Should not be made final. Defendant, a certified copy of which petition accompanies this writ.

The State of Texas } In Probate Court

To the Hon A. Bledsoe County Judge
of the County of Dallas and State of Texas
The undersigned David R. Cameron, a
resident of Dallas County Texas, would
represent that there is at his house and
in his family, a m. Nancy Ann Wilson, a
minor under the age of fourteen years, a
child of our Hiram Wilson and Mary Wilson
his wife, that said child was placed under
the care and protection of petitioners by
her said parents, on or about the 1st day
of July 1869, in an almost destitute con-
dition, That the father of said minor is
almost blind, so much so that he is entirely
unable to make a support for himself &
family, being not only blind, but otherwise
afflicted - That he has no means of support
and is now living upon the bounty of his
brother, who is also in very moderate cir-
cumstances himself - That since said
minor was placed with petitioners, her mother
has left her husband, the father of said minor,
and has remained away ever since, with
the intention of a final separation, That
the said Mary Wilson, mother of said minor
at present is in indigent circumstances and
has no means of support herself - That she
is wholly incapable of taking care of and
providing for the wants of said minor
That the said Hiram Wilson is incapable of

Taking care of, and providing for the wants
and necessities of said minor -

That it is the wish and desire of the said
Hiram Wilson, father of said minor as aforesaid
that petitioner, Shoutz, take charge of, manage,
control, provide for, and protect the said
Nancy Ann Wilson, minor as aforesaid, and have
the same bound to him by the course of
Law - All of which will appear by reference
of a writing to that effect, signed by said
Hiram Wilson, which is herewith filed marked
exhibit it ~~and~~ made part of this petition

The premises considered petitioner prays for
notice to, and for an order of your Honorable
Court, binding the said Nancy Ann Wilson
to him under the provisions of the Laws of
the State of Texas, for a term to wit until
she shall arrive at the age of twenty
one years, or until she may marry, in
case she should marry under that age
She prays for all orders in the premises
that may be necessary to carry out the
intent of the Law and this petition to the
