Take Care of Texas Tips

At Home:

Install Water Efficient Showerheads and Faucet Aerators

The shower is the largest single user of hot water in the home, accounting for 37% of total hotwater use. By installing a water efficient showerhead, you can reduce water consumption by 25% to 60% and save energy, too. In addition, bathroom sink faucets account for more than 15% of indoor household water use. Installing aerators on your water faucets will cut the amount of water used by each faucet in half.

This Texas Recycles Day, Recycle Your Electronics

Every year on Nov. 15, Texans across the state participate in events that raise awareness about how easy it is to recycle. This Texas Recycles Day, try learning about ways to recycle your old computer or television equipment. Reusing and recycling conserves natural resources by recovering valuable components and materials that can be used to make new products.



Computers: Thanks to a state law, computer manufacturers are required to offer their Texas consumers a convenient recycling program that is also free at the time of recycling. To find out how to recycle your computer, visit <TexasRecyclesComputers.org>,

TVs: A new bill passed by the Texas Legislature (Senate Bill 329, 82nd regular session, 2011) will create a similar program for recycling consumers' television equipment. We are developing rules for this program, and will post in April 2013 the first list of television manufacturers with approved recycling plans on the new website <TexasRecyclesTvs.org>. In the meantime, be sure to check<TexasRecyclesTVs.org> for updated information and other available resources to help recycle television equipment.

Texas Recycles Day is a great time to learn about available recycling opportunities and spread the word to others. Check with your city to find a scheduled Texas Recycles Day event in your area, or take the lead by planning your own!

If you rent a car, look for a rental company that offers hybrids or higher-fuel-economy vehicles.

Clean School Bus Grants Available

School districts: did you know the TCEQ offers grant funding through the Texas Clean School Bus Grant Program? This grant program is designed to improve the health of school children and bus drivers by reducing emissions of diesel exhaust from school buses. We provide grant money to purchase and install devices on school buses to reduce emissions. All sizes of diesel-powered school buses are eligible. The bus must operate on a regular, daily route to and from a school and have at least five years

of useful life remaining.



Applications will be considered on a first-come, first-served basis through Nov. 30. While there is not a limit on the amount of funding that can be applied for, the amount awarded is at the discretion of the TCEQ. Download the Request for Grant Applications at
