

1 States, when making emergency deliveries of blood, drugs,
2 medicines, or organs; [~~or~~]

3 (G) a vehicle used for law enforcement purposes
4 that is owned or leased by a federal governmental entity; or

5 (H) a private vehicle of an employee or volunteer
6 of a county emergency management division in a county with a
7 population of more than 46,500 and less than 48,000 that is
8 designated as an authorized emergency vehicle by the commissioners
9 court of that county.

10 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
11 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
12 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
13 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
14 Act takes effect September 1, 2013.
