HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

1 WHEREAS, Ron Kirk stepped down as the United States Trade 2 Representative on March 15, 2013, concluding four years of service 3 as a member of President Barack Obama's cabinet; and 4 WHEREAS, Mr. Kirk became the first African American to serve 5 in that post when he was confirmed by the U.S. Senate in March 2009; 6 as the president's chief advisor, negotiator, and spokesperson on

issues concerning international trade, he led his office 8 developing and implementing a robust trade and investment strategy

while establishing the United States as a conscientious voice on

10 such issues as the environment and workers' rights; and

11 WHEREAS, Recognizing the impact of trade policy on job 12 creation, Ambassador Kirk directed efforts to expand market access 13 for American goods and services; he oversaw the implementation of 14 bilateral free trade agreements with Korea, Colombia, and Panama, 15 the advancement of regional Trans-Pacific Partnership talks, and 16 the productive engagement of the United States in the World Trade 17 Organization; his accomplishments further include assisting small 18 businesses seeking opportunities in foreign markets and . 19 strengthening intellectual property law at home and abroad; and

20 WHEREAS, A native of Austin and a prominent name in Texas 21 politics, Ron Kirk served as Texas Secretary of State under 22 Governor Ann Richards, and he was elected to two terms as mayor of 23 Dallas in the 1990s; he subsequently forged a successful career as a 24 partner in the international law firm of Vinson & Elkins, and in

- 1 2008, he had the distinction of being named one of the "50 Most
- 2 Influential Minority Lawyers in America" by the National Law
- 3 Journal; and
- WHEREAS, Ambassador Kirk holds a bachelor's degree from
- 5 Austin College and a juris doctorate from The University of Texas
- 6 School of Law, and today he practices with Gibson Dunn; he enjoys
- 7 the support of a loving family that includes his wife, Matrice
- 8 Ellis-Kirk, and his daughters, Elizabeth Alexandra and Catherine
- 9 Victoría, as well as his mother, veteran Austin civil rights
- 10 advocate Willie Mae Kirk; and

- 12 marketplace is an endeavor of vital import, and Ron Kirk may reflect
- 13 proudly on the notable strides he made to ensure that American
- 14 families and businesses can achieve prosperity now and into the
