Know all men by these presents, THAT *J. Iressant*  
*J. C. Hawpe* as principal, and *A. M. Buford*

Justice of the county of Dallas, in the sum of *One Thousand* dollars,  
for the payment of which, well and truly to be made, we hereby bind ourselves, our heirs, ex-  
ecutors and administrators, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents, signed and sealed  
with our seals, the seals being scrawled, this *26<sup>th</sup>* day of *September* A. D. 1855.

THE CONDITION OF THE OBLIGATION is such, that, whereas, the above bound-  
den *J. C. Hawpe* has been appointed by the Chief  
Justice of Dallas County Administrator of the  
Estate of *A. P. Gomer deceased*,  
Now, if the said *J. C. Hawpe* shall well and truly perform all the du-  
ties required of him by law, under said appointment, then this obligation shall be null and  
void; otherwise, to be and remain in full force and effect.
