement from one point within a jurisdiction to another point within the same jurisdiction.

I.V.M.R. - Individual vehicle mileage record.

Jurisdiction - A state, territory or possession of the United States, the District of Columbia or a Province of Canada.

Lease - A written document vesting exclusive possession, control of, and responsibility for the operation of the vehicle to the lessee for a specific period of time.

Lessee - A person, firm, or corporation having the legal possession and control of a vehicle owned by another under the terms of a lease agreement.

Lessor - A person, firm, or corporation which under the terms of a lease grants the legal right of possession, control of, and responsibility of the operation of the vehicle to another person, firm, or corporation.

Long Term Lease - A lease which covers 30 days or more.

Member Jurisdiction - State of the United States or Province of Canada which is a member of the International Registration Plan (IRP).

Mileage -

In-jurisdiction Miles - The total number of miles operated by a fleet of apportioned vehicles in a jurisdiction during the preceding year. In those cases where the registrant operated a fleet of apportioned vehicles in jurisdictions that require no apportionment and grant reciprocity, Texas adds such miles to Texas in-jurisdiction miles.

Total Miles - The total number of miles operated by a fleet of apportioned vehicles in all jurisdictions during the preceding year.

Motor Carrier - An individual, partnership or corporation engaged in the transportation of goods or persons.

Common Carrier - Any motor carrier which holds itself out to the general public to engage in the transportation by motor vehicle of passengers or property for compensation.

Contract Carrier - Any motor carrier transporting persons or property for compensation or hire under contract to a particular person, firm or corporation.

Exempt Carrier - An individual, partnership or corporation engaged in the business of transporting exempt goods or persons for compensation.

Private Carrier - A person, firm or corporation which utilizes its own trucks to transport its own freight.

Motor Vehicle Types -

Bus - A motor vehicle designed for carrying 17 or more passengers and used for the transportation of persons for compensation.

Road Tractor (Mobile Home Toter, Wrecker) - Every motor vehicle designed and used for drawing other vehicles and not so constructed as to carry any load thereon either independently or any part of the weight of a vehicle or lead so drawn.

Tractor - A motor vehicle designed and used primarily for drawing other vehicles, but not so constructed as to carry part of the load on the tractor itself (example: car hauler).

Truck - Every motor vehicle designed, used or maintained primarily for the transportation of property.

Truck-Tractor - A motor vehicle designed and used primarily for drawing other vehicles, but so constructed as to carry a load other than a part of the weight of the vehicle and load so drawn.

Operational Records - Documents supporting miles traveled in each jurisdiction and total miles traveled such as I.V.M.R.'s, fuel reports, trip sheets and logs.

Owner-Operator - "Owner-Operator" means an equipment lessor who leases his vehicular equipment with driver to a carrier.

Preceding Reporting Year - "Preceding Year" means the period of twelve (12) consecutive months immediately prior to July 1st of the year immediately preceding the commencement of the registration or license year for which apportioned registration is sought.

Proportion - A part, share, etc. in its relation to the whole. (Used synonymously with apportion, which means to divide and distribute proportionally.)

Reciprocity - Exemption from further registration by a bilateral jurisdiction of an apportionable vehicle properly registered under the agreements.

Recreational Vehicle - A vehicle designed or converted and used for personal pleasure or travel by an individual or family.

Registered Weight - The weight for which a vehicle or combination of vehicles have been licensed or registered within a particular jurisdiction.

Registrant - A person, firm or corporation in whose name or names a vehicle is properly registered.

Registration Year - The twelve (12) month period during which the registration plates issued by the base jurisdiction are valid according to the laws of the base jurisdiction. Texas' registration year is April 1 through March 31.

Rental Fleet - Five or more vehicles which are leased or offered for lease without drivers, and which are designated by the lessor as a rental fleet.

Restricted Plate - One that has time (3 months, 6 months, partial year), geographic area, mileage or commodity restriction (for example: farm, forestry or dealer plate).

Service Representative - "Service Representative" means one who furnishes facilities and services including sales, warehousing, motorized equipment and drivers under contract or other arrangements to a carrier for transportation of property by a household goods carrier.

Short Term Lease - A lease which covers less than 30 days.

Trailers (non-powered units) -

Full Trailer - A vehicle without motive power, designed for carrying persons or property and for being drawn by a motor vehicle and so constructed that <u>no</u> part of its weight and that of its load rests upon or is carried by the towing vehicle (example: pup trailer).

Semi-Trailer - A vehicle without motive power designed for carrying persons or property and for being drawn by some motor vehicle and so constructed that <u>some</u> part of its weight and that of its load rests upon or is carried by the towing vehicle.

Trip Lease - The lease of a vehicle to a lessee for a one-trip operation only.

Trip Permit - A temporary permit issued by a jurisdiction in lieu of regular registration.

Unladen Weight - The weight of the vehicle fully equipped for service excluding the weight of any load.

ACCEPTABLE MILEAGE RECORDS FOR AUDIT

Under the provisions of Article XIV of the International Registration Plan, each base jurisdiction (state) administrator may audit the supporting trip-mileage records of the registrants displaying apportion base plates from his/her jurisdiction. To qualify for apportionment, a registrant must operate interstate and must maintain accurate mileage records of the trip movements of his apportioned vehicles.

All records in support of an application must be retained for a period of three (3) years following the year for which the application is made. These records must be maintained on each individual vehicle from July 1 – June 30 of each reporting period.

Determination of Vehicle Trip Mileage:

- 1. State maps
- 2. Mileage chart

- 3. Odometer readings
- 4. Household goods mileage

Mileage operated each day is to be recorded on a source document which shall contain Items 1-6 and may include Items 7-10 at the discretion of the base jurisdiction.

- 1. Date of trip (starting and ending)
- 2. Trip origin and destination
- Route of travel and/or beginning and ending odometer or hubodometer reading of the trip
- 4. Total trip miles

- 5. Mileage by jurisdiction
- 6. Unit number or vehicle identification number
- 7. Vehicle fleet number
- 8. Registrant's name
- 9. Trailer number
- 10. Driver's signature and/or name

A registrant must maintain a recap of mileage traveled by each individual truck on a monthly or quarterly basis with mileage totaled separately for each jurisdiction in which the vehicle traveled.

Examples of Individual Vehicle Mileage Records (I.V.M.R.'s):

- 1. Driver logs (by vehicle, jurisdiction, and date)
- 2. Driver trip sheets
- 3. Receiving contracts (rental one-way)
- 4. Any other records which contain the required information (Computer printouts are acceptable | f supported by the specified I.V.M.R.'s. This information shall then be transferred to a monthly or quarterly recap.)


In recording the actual mileage of a vehicle, the carrier must record <u>all</u> trip movement (interstate and intrastate), including loaded, empty, deadhead, and/or bob-tail miles.

I have read the above and understand that failure to maintain the mileage records for my apportioned fleet as required could result in the cancellation of my apportioned privileges. These records shall be made available for audit by the Texas Department of Transportation at their request during normal business hours.
