Section 43.112, Government Code, is amended to 7 read as follows: Sec. 43.112. 25TH JUDICIAL DISTRICT. The voters

8 of [Conzales,] Guadalupe[,] and Lavaca counties elect a district 9 10 attorney for the 25th Judicial District who represents the state in 11 the [that] district courts [court only] in those counties. 12 addition to exercising the duties and authority conferred on 13 district attorneys by general law, the district attorney represents the state in all criminal cases in the district courts in those 14 15 counties.

SECTION 2. Subchapter B, Chapter 45, Government Code, is amended by adding Section 45.189 to read as follows:

Sec. 45.189. GONZALES COUNTY. (a) In Gonzales County, the
county attorney of Gonzales County shall perform the duties imposed
on and have the powers conferred on district attorneys by general
law.

(b) The county attorney of Gonzales County or the
Commissioners Court of Gonzales County may accept gifts or grants
from any individual, partnership, corporation, trust, foundation,

- 3 Gonzales County. The county attorney shall account for and report
- 4 to the commissioners court all gifts or grants accepted under this
