- 5 SECTION 1. Section 6.05, Tax Code, is amended by amending
- 6 Subsection (d) and adding Subsection (j) to read as follows:
- 7 (d) The chief appraiser is entitled to compensation as
- 8 provided by the budget adopted by the board of directors. The chief
- 9 appraiser's compensation may not be directly or indirectly linked
- 10 to an increase in the total market, appraised, or taxable value of
- 11 property in the appraisal district. The chief appraiser may employ
- 12 and compensate professional, clerical, and other personnel as
- 13 provided by the budget, with the exception of a general counsel to
- 14 the appraisal district.
- 15 (j) The board of directors of an appraisal district may
- 16 employ a general counsel to the district to serve at the will of the
- 17 board. The general counsel shall provide counsel directly to the
- 18 board and perform other duties and responsibilities as determined
- 19 by the board. The general counsel is entitled to compensation as
- 20 provided by the budget adopted by the board.
- 21 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 22 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 23 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 24 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
