First: I direct that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid.

Second: I give and bequeath to Adelaide Manning, my niece, my diamond and pearl broochpin; also my large Cluster ring set with nine diamonds, and her mother's four Cluster diamond rings.

Third: To my niece, Genevieve Manning, I give and bequeath her mother's diamond earings, also one of my diamond earings to be set in a ring, and my opera glasses.

Fourth: I give and bequeath to Lelene Manning, my niece, her mother's three leaf earings and one of my diamond earrings to be set in a ring.

Fifth: To my niece, Helen Manning, I bequeath and give her mother's diamond engagement and wedding ring, and her mother's opera glasses.

Should anyone of my said nieces above named die before graduation, then the articles so bequeathed to such niece or nieces, to revert to the survivors or survivor of said nieces these bequests post-nominal are to be delivered to the devisees when they shall respectively graduate from school.

Sixth: To my brother-in-law, P.J. Manning, I give in trust for the use and benefit of my said nieces, all my silverware household furniture, library, pictures and works of art.

I also give my phæton in trust to said Manning to be kept and used for

benefit of the members of his family only.

Seventh: Subject to the interest of my father Graph Campbell of Floyd Knobs, Floyd County, Indiana, I give and bequeath all my right, title and interest in and to a tract of farm land of 125 acres situated in Floyd Knobs, Floyd County, Indiana, to my above named nieces alone and alone alike; but in the event of death of any of them her interest to go to the survivors.

Eighth: To my above named nieces, I give and bequeath the two thousand dollars now due me on deposit in the State National Bank of Dennis, Ind., which sum I wish to be kept in deposit at interest until my youngest niece Helen, now six years old, shall graduate, when said amount with accrued interest shall be equally divided between my ^{said} nieces, or the survivors of them should any of them die before that event.

Ninth: I also give and bequeath to my said nieces the two thousand dollars now due me from my brother-in-law P. J. Answers and depositions of Louis F. Kullak, who resides in San Antonio, Bexar County, Texas, to the accompanying interrogatories propounded to him in the above entitled cause, taken before me, W. H. Lipscomb, a Notary Public in and for Bexar County, Texas, in accordance with the accompanying commission.

To the first interrogatory he answers:

I was acquainted with Anna Alicia O'Connor. I was introduced to her by Mrs. S. B. Heer of Springfield, Missouri, on or about the 3rd day of February, 1900, the date of the will. Anna Alicia O'Connor was at that time residing in the Arthur Building, in San Antonio, Texas.

To the second interrogatory he answers:

I am informed that she died about ten days after executing the will, in the City of Dallas, Texas.

To the third interrogatory he answers:

Yes sir, I know that Anna Alicia O'Connor did execute a will. I was present at the time she executed same. She executed the will on the afternoon of February 3rd, 1900, about 6 P. M. in a south-east room, on the third floor of the Arthur Building, in San Antonio, Texas.

To the fourth interrogatory he answers:

There were subscribing witnesses to said will. I was one of the subscribing witnesses to said will. I became a subscribing witness to said will at the request of the deceased Anna Alicia O'Connor. Said will was dated February 3rd, 1900.

TO THE FIFTH INTERROGATORY HE ANSWERS:

As above stated I became a subscribing witness to said will at the request of Anna Alicia O'Connor. Said will was dated February 3rd, 1900.

To the sixth interrogatory he answers:

Yes sir, said will is before me at the time I am answering these interrogatories, and is in the hands of the officer taking my de-

position, Mr. W. H. Lipscomb, a Notary Public of San Antonio, Texas. I attach said will to my answers hereto, and identify same by writing my name at the bottom thereof, with the date of May 16th 1900.

To the seventh interrogatory he answers:

I do not know the age of Anna Alicia O'Connor at the time she executed said will. She appeared to be about 40 years of age. Yes, she was over twenty-one years of age, and appeared to be in complete control of all her mental faculties, and of sound mind.

To the eighth interrogatory he answers:

Anna Alicia O'Connor signed said will in my presence, and declared and acknowledged the same to be her will, and I signed the same as a witness at her request.

To the ninth interrogatory he answers:

I reside in San Antonio, Texas. Am 37 years of age. Am engaged in the real estate and loan business.



of Floyd Knebs, Floyd County, Indiana, I give and bequeath all


