4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Section 39.023, Education Code, is amended by
6	amending Subsections (a), (a-1), (a-2), (b), (c-1), (c-3), (e),
7	(1), (m) , (n) , and (p) and adding Subsections $(a-3)$, $(a-4)$, $(a-5)$,
8	(a-6), (a-7), (a-8), (a-9), and (a-10) to read as follows:
9	(a) The agency shall adopt or develop appropriate
10	criterion-referenced assessment instruments designed to assess
11	essential knowledge and skills in reading, writing, mathematics,
12	social studies, and science. Except as provided by Subsection
13	(a-2), all students, other than students assessed under Subsection
14	(b) or (1) or exempted under Section 39.027, shall be assessed in:
15	(1) mathematics, [annually] in grades three <u>and five</u>
16	[through seven] without the aid of technology and in grade eight
17	with the aid of technology on any assessment instrument that
18	includes algebra;
19	(2) reading, [annually] in grades three <u>, five, and</u>
20	[through] eight;
21	(3) writing, including spelling and grammar, in grades
22	four and seven;
23	(4) social studies, in grade eight; and
24	(5) science, in grades five and eight[; and

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3 (a-1) The agency shall develop assessment instruments
 4 required under <u>Subsections (a), (a-4), (a-5), and (a-6)</u> [Subsection
 5 (a)] in a manner that allows, to the extent practicable:

6 (1) the score a student receives to provide reliable 7 information relating to a student's satisfactory performance for 8 each performance standard under Section 39.0241; and

9 (2) an appropriate range of performances to serve as a 10 valid indication of growth in student achievement.

11 (a-2) A student is not required to be assessed in a subject 12 otherwise assessed at the student's grade level under Subsection 13 (a) if the student:

14 (1) is enrolled in a course in the subject intended for 15 students above the student's grade level and will be administered 16 an assessment instrument adopted or developed under Subsection (a), 17 (a-4), (a-5), or (a-6) that aligns with the curriculum for the 18 course in which the student is enrolled; or

19 (2) is enrolled in a course in the subject for which 20 the student will receive high school academic credit and will be 21 administered an end-of-course assessment instrument adopted under 22 Subsection (c) for the course.

23 (a-3) For each assessment instrument administered under
24 Subsection (a) or (a-5), the agency shall determine, based on
25 available information for that assessment instrument, the minimum
26 satisfactory adjusted scale score. The minimum satisfactory
27 adjusted scale score is the sum of the scale score that indicates

1 satisfactory performance on that assessment instrument, as 2 determined by the commissioner under Section 39.0241(a), plus the 3 minimum number of points that when added to the scale score produces 4 a score that, within a three percent margin of error, is predictive that a student achieving that score would achieve satisfactory . 5 . 6 performance on an assessment instrument in the same subject 7 administered to the student during the following school year.

· 8 (a-4) A student shall be assessed in grade four in a subject 9 for which an assessment instrument is administered under Subsection 10 (a) in grade three if, on the final assessment instrument in that 11 subject administered under Subsection (a) to the student in grade. 12 three during the preceding school year, the student did not achieve a score equal to or greater than the minimum satisfactory adjusted 13 scale score for that assessment instrument, as determined under 14 15 Subsection (a-3).

16 (a-5) A student shall be assessed in grade six in a subject for which an assessment instrument is administered under Subsection 17 (a) in grade five if, on the final assessment instrument in that 18 19 subject administered under Subsection (a) to the student in grade five during the preceding school year, the student did not achieve a 20 score equal to or greater than the minimum satisfactory adjusted 21 22 scale score for that assessment instrument, as determined under 23 Subsection (a-3). . . . 24 (a-6) A student shall be assessed in grade seven in a 25 subject for which an assessment instrument was administered under Subsection (a-5) to the student in grade six if, on the final 26 assessment instrument in that subject administered to the student

in grade six during the preceding school year, the student did not 1 2 achieve a score equal to or greater than the minimum satisfactory adjusted scale score for that assessment instrument, as determined 3 4 under Subsection (a-3). (a-7) A student assessed in mathematics under Subsection 5 aid of 6 (a-4), (a-5), or (a-6) shall be assessed without the 7 technology. 8 (a-8) A school district or open-enrollment charter school 9 may, for its own use in determining whether students are performing at a satisfactory level, administer to a student at the appropriate 10 11 grade level, other than a student required to be assessed, an 12 assessment instrument developed for purposes of Subsection (a-4), 13 (a-5), or (a-6). At the request of a district or open-enrollment 14 charter school, the agency shall provide, allow for the administration of, and score each assessment instrument 15 16 administered under this subsection in the same manner and at the 17 same cost as for assessment instruments required to be administered under the applicable subsection. The results of an assessment 18 19 instrument administered under this subsection may not be included 20 as an indicator of student achievement under Section 39.053 or any 21 other provision. 22 (a-9) If there is a conflict between this section and a federal law or regulation as a result of forgoing under this section 23 24 certain administration of assessment instruments to students who have recently performed successfully on assessment instruments 25 assessing the same subject, the commissioner shall seek a waiver 26 from the application of the conflicting federal law or regulation. 27

