4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter K, Chapter 351, Occupations Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 351.509 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 351.509. REMEDIAL PLAN. (a) The board may issue and
8	establish the terms of a remedial plan to resolve the investigation
9	of a complaint filed under this chapter.
10	(b) A remedial plan may not contain a provision that:
11	(1) revokes, suspends, limits, or restricts a person's
12	license or other authorization to practice optometry or therapeutic
13	optometry; or
14	(2) assesses an administrative penalty against a
15	person.
16	(c) A remedial plan may not be imposed to resolve a
17	<pre>complaint:</pre>
18	(1) concerning:
19	(A) a death;
20	(B) a hospitalization; or
21	(C) the commission of a felony; or
22	(2) in which the appropriate resolution may involve a
23	restriction on the manner in which a license holder practices
24	optometry or therapeutic optometry.

AN ACT

- 1 (d) The board may not issue a remedial plan to resolve a
- 2 complaint against a license holder if the license holder has
- 3 entered into a remedial plan with the board in the preceding 24
- 4 months for the resolution of a different complaint filed under this
- 5 chapter.
- 6 (e) If a license holder complies with and successfully
- 7 completes the terms of a remedial plan, the board shall remove all
- 8 records of the remedial plan from the board's records on the second
- 9 anniversary of the date the license holder successfully completes
- 10 the remedial plan.
- 11 (f) The board may assess a fee against a license holder
- 12 participating in a remedial plan in an amount necessary to recover
- 13 the costs of administering the plan.
- 14 (g) The board shall adopt rules necessary to implement this
- 15 section.
- 16 SECTION 2. The Texas Optometry Board shall adopt rules
- 17 under Section 351.509, Occupations Code, as added by this Act, not
- 18 later than January 1, 2014.
- 19 SECTION 3. Section 351.509, Occupations Code, as added by
- 20 this Act, applies only to a complaint under Chapter 351,
- 21 Occupations Code, filed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 22 A complaint under Chapter 351, Occupations Code, filed before that
- 23 date is governed by the law in effect on the date the complaint was
- 24 filed, and that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 25 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
