Recycle Electronics and Batteries

The average household has approximately 24 electronic products. Electronic waste makes up about 2 percent of municipal solid waste, and is steadily increasing. You can help by reusing, donating, and recycling your electronics at www.tceq.texas.gov/p2/P2Recycle/electronics/



If every Texas household recycled five rechargeable batteries a year, we could keep more than 40 million batteries out of landfills. Groundwater is found underground in the cracks and spaces in soil, sand, and rock. In Texas, groundwater supplies 59 percent of all freshwater used by the state and as much as 79 percent of the water used for agriculture.

Change Your Settings

Set your printers, copiers, and faxes to allow printing on both sides, which can cut paper costs nearly in half.
Also, unplug electronics—or turn them off at a power strip—to eliminate the energy used for standby power. Many electronics continue using energy—20 to 40 watts—even when turned off.