No. 866 In seeking a waiver, the commissioner shall submit all relevant 1 2 data, including data relating to: 3 (1) the likelihood that a student who achieves a score 4 on an assessment instrument equal to or greater than the minimum 5 satisfactory adjusted scale score for that assessment instrument, 6 as determined under Subsection (a-3), will, in subsequent years, 7 perform satisfactorily on assessment instruments in the same 8 subject; 9 (2) the costs associated with ongoing assessment of 10 students who have proven likely to perform successfully on 11 subsequent assessment instruments; and 12 (3) the benefit of redirecting resources from assessment of students who have proven likely to perform 13 14 successfully on subsequent assessment instruments toward enabling lower performing students to perform successfully on assessment 15 16 instruments after one school year. 17 (a-10) This subsection and Subsections (a-3), (a-4), (a-5), (a-6), (a-7), (a-8), and (a-9) expire September 1, 2017. 18 19 (b) The agency shall develop or adopt appropriate criterion-referenced alternative assessment instruments to be 20 21 administered to <u>a</u> [each] student in a special education program 22 under Subchapter A, Chapter 29, for whom an assessment instrument 23 adopted under Subsection (a) or, to the extent applicable, Subsection (a-4), (a-5), or (a-6), allowable 24 even with accommodations, would not provide an appropriate measure of student 25 26 achievement, as determined by the student's admission, review, and dismissal committee. 27

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(c-1) <u>To the greatest extent practicable, the</u> [The] agency
 shall develop any assessment instrument required under this section
 in a manner that allows for the measurement of annual improvement in
 student achievement as required by Sections 39.034(c) and (d).

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5 (c-3) In adopting a schedule for the administration of 6 assessment instruments under this section, the State Board of 7 Education shall require:

8 (1) assessment instruments administered under Subsections (a), (a-4), (a-5), and (a-6) [Subsection (a)] to be 9 10 administered on a schedule so that the first assessment instrument is administered at least two weeks later than the date on which the 11 first assessment instrument was administered under Subsection (a) 12 13 during the 2006-2007 school year; and

14 (2)the spring administration of end-of-course assessment instruments under Subsection (c) to occur in each school 15 district not earlier than the first full week in May, except that 16 the spring administration of the end-of-course 17 assessment instruments in English I, English II, and English III must be 18 permitted to occur at an earlier date. 19 -112

Under rules adopted by the State Board of Education, 20 (e) 21 every third year, the agency shall release the questions and answer keys to each assessment instrument administered under Subsection 22 (a), (a-4), (a-5), (a-6), (b), (c), (d), or (l), excluding any 23 assessment instrument administered to a student for the purpose of 24 retaking the assessment instrument, after the last time the 25 instrument is administered for that school year. To ensure a valid 26 bank of questions for use each year, the agency is not required to 27

1 release a question that is being field-tested and was not used to 2 compute the student's score on the instrument. The agency shall 3 also release, under board rule, each question that is no longer 4 being field-tested and that was not used to compute a student's 5 score.

6 (1)The State Board of Education shall adopt rules for the administration of the 7 assessment instruments adopted under Subsection (a) and, to the extent applicable, the assessment 8 ; 9 instruments adopted under Subsection (a-4) in Spanish to students 10 in grades three, four, and [through] five who are of limited English 11 proficiency, as defined by Section 29.052, whose primary language 12 is Spanish, and who are not otherwise exempt from the 13 assessment administration of an instrument under Section 14 39.027(a)(1) or (2). Each student of limited English proficiency 15 whose primary language is Spanish, other than a student to whom 16 Subsection (b) applies, may be assessed using assessment 17 instruments in Spanish under this subsection for up to three years 18 or assessment instruments in English under Subsection (a) and, as 19 applicable, Subsection (a-4). The language proficiency assessment committee established under Section 29.063 shall determine which 20 21 students are administered assessment instruments in Spanish under this subsection. 22

(m) The commissioner by rule shall develop procedures under which the language proficiency assessment committee established under Section 29.063 shall determine which students are exempt from the administration of the assessment instruments under Section 39.027(a)(1) or (2). The rules adopted under this subsection shall

1 ensure that the language proficiency assessment committee provides 2 that the exempted students are administered the assessment 3 instruments under Subsections (a) and (c) <u>and, to the extent</u> 4 <u>applicable, Subsections (a-4), (a-5), and (a-6)</u> at the earliest 5 practical date.

