- 16 not in excess of \$250,000 [\$100,000] at any time during the fiscal
- 17 period.
- 18 (b) The annual financial report must be accompanied by an
- 19 affidavit attesting to the accuracy and authenticity of the
- 20 financial report signed by a duly authorized representative of the
- 21 district.

- 24 executive director within 45 days after the close of the district's
