The petition of Nancy Smith, surviving
 widow of Jacob C. Hull since since intermarried
 with A. J. Smith, who joins her in this application,
 both of whom reside in Dallas County Texas sheweth
 that herebefore to wit on the day of 1868, the
 said Jacob C. Hull died intestate, leaving the
 said Nancy his widow, together with Leticia Jane Rhylance
 Williams (since died intestate) Mary Francis George &
 James (by his former wife Harriett Hull, who died
 intestate) and John and Marvina Allison, by his
 said surviving widow Nancy, his children and
 heirs at law. Petitions say that said Jacob C.
 Hull died possessed of 640 acres of land, ^{situated in Dallas County,} head right,
 Community property between him & his 2d wife
 Harriett Reed - and was also seized in his own
 right of Two Mans. one since died, about 8 or 9
 head of Cattle all of which have since died, stoves
 or stoves, Two (2) Cattle, each one of which was
 given to receive the other, and a small portion
 of home hold & kitchen furniture, ^{in all of the probable value of \$1000 or thereabouts.} They further
 shew that said Jacob died considerably in
 debt, the same being created prior to the death
