To the Sheriff of Dallas County - Greeting.  
You are hereby commanded, that you summon  
twelve competent jurors, good and lawful  
men of your County, to be and appear before  
our County Court, at the next regular term  
thereof, to be held for Probate and other  
like purposes, in and for said County  
at the Court House thereof at Dallas, on  
the last Monday in July instant (the same  
being the 29<sup>th</sup> day thereof) then and there to  
be sworn and impannelled, as jurors,  
to inquire into the alleged larceny of  
Catherine Merrifield of said County.  
Hearies fail not, but make due return  
of this writ, with your action thereon,  
as the Law directs.

Office in Dallas this July 12<sup>th</sup> 1867.

John Merrifield's Testimony.

Catharine Merrifield theDeft in this cause is my daughter. She is unmarried, and about twenty few years of age. She has no estate, and there is no person legally liable for her support. Her only source of support is from <sup>what</sup> I can do for her. During the past winter I discovered, that her mind was becoming impaired. Her condition grew rapidly worse, and very soon it became necessary to confine her, and watch her, to keep her from doing mischief to herself and those around her. Her condition continued to grow worse until about the last of April last, fearing that she would do herself bodily injury, or other mischief and hoping that she would be benefitted thereby I sent her to the Asylum at Austin Texas, where she now remains an inmate as a private patient.
