HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, For well over a century, Americans have set aside a
time to honor those members of its military forces who have died in
this country's service; and

WHEREAS, Originally called Decoration Day, this special remembrance was first observed in 1868, when flowers were placed on the graves of Union and Confederate soldiers, and by the end of the 19th century, Memorial Day ceremonies were being held on May 30 throughout the nation; in 1971, Congress designated the last Monday in May as Memorial Day; and

WHEREAS, Legions of Americans have stepped forward to serve their country in times of conflict, and more than a million have made the ultimate sacrifice; they "gave the last full measure of devotion" on their native soil, in foreign lands, and on seas around the world, and on this Memorial Day, as Texans pause to remember, we commemorate with fresh sorrow all Texans who have been killed in combat; and

WHEREAS, Second only to the Vietnam War as the longest sustained U.S. military operation in history, the Global War on Terrorism has claimed the lives of nearly 6,000 American service members, including more than 500 Texans; today we expressly want to pay homage to those brave fallen soldiers and the families they left behind; and

RESOLVED, That the 82nd Legislature of the State of Texas hereby commemorate Memorial Day 2011 and express deep appreciation to all the men and women who have served our great country.