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6 (n) This subsection applies only to a student who is 7 determined to have dyslexia or a related disorder and who is an 8 individual with a disability under 29 U.S.C. Section 705(20) and 9 its subsequent amendments. The agency shall adopt or develop 10 appropriate criterion-referenced assessment instruments designed 11 to assess the ability of and to be administered to each student to 12 whom this subsection applies for whom the assessment instruments 13 adopted under Subsection (a) and, to the extent applicable, the 14 assessment instruments adopted under Subsections (a-4), (a-5), and 15 (a-6), even with allowable modifications, would not provide an appropriate measure of student achievement, as determined by the 16 17 committee established by the board of trustees of the district to 18 determine the placement of students with dyslexia or related 19 disorders. The committee shall determine whether any allowable 20 modification is necessary in administering to a student an assessment instrument required under this subsection. 21 The 22 assessment instruments required under this subsection shall be administered on the same schedule as the assessment instruments 23 administered under Subsections (a), (a-4), (a-5), and (a-6), as 24 25 applicable [Subsection (a)].

26 (p) On or before September 1 of each year, the commissioner 27 shall make the following information available on the agency's

3 (1) the number of questions on the assessment 4 instrument;

5 (2)the number of questions that must be answered correctly to achieve satisfactory performance as determined by the 6 7 commissioner under Section 39.0241(a);

8 (3) the number of questions that must be answered 9 correctly to achieve satisfactory performance under the college 10 readiness performance standard as provided by Section 39.0241; and

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(4) the corresponding scale scores.

12 SECTION 2. Effective September 1, 2017, Sections 39.023(a), (a-1), (a-2), (b), (c-1), (c-3), (e), (1), (m), (n), and (p), 13 14 Education Code, are amended to read as follows:

The agency shall adopt or develop 15 (a) appropriate 16 criterion-referenced assessment instruments designed to assess essential knowledge and skills in reading, writing, mathematics, 17 18 social studies, and science. Except as provided by Subsection (a-2), all students, other than students assessed under Subsection 19 20 (b) or (l) or exempted under Section 39.027, shall be assessed in:

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mathematics, annually in grades three through (1)22 seven without the aid of technology and in grade eight with the aid 23 of technology on any assessment instrument that includes algebra;

24 (2) reading, annually in grades three through eight; 25 writing, including spelling and grammar, in grades (3) 26 four and seven;

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social studies, in grade eight; (4)

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(5) science, in grades five and eight; and

2 (6) any other subject and grade required by federal
3 law.

4 (a-1) The agency shall develop assessment instruments 5 required under Subsection (a) in a manner that allows, to the extent 6 practicable:

(1) the score a student receives to provide reliable
information relating to a student's satisfactory performance for
each performance standard under Section 39.0241; and

10 (2) an appropriate range of performances to serve as a 11 valid indication of growth in student achievement.

12 (a-2) A student is not required to be assessed in a subject 13 otherwise assessed at the student's grade level under Subsection 14 (a) if the student:

(1) is enrolled in a course in the subject intended for students above the student's grade level and will be administered an assessment instrument adopted or developed under Subsection (a) that aligns with the curriculum for the course in which the student is enrolled; or

(2) is enrolled in a course in the subject for which the student will receive high school academic credit and will be administered an end-of-course assessment instrument adopted under Subsection (c) for the course.

(b) The agency shall develop or adopt appropriate
criterion-referenced alternative assessment instruments to be
administered to each student in a special education program under
Subchapter A, Chapter 29, for whom an assessment instrument adopted

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1 under Subsection (a), even with allowable accommodations, would not 2 provide an appropriate measure of student achievement, as 3 determined by the student's admission, review, and dismissal 4 committee.

(c-1) The agency shall develop any assessment instrument required under this section in a manner that allows for the measurement of annual improvement in student achievement gas required by Sections 39.034(c) and (d).

