21 WHEREAS, Over the course of his life, Mr. Decker preached 22 throughout Texas and in Indiana, California, and New Mexico, and he 23 was a longtime elder at Abilene's University Church of Christ; 24 moreover, he was a strong supporter of missionary work in Central 1 and South America; and
