- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 401.024, Labor Code, is amended by
- 6 amending Subsection (c) and adding Subsections (e), (f), and (g) to
- 7 read as follows:
- 8 (c) The commissioner may designate and contract with one or
- 9  $\underline{more}$  [a] data collection  $\underline{agents}$  [agent] to fulfill the data
- 10 collection requirements of this subtitle. To qualify as a data
- 11 collection agent, an organization must demonstrate at least five
- 12 years of experience in data collection, data maintenance, data
- 13 quality control, accounting, and related areas.
- (e) A data collection agent may collect from a reporting
- 15 insurance carrier, other than a governmental entity, any fees
- 16 necessary for the agent to recover the necessary and reasonable
- 17 costs of collecting data from that reporting insurance carrier.
- 18 <u>(f) A reporting insurance carrier, other than a</u>
- 19 governmental entity, shall pay the fee to the data collection agent
- 20 for the data collection services provided by the data collection
- 21 agent.
- 22 (g) The commissioner may adopt rules necessary to implement
- 23 this section.
- SECTION 2. Subsection (c), Section 406.009, Labor Code, is

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- 1 amended to read as follows:
- 2 (c) The commissioner may designate a data collection agent,
- 3 implement an electronic reporting and public information access
- 4 program, and adopt rules as necessary to implement the data
- 5 collection requirements of this subchapter. The commissioner may
- 6 establish the form, manner, and procedure for the transmission of
- 7 information to the division. A data collection agent designated
- 8 under this subsection must be qualified and may collect fees in the
- 9 manner described by Section 401.024.
- 10 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 14 Act takes effect September 1, 2011.