9 (c-3) In adopting a schedule for the administration of 10 assessment instruments under this section, the State Board of 11 Education shall require:

(1) assessment instruments administered under Subsection (a) to be administered on a schedule so that the first assessment instrument is administered at least two weeks later than the date on which the first assessment instrument was administered under Subsection (a) during the 2006-2007 school year; and

17 (2) the spring administration of end-of-course assessment instruments under Subsection (c) to occur in each school 18 19 district not earlier than the first full week in May, except that spring administration of the end-of-course assessment 20 the 21 instruments in English I, English II, and English III must be permitted to occur at an earlier date. 22

(e) Under rules adopted by the State Board of Education,
every third year, the agency shall release the questions and answer
keys to each assessment instrument administered under Subsection
(a), (b), (c), (d), or (1), excluding any assessment instrument
administered to a student for the purpose of retaking the

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1 assessment instrument, after the last time the instrument is 2 administered for that school year. To ensure a valid bank of 3 questions for use each year, the agency is not required to release a 4 question that is being field-tested and was not used to compute the 5 student's score on the instrument. The agency shall also release, 6 under board rule, each question that is no longer being 7 field-tested and that was not used to compute a student's score.

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8 (1) The State Board of Education shall adopt rules for the 9 administration of the assessment instruments adopted under Subsection (a) in Spanish to students in grades three through five 10 who are of limited English proficiency, as defined by Section 11 29.052, whose primary language is Spanish, and who are not 12 13 otherwise exempt from the administration of an assessment instrument under Section 39.027(a)(1) or (2). Each student of 1415 limited English proficiency whose primary language is Spanish, 16 other than a student to whom Subsection (b) applies, may be assessed 17 using assessment instruments in Spanish under this subsection for 18 up to three years or assessment instruments in English under 19 Subsection (a). The language proficiency assessment committee 20 established under Section 29.063 shall determine which students are 21 administered assessment instruments in Spanish under this subsection. 22

(m) The commissioner by rule shall develop procedures under which the language proficiency assessment committee established under Section 29.063 shall determine which students are exempt from the administration of the assessment instruments under Section 39.027(a)(1) or (2). The rules adopted under this subsection shall

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1 ensure that the language proficiency assessment committee provides 2 that the exempted students are administered the assessment 3 instruments under Subsections (a) and (c) at the earliest practical 4 date.

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5 (n) This subsection applies only to a student who is 6 determined to have dyslexia or a related disorder and who is an 7 individual with a disability under 29 U.S.C. Section 705(20) and its subsequent amendments. The agency shall adopt or develop 8 9 appropriate criterion-referenced assessment instruments designed 10 to assess the ability of and to be administered to each student to 11 whom this subsection applies for whom the assessment instruments 12 adopted under Subsection (a), even with allowable modifications, 13 would not provide an appropriate measure of student achievement, as 14 determined by the committee established by the board of trustees of the district to determine the placement of students with dyslexia 15 or related disorders. The committee shall determine whether any 16 17 allowable modification is necessary in administering to a student 18 an assessment instrument required under this subsection. The 19 assessment instruments required under this subsection shall, be 20 administered on the same schedule as the assessment instruments administered under Subsection (a). 21

(p) On or before September 1 of each year, the commissioner shall make the following information available on the agency's Internet website for each assessment instrument administered under Subsection (a), (c), or (1):

26 (1) the number of questions on the assessment 27 instrument;

(2) the number of questions that must be answered
 correctly to achieve satisfactory performance as determined by the
 commissioner under Section 39.0241(a);

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4 (3) the number of questions that must be answered
5 correctly to achieve satisfactory performance under the college
6 readiness performance standard as provided by Section 39.0241; and

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(4) the corresponding scale scores.

8 SECTION 3. (a) Except as otherwise provided by this Act, 9 this Act takes effect on any date not later than September 1, 2015, 10 on which the commissioner of education:

(1) obtains any necessary waiver from the application of federal law or regulation conflicting with Section 39.023, Beducation Code, as amended by this Act, as required by Section 39.023(a-9), Education Code, as added by this Act; or

15 (2) receives written notification from the United
16 States Department of Education that a waiver is not required.

(b) This Act applies beginning with the first school year that begins after the date on which this Act takes effect under Subsection (a) of this section.

20 If the commissioner of education obtains any necessary (c) 21 waiver or receives written notification as described by Subsection 22 (a) of this section, the commissioner shall certify that the commissioner has obtained the waiver or received notification that 23 a waiver is not required, as applicable, and shall publish notice of 24 25 that fact in the Texas Register as soon as practicable after 26 obtaining the waiver or receiving notification. 1
